#### Testing the Waters

- > How many of you have never seen iPhoto?
- > How many have seen it, but not used it?
- > How many have used it a little?

> How many have used it a lot?



#### iPhoto Overview

- > Complete solution for photo management
- > Consumer-level capabilities
- > Not intended to compete with:
  - > Professional image cataloging programs
  - > Professional image editing programs
- > Exclusively for Mac OS X
- > Free with new Macs



#### Four Basic Functions

- 1. Import photos from cameras or files
- 2. Organize and categorize them
- 3. Make simple editing changes quickly
- 4. Output to a wide variety of destinations



#### 1. Import

- > Import directly from digital cameras (see www.apple.com/iphoto/ for list)
- > Import from Kodak Photo/Picture CDs
- > Import from USB memory card readers
- > Import from files (maintaining names and

some folder structure)



#### Importing Tips

- > Try importing from a card reader or via Image Capture for selective import
- > iPhoto tries to prevent duplicate imports
- > Make sure to eject cards properly before removing from the card reader
- > Delete bad pictures from the Photo Library after importing (to iPhoto's Trash)
- > Can't import movies or RAW files

#### Importing Tips

- > Explain iPhoto's directory structure
- > Don't mess with files in the Finder!
- > Multiple iPhoto Library folders (use iPhoto Library Manager to switch)
- > Share photo collections with permissions twiddling
- > No way to copy back to the camera from iPhoto (though you can from a card reader)

#### 2. Organize

- > Automatic collections of "film rolls"
- > Manual collections in albums
- > Keyword categorization
- > Titles of individual photos
  - Roll info, Filename, Date
- > Adjust dates of photos and film rolls for better sorting



### Organizing Tips

- > Adjust thumbnail size to match task
- > Modify film rolls
- > Fast album creation
- > Create smart albums
- > Arrange photos
- > Find photos by keyword
- > Many selection methods



#### 3. Edit

- > Rotate photos
- > Enhance (entire photo)
- > Retouch (blemishes)
- > Crop photos (constrain)
- > Adjust brightness & contrast
- > Make black-and-white or sepia
- > Remove red-eye
- > Or use an external program like Photoshop



### Editing Tips

- > Main window, separate window, external app
- > Create and name duplicates before editing
- > Don't trust Enhance
- > Aspect ratios!
- > Press Control,
  Multiple Undos, or
  Revert to Original



#### 4. Share

- > Hardcover books (real photo albums)
- > Prints (from your printer and from Apple)
- > Slide shows and QuickTime movies
- > Email
- > Desktop and Screen Saver
- > HomePage / Web pages
- > CDs and DVDs (via iDVD)
- > Exporting Files



## Tips: Creating Books

- > Arrange photos first
- > Preview themes
- > Work left to right
- > Preview can be easier
- > Dealing with low resolution icons
- > Text handling tools—write carefully!
- > Use your printer for custom layouts/drafts

#### Tips: Prints & Books

- > Create specific album with cropped photos
- > Wallet photos require manual cutting
- > Print shipping: \$3 for 20, \$5 for 50, \$7 for more
- > Books cost \$3 per page and must be between 10 and 50 pages
- > Book shipping: \$8 for one, \$1 for additional copies to the same address



### Tips: Printing

- > Print styles: Contact Sheet, Full Page, N-Up, Greeting Cards, Standard Prints, Sampler
- > Use correct aspect ratios
- > Preview and test, test, test!
- Do Page Setup and use Full Page style to print on unusual paper sizes

Tips: Slideshows

- > Show entire album, left to right
- > One song or playlist from iTunes
- > Keyboard controls
- > Other types of slideshows
  - Create DVD-based slideshow with iDVD
  - Export to a QuickTime movie
  - Add narration, effects with iMovie

## Tips: Email

- > Works with a variety of email programs
- > iPhoto Mailer Patcher adds others
- > Keep size small or risk bounces
- > Don't stress about layout



#### Tips: Desktop Pictures

> Rotates through multiple pictures for both Desktop and screen saver

- > Use landscape pictures
- > Might want to crop first
- > Works only with one monitor



#### Tips: Web Pages

- > .Mac HomePage is the easiest to use (but it costs \$100 per year)
- > Edit pages online in . Mac, not iPhoto
- > Use iPhoto's Web Export for your own Web space
- > BetterHTMLExport or iView MediaPro offer more options and templates



## Tips: Exporting

 Use Export to change format, size (JPEG only), and name

> Drag for fast export of original (or make aliases)

> Or use GraphicConverter
