

HTML-Optimizer for Mac OS X cannot handle file names that have more than 31 characters. Moreover, it's not good practice to use such long file names on the Internet.

You can easily check for file names that are too long by using the Helper application FileNameLengthChecker that you find in the program folder.

**Just drag your web folder to the FileNameLengthChecker icon before you open HTML-Optimizer.**

If there are any file names in your web folder that need to be shortened, you will find them in a text file named "List of Long File Names.txt".

After you have shortened the long file names, take care that you adapt the links that point at these files, to avoid broken links.
