Click the Help Topics button to go to the index.

Installation Type

Choose the type of installation you want

Typical

For application suites, Typical lets you choose the applications you want, and installs all commonly used components of those applications.

For single applications, Typical installs all commonly used components.

Compact

For application suites, Compact lets you choose the applications you want, and installs only the components of those applications required for minimal operation.

For single applications, Compact installs only the components required for minimal operation.

Custom

Custom is for advanced users. Custom lets you install individual components and subcomponents. For some subcomponents, you may be able to install individual files. You can use Custom to add components not included in your initial installation.

Run from CD-ROM

If you are installing from CD-ROM, this option lets you run the application(s) from the CD. Only a few necessary files are copied to your hard drive.

NOTE: Applications run slowly from CD. Performance may not be acceptable for more than casual use. At least a quad-speed CD-ROM drive is recommended.

Run from Network

Lets you run the application(s) from a shared installation on the network. Only a few necessary files are copied to your hard drive.

Tips

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You need not select Run from CD-ROM in order to access "extras" such as the Reference Center (electronic manuals) and graphics that may be contained on the CD. A Typical or default Custom installation sets up your computer to access any extra features from the CD. You will need to have the appropriate CD in the CD-ROM drive to use these features.

A Run from Network installation will access the extra features from the network. No CD is required.

Choose Destination

Setup installs Corel WordPerfect Suite 8 applications or components into the Corel\Suite8 folder on the disk drive that you select. The Corel applications main path is used for this and subsequent installations. For Run from Network and Run from CD-ROM installations, some workstation files must be installed on a local drive. The Corel applications workstation path is the drive where those workstation files are installed.

Change Path

To specify a different folder, click Change Path.

The main path can be a network drive, for example, if you are running a diskless workstation or a shared copy of Windows 95.

Install

When you click Install, Setup runs to completion without requiring any more information. If you are installing from diskettes, follow the prompts on the screen to insert the next diskette.

Tips

If you exit Setup at this point, your computer, workstation, or network is unchanged. No program files have been installed, and no system files have been modified.

- If you exit Setup after this point, you can later resume the installation at the point where you exited.
- You cannot resume a network server installation.

Custom Installation

Use this dialog to select the components or subcomponents you want to install, and to customize installation paths.

To select a component, click its check box.

Components

To specify the subcomponents you want to install, select a component in the list, then click the Components button. If the Components button is dimmed, there are no customizable subcomponents.

Shaded Check Boxes

A shaded check box means that only part of the component will be installed or configured. There may be shaded check boxes with 0.0MB to be installed. While no files will be installed, the component may need to be configured. For example, Setup may need to create a shortcut or add registry information for the component.

Change Path

To change the folder in which a component will be installed, select the component in the list, then click Change Path.

Selection Options

To discard your changes and return to the default settings for a custom installation, to reset installation paths, or to base a Custom installation on a Typical or Compact installation, click Selection Options. (This button is only on the main Custom Installation dialog.)

Tips

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We recommend that you accept the default settings and install every Suite 8 application.

Network Administrator Options

Workstation Installation Paths

Select the method used to locate program files on the network.

UNC Paths

Workstation installations will use UNC paths (Universal Naming Convention) to locate program files on the network.

Mapped Drives

Workstation installations will use mapped drive letters to locate program files on the network. Workstations do not need to use the same drive mappings as those used in this server installation. However, once the workstation installation is done, the drive letters need to remain the same.

Workstation Installation Options

Select the type of installation you want to let users perform at their workstations.

Allow Only Run from Network Installation

Running Setup at a workstation will configure the workstation to run Suite 8 applications from the shared installation on the network server.

Allow Only Local Installation

Running Setup at a workstation will install Suite 8 applications on the user's local hard drive.

Allow Both Local and Run from Network Installation

Running Setup at a workstation will either install Suite 8 applications on the user's local hard drive, or configure the workstation to run the application(s) from the shared installation on the network server. The user chooses.

Windows Shared Installation

If any users are running a shared installation of Windows, specify the folder from which they are running it. Required system files will be installed to this location.

Mark Network Files Read Only

Deselect this option only if you do not want Network Setup to mark the shared installation files read only.

Registration Information

Registration information is not required to install or run Suite 8 applications.

Your name and company are displayed as you entered them when you installed Windows. If you change them here, they will appear that way in the applications, but they will not change in Windows.

To view the serial number after installing an application, click Help About from within the application.

To set up a shared installation of Suite 8 applications on a network server, run the Network Setup program (Netsetup.exe).

Workstation Installation

When the network server installation is complete, users can run the Setup program (Setup.exe) to configure their workstations. To run the Setup program, users can launch the Setup shortcut found in the Corel\Suite8 or Corel\AppMan directories.

Insufficient Disk Space

During Setup, you may receive a message indicating that you do not have enough free disk space to install the specified components. You have the following options:

Minimize the Setup window, free up some space by emptying the Recycle Bin or deleting unnecessary files, then continue with Setup.

Exit Setup, free up some space by removing unused applications or deleting unnecessary files, then run Setup again.

Tips

If you are reinstalling the same version of the application(s), you might have enough disk space to continue.

This Setup program does not remove pre-Windows 95 Corel applications. To remove an earlier version of an application, run the Setup program you used to install it, click Uninstall, then follow the on-screen prompts. If the original Setup or Install program does not have an Uninstall option, delete the program files manually, or use one of the uninstaller programs available from your software retailer.

Choose Administration Server

Use this dialog to specify the network server from which you want to <u>administer</u> this shared installation. This is typically the server on which you are creating the installation.

Details on the Choose Administration Server Dialog

Update the Current Server Installation

Choose this option if you are reinstalling a version of Suite 8 on the same server. If the installation program does not detect Suite 8 on your server, this option is grayed.

Create or Update Another Server Installation

Choose this option if this is your first installation, or if you are installing a new copy of Suite 8 to another server. If you choose this option you must specify the server or drive from which you want to administer this shared installation.

Server or Drive Name

Select the server on which you want to create or update an installation. If the server is a NetWare or Windows NT server, you must have Read and Write access to the SYS:\PUBLIC directory or NETLOGON share. Regardless of your network type, you must also have sufficient rights or privileges to copy, rename, write, delete, read, and create files and directories in the location to which you will install Suite 8 applications.

Force Short Filenames

You can choose to force the use of short filenames and directories (8.3 format) by selecting the check box. This only affects the server installation. Workstation installations are not affected.

Administer an Installation

Administering an installation means updating or removing it after the initial installation, creating additional server installations from an existing installation, or using the Corel Application Management tools included with the installation.

Details on the Choose Administration Server Dialog

To <u>administer</u> a shared installation, the Setup, Remove, and Corel Application Management programs use a pointer to locate the installation. This pointer is placed on either the server or the workstation, depending on your network operating system and your access rights on the server. If the pointer is on the server, you can administer the installation from any workstation connected to the server (Roaming Administration). If the pointer is on the workstation, you can update the installation only from that workstation (Local Administration).

Roaming Administration

Roaming administration is available only for NetWare servers and Windows NT domain controllers. To enable roaming administration, you must select a NetWare server or a Windows NT server that is a domain controller, and you must have Write access to that server's SYS:\PUBLIC directory (NetWare) or NETLOGON share (Windows NT). With roaming administration, only one installation of each version of the product is allowed on the server or domain. The pointer used to locate the installation will be created as the file Namadmin.dir in SYS:\PUBLIC or NETLOGON.

Local Administration

Local administration is used for peer-to-peer networks, Windows NT servers that do not have a Netlogon share, and any network operating system other than NetWare or Windows NT. When you select one of these servers, the pointer used to locate the installation will be created as a key in the local workstation's Windows Registry. Only one installation of each version of the product is allowed per server.

To enable local administration on a NetWare server or a Windows NT domain controller, select a fixed drive. The pointer will be created as a Registry key on the workstation.

Multiple Installations in a Windows NT Domain

For multiple installations in a Windows NT domain, use local administration and select a different fixed drive for each installation. Because only one installation of each version of the product is allowed per server, you will need to select different servers on the Choose Destination dialog.

Tips

Roaming administration is also possible by accessing the management tools from the Corel\AppMan directory. If you can access this directory, you can administer a shared installation from any workstation.
 If you do not have the correct access to Sys:Public or Netlogon, you can still perform a server installation by using a local drive letter. However, you are limited to a workstation based administration.

Network Installation Checklist

Before you install Suite 8 applications to a server, make sure that you have the required network access from your workstation.

You need a user account on the server that has Read and Write access to the directory or share where you will install the applications. Use this account to log on to the server from your workstation.

If you are installing to a Windows NT Primary Domain Controller or a Backup Domain Controller, decide whether to 1) install from an account that has Full Control access to the server's NETLOGON share, such as an account in the Domain Admins group, or 2) install from an account that has Full Control access only to the share where you will install the applications. You need not be a Domain Administrator to install to a Domain Controller, but you should be aware that the Network Setup program checks for access to NETLOGON if it finds a share by this name on the server.

Make sure that your workstation is communicating with the server and is authenticating your rights at logon time (for example, do not do a Quick Logon from a Windows 95 workstation).

From your workstation, make sure that you can create files in the directory or share where you will install the applications (and in the NETLOGON share, if necessary). Do not continue with Network Setup until you can create files in the necessary directories or shares.

Details are found in the Corel Application Management Guide. Access the guide by running Admn8.exe from the Netadmin directory on the Corel WordPerfect Suite 8 CD, or from the \\Corel\AppMan\Admin directory. Application Management

When performing a workstation installation, the Setup program detects previous Suite 8 and Suite 7 installations to this workstation.

Previous Installation of Suite 8

Choose **Install** to create a new installation of Suite 8 or to add new products. This is the default setting. Choose **Reconfigure** only if you are experiencing problems with Suite 8 and want to reconfigure your workstation.

Choose Custom Files to install or update custom files provided by the network administrator.

Choose Validate Files to install missing files and validate all program files.

Choose **Remove** to run the Corel Remove Program. Suite 8 is removed from your workstation. Nothing is installed to your workstation.

Previous Installation of Suite 7

Choose **Share Location of Files** if you want to use the Location of Files setting from the previous Suite 7 installation as the default Location of Files in this installation.

Choose **Remove** if you want Suite 7 removed from your workstation before installing Suite 8.

You can choose not to select either **Share Location of Files** or **Remove**. Click **Next** to continue with the Setup program. Suite 7 remains on your workstation. Suite 7 and Suite 8 have separate Location of Files settings.

Installing from Diskette

Corel provides a diskette version of WordPerfect 8. The complete Corel WordPerfect Suite 8 is available only on CD-ROM. By inserting Disk 1, you can run the Setup program to install Corel WordPerfect 8 to your workstation, or you can run the Network Setup program to install to a server. Start the Setup or Network Setup program by double-clicking the appropriate icon. Follow the instructions on each dialog box. You can click Help if you need more information. You are prompted to insert each new diskette as the installation requires.

The Help file provided with the Setup programs refer to the CD-ROM version. The information applies to the diskette version and will help you to successfully install Corel WordPerfect 8.
