



### **To Open an Image**

1. On the File menu, click Open.
2. In the Look In box, click the drive that contains the image you want to open.
3. Below the Look In box, click the folder that contains the image you want to open.
4. Click the image's name, or type it in the File Name box.

### **Tips**

- If you do not see what you're looking for, click a different file type in the Files Of Type list.
- To open a document you opened recently, click its name at the bottom of the File menu.

### **Notes**

Whenever you open a file, Image View 95 makes a list of all of the files in the same directory. You can view other files in the directory using the [Next](#), [Previous](#) and [Random](#) commands.

- You can add other destinations to the Send To command. In the Send To folder, located in your Windows folder, create shortcuts to the destinations you send files to often; for example, a printer, fax, or particular folder.

### **To Copy an Image to Another Document**

- You can paste the information multiple times.

### **To Show or Hide Image View 95 Toolbars**

1. Click the View menu.
2. Click Toolbar to toggle the state of the Toolbar.
3. Click Status Bar to toggle the state of the Status Bar.
4. Click Comment Bar to toggle the state of the Comment Bar.

### **Tips**

- If a bar is visible it will have a check beside the menu item.

### **To Display the Image Full Screen**

1. On the View menu, click Full Screen.
2. Press the Escape to exit Full Screen mode.

### To Select a Zoom Mode

1. On the View menu, click Zoom.
2. Select a Zoom mode from the list:

Full Page	Displays the image so that it fills the window in at least one direction
Best Fit	Makes sure the image will fit on the screen but will not stretch the image
25%	1:4 Zoom
33%	1:3 Zoom
50%	1:2 Zoom
75%	3:4 Zoom
100%	1:1 No Zoom
200%	2:1 Zoom
400%	4:1 Zoom
800%	8:1 Zoom
1600%	16:1 Zoom

### **To Enable or Disable Viewing the Image While it Loads**

1. On the Tools menu, click Options.
2. Check the Display image while loading box if you want to see the image as it loads.

The image will load much faster if it does not have to paint the screen while it is loading.  
However, seeing the image paint as it loads can make the loading process appear faster.

### **To Control Whether or Not Image View 95 Sweeps Directories on Load**

1. On the Tools menu, click Options.
1. Check the Sweep directories on open box if you want Image View 95 to include sub directories when selecting next, previous, or random images.
2. Uncheck the Sweep directories on open box if you do not want Image View 95 to include sub directories when selecting next, previous, or random images.

### **To Control Which Files Image View Includes in its File Lists**

1. On the Tools menu, click Options.
1. Check the Only add images on open box if you want Image View 95 to only include files with image extensions when selecting next, previous, or random images.

Displays the date that the file was created.

Displays the date that the information in the file was last changed.

Displays the date the file was last opened.

Shows whether this file is read-only, which means it cannot be changed or accidentally deleted.

Shows whether this file should be archived. Some programs use this option to control which files are backed up.



Shows whether this file is hidden, which means that you cannot see or use it unless you know its name.

Shows whether this file is a system file. System files are required by Windows in order to run properly, and by default are not shown in folder listings. Do not delete system files.

Displays the width (in pixels) of the image. Pixels are the individual dots that make up the image.

Displays the height (in pixels) of the image. Pixels are the individual dots that make up the image.

Displays the color information for the image.

Displays the uncompressed size of the image.

Displays the horizontal resolution of the image. This information is used to determine the correct size of the image on different devices. Zero indicates that there is no resolution information in the file.

Displays the vertical resolution of the image. This information is used to determine the correct size of the image on different devices. Zero indicates that there is no resolution information in the file.



Check this option if you want to see the toolbars when you are in full screen mode.

Check this option if you want to see the image while it loads.

The image will load much faster if it does not have to paint the screen while it is loading. However, seeing the image paint as it loads can make the loading process appear faster.

Check this option if you want Image View 95 to include sub directories when selecting next, previous, or random images.

Check this option if you want Image View 95 to only include files with image extentions when selecting next, previous, or random images.

Check this option if you want Image View 95 to ask for confirmation before it deletes or overwrites a file.

Check this option if you do not want Image View 95 to show it's progress when performing Send To operations.

Check this option if you want Image View 95 to save settings and options whenever you exit the program.

Check this option if you want Image View 95 to save settings and options when you exit this dialog box.

The Floating Point Algorithm is very slightly more accurate than the Slow Integer Algorithm, but may give different results on different machines due to varying round off behavior. The integer algorithms should give the same results on all machines. On machines with sufficiently fast floating point hardware, the floating-point method may also be the fastest. The Fast Integer Algorithm is considerably less accurate than the other two; its use is not recommended if high quality is a concern.
