Using the Notepad

The notepad is generally used to compose text to paste onto your images.

Adding Text to Images

Type your text, select a font and color, then select <<u>Copy as Bitmap</u>> to copy the text in bitmap format to paste onto your image. If you wish to copy the text to paste it into another program as text, then select the copy to clipboard as text button.

If you have a font like wingdings, or holidays, or directions, these are small clip art images and may be embossed onto an image, when you paste.

Another nice special effect is to type text and <Copy as Bitmap> then select the <Copy as Template> button at the bottom of the Tool Palette.

Creating Web Pages

Using the Web Tab, you can choose from three types of web pages to make.

These pages are meant to facilitate the web page process and serve as a starting point. You are expected to add your own links and HTML tags for specific needs.

If you need more information on web pages and HTML tags, you could save a page off the Internet and view it with the notepad, or visit your local bookstore or Library.

The complex web page contains:

- a background image, loaded from file, that is faded for better text visibility, and optimized for minimal file size and load speed.

- a second image with the option to optimize it for size versus quality, that is taken from Main.

- a table to organize your text and links.

The Image Map web page contains:

- an image map which is an image on a web page that is invisibly divided into rows and columns. Each section can contain a different link.

- Clicking on one part of the image will take to a different address than clicking on another section.

The plain page is just that, a blank page.
