Please note that the Source directory comes in an archive.

This program is CARDWARE. If you use it you *MUST* send me a postcard from your city/country. He who uses this program not having sent me a postcard can be prosecuted by diarrhoea, data loss, expired driving licence. I aint asking a lotta money from your pockets, just a stamp! :-)

1.4 WHAT'S PSM ?

It's a Public Screens Manager. You can open new public screens, close them, and set their Shanghai/Poppubscreen flags. PSM is a localised commodity.

1.5 WHAT DOES PSM NEED?

 Any Amiga with kickstart 2.0 or higher is enough to use PSM, *BUT* if you want to select screen mode and a new font you really need asl.library 38+ and then at least Kickstart 3.0. If not, you'll be able to specify font's width and name with the tooltypes keeping THAT until you quit, and you'll be forced to open only 640x512x2 HIRES LACE new screens. You'll need 3.0 also to use PSM's Catalogs.

1.6 WHY COULD YOU NEED PSM?

 If you use public screens a lot. There are other progs like this of course; I had one of them (old PSX by Steve Tibbet) but it did not pass an Enforcer test, so I re-wrote it adding some little gems like font managing. Probably you'll recognise old PSX's GUI ;-) !!!

1.7 INSTALLING PSM

 There are two ways of installing PSM: one is to decompress its archive (you should already have done so if you're reading this), keeping everything in its drawer and the other is to drag it in the Commodities/WBStartup drawer. The latter needs the Catalogs to be copied in your LOCALE:Catalogs drawer.

1.8 USING PSM

 PSM can be launched CLI and from Workbench. It can be quitted by sending a CTRL-C command (if launched from CLI) or by choosing the "Quit" menu/gadget or via the Exchange commodity. *IF* any public screen has been opened, and you try to quit, you will get a requester advising you that some data will be permanently allocated. This data is the font of the screen that will not be properly closed. You can quit anyway but the font will remain in memory.

PSM handles some non-standard tooltypes: SHANGHAI, POPPUBSCREEN and CLOSE-AFTER set the initial state of PSM's cycle gadgets. FONTNAME and FONTHEIGHT specify the font you start with. This can be changed via the menus, if you use asl.library 38+ (i.e., if you have Kickstart 3.0+).

The gadgets:

"Open new" will pop up an asl screen requester - you will need asl.library v38+ for this otherwise you'll get a default 640x512x2 HIRES|LACE screen.

"Close screen" will try to close the screen selected with the listview.

"Move to screen" will try to open PSM's GUI in the selected screen.

"Refresh list" will refresh the listview checking for public screens.

"Make default" will set the selected screen as the default public screen.

"Keep open/Close after": A public screen can be kept open or closed after the last visitor window has closed. the CLOSEAFTER tooltype handles this. "Shanghai ON/OFF" and "PopPubScreen ON/OFF" should need no explanation, same for "Hide", "Quit" and the menu voices. :-)
The text gadget tells you who's the public screen at the moment.

The menus:

"About", "Hide", "Quit" - guess?

"Select font..." allows you to choose a new font, IF you have asl 38+.

1.9 HISTORY

Jan 8, 1995: v1.0 - Program created.

Jan 21, 1995: v1.1 - Locale + Font sensitive.

DOC file transformed into guide.

Jan 24, 1995: Text gadget displaying default screen added.

Font menu added. Some bugs removed.
