

Backdrop

Place this file in your **System Folder** along with a **StartupScreen** and a folder named **Screens**. In **Screens** place a bunch of **StartupScreens** that you want **Backdrop** to choose from. It will first display the screen in **StartUpScreen** and after that it will randomly pick one of the files in **Screens** and copy it into **StartUpScreen**.

I have not been able to get this to work on MFS disks, but that doesn't mean it won't. I didn't write it, but I did manage to provide more documentation than I got with it.

There are two STR resources, and two INIT resources in the **Backdrop** file. The STR resources hold the names of the folder and the file while the INITs are the code segments for the random screen selection and the replacement of the ordinary desktop.
