

HOW TO NAVIGATE WINONLINE™ PUBLICATIONS

The Windows Help system is used by our magazines. It's a convenient way to view Hypertext files like the WinOnLine magazine you are reading now. Here are a few tips to make your reading more pleasurable and convenient:

The Help Button Bar at the top is arranged to help you move easily through the magazine:



The **Contents** button, when clicked, will return you to our Table of Contents

Search starts a dialog box with all the keywords that can refer to different sections and articles in the magazine. Try it and see.

History displays a listing of the places in the magazine you have been so you can return

Print Topic will send the article you are currently reading to the printer. It will not print "popup" boxes, though.

<**Page | Page>>** can perhaps be the best way to view WinOnLine Publications. With these buttons you can browse through the magazine in page order, just as you would a paper magazine.

You may use the keyboard Page Up, Page Down and Up and Down Arrow keys to forward and backward in an article, or use mouse clicks on the vertical bar shown on the right.

The automatic **Pop-Ups** throughout the issue can be cleared from view by a simple mouse click anywhere on the screen. You will find that some may have a special bit of text that, when clicked, will take you even further to another page, function or popup. Using the **Back** button will always return you to where you have been.

Certain bits of text may be a different color be underlined, usually indicating that clicking on them will cause something to happen. Certain graphics, such as the authors' at the close of each article, are keyed to a popup image such as information about the author. Relatively new computer users can skip out of this item right now. It's not for you, and it will be a while before you catch on to my plaint. But if you're among the friends, Romans, countrymen...and longtime Windows users...still reading: Please lend me a shoulder to cry on. I'll try to reciprocate.

The new Windows 95 versions of longstanding top products are driving me right up the wall. Not because they're bad, but because they were not written for me and you. And I'm getting so frustrated over the matter that I may take a couple of my machines back to ol' GPF-prone Win 3.11 for Workgroups, with all the slipstream enhancements.

OK, Thom. Ya got us all puzzled so far. What's bugging you?

I thought you'd never ask. I've just been through a work session with a Win95 upgrade to one of my favorite products; real pro category stuff. Never mind what product it is, because it's the trend, not the products themselves, that is significant and the source of my weepy eyes.

This particular product added 17 icons (!) to its main operating screen; some across the top, some down the side. It also defaults to a couple of popup toolbars, which thank goodness can be turned off; and also defaults to a bunch of "Are you sure you want to do this?" interrogatories on various operations; some of which I've NOT been able to find a way to turn off. Grrrr... (Gawd, I hate for my computer to suggest I may not know what I'm doing!!!)

Somewhere in the midst of all this threshing around, the lightning bolt struck my consciousness: This is written for a *new* computer user, not someone who might be expected to know the difference between the DOS prompt and the human body's chief repository of lint. No matter I am already a skilled user of the product, lo, these many versions -- for Win95, I get reduced to a lottery winner who has just taken his first Pentium PC out of the box.

I can somewhat accept that premise from the developers. Hey, everybody's got to be a new user once. But, once a night is enough, OK? This situation is turning into a nightmare. Where is the "advanced mode" or the "professional mode" for these Win95 products?

I pondered that point for a few moments, then decided to do a rough-and-dirty analysis of these new intruders on the product's screen. Of the 17 new icons, three were indeed new functions. Nice ones. But the 14 others are for procedures and functions so rarely used you'd not need them except on a rainy day in Kuwait. Yet, there they are, constantly cluttering my screen and making themselves available for me to blunder into when all I really wanted to was exit and turn off the lights. *And*, their operations had *all* been available in previous versions of the software -- simply a little more difficult to find.

As I said, I will not point out a particular product here, because this is the fifth major Win95 product I've seen with the same general trend. The developers have made it so easy

(maybe) for new users to hack away at their stuff, that they've introduced barricades for oldtimers to hurdle in doing long-familiar tasks. In no way, can they promise to improve my productivity. I will warn you that the product areas in which I've seen this problem are telecommunications, fax handling, image editing, personal finance and Web browsing. There are Win95 releases of major products in each of these areas that bring nothing new to the table except additional forks (so that it's even harder to find your salad fork).

Most people think that new releases of software should (1) fix bugs, (2) add user-requested functionality, (3) add competitive functionality, and (4) package these first three items cohesively. Instead, what I'm seeing in Win95 software is an awful lot of wheel reinvention: developers are obscuring the factors that made their products popular in the first place, by trivializing them amidst a screenful of icons. I really don't need an icon to help me correct the spelling of "Ebeneser" to "Ebenezer" -- but that's what I soon expect to see.

I know I'm crying in the wilderness in trying to do anything to reverse this trend. But, ^#\$ %^ it, *not* every computer user is a new user. And not every piece of software needs to be written as though we were. Any good gardener can tell you that adding gild to a lily will kill it. Pretty today, dead tomorrow.

Ouick Takes and Pure Opinion from Wolly

STUFFIT EXPANDER


Wolly should do what?



Wolly loves discovering freeware treasures like this one. StuffIt Expander 1.0 is a totally free, good looking application from Aladdin Systems that **expands the seven most popular compressed and encoded formats:** Zip (.zip), Arj (.arj), Arc (.arc), Gzip (.gz, .z), Uuencode (.uu, .uue), and BinHex (.hqx). It also supports StuffIt, Zip, and Arj self-extracting archives (.exe, .sea), and Macintosh files in MacBinary (.bin) format. StuffIt Expander is a **true Windows (3.x and Win95) application**, too, with **all decompression and decoding built right into it.** Use it to decompress and decode everything that gets into your computer archived, compressed, or encoded, and **you will never see those nasty ol' black DOS session windows pop up** all over the screen (like when you use DOS archivers). And the best thing about it is that it doesn't put all files contained in an archive into the same directory where the archive already is, or ignore the directory structure of the archive like PKUNZIP does when you forget that "-d" switch. **By default, it creates a surrounding directory,** so that expanded files are easy to find and don't mix with archives. Very neat, in more ways than one! Grab this **freeware** goodie from Aladdin Systems as **SITEX10.ZIP** (286K).


MEDIA SAUCE

Marinara I've had, but...



If you like multimedia with a twist, check out MediaSauce 1.1. This unique looking (but easy to use) Windows program plays and manages Wave, Midi, Video for Windows, and Quicktime movie files. Copy, move, rename, delete, get information, and even assign your favorite editors to WAV, MID, AVI and MOV files. MediaSauce is also a CD Player and CD Database that stores the name of the track, artist, disc name, year released, category, etc. The CD Database (searchable and exportable) can store over 65,000 compact discs. Wolly really likes the built-in animations when you play sound files and the colorful round buttons (he's so easily amused). The registered version adds built-in sound when activating certain portions of the program, for a nifty touch. Works with Windows 3.1 and Win95 too! Perhaps you should get multimediaed by MED11CX.ZIP (416K) and register it for a mere \$14.95.





Here's an inexpensive little **outline-style freeform information manager with a nice design** for Windows 95. It's pretty easy to use the **button bar icons** to add items and do other neat stuff; you can **expand and contract outline items quickly and search for data** in case you forget where you put it. You can **preview and print notes, e-mail from it, and it has a dialer,** although it's very restrictive in the way it works. If you don't need the overhead and cost of some similar commercial programs, **VLT32111.ZIP** (353K) could definitely be worth a look, and registration is only **\$15.00**.

SAYL






Freeware from Japan, this simple screen saver lets you choose your own bitmap to pop up around your screen at saver time. It's not fancy, will only display the bitmap in its native size, won't let you choose intervals or even use a password. But hey, **SAYLOOE.ZIP** (25K) is **small** and free. What more can you ask?





Using hacker in the most positive sense




It's no surprise to find that there's **a whole flock of options in Windows 95** that aren't all that easy to get at or know about. There was a sweetheart of a program for Windows 3.0, too, and it's similarly no surprise to see one for the latest version of Windows. **WH95-V1.ZIP** (24K) presents **a pretty tabular picture of several options, though most are disabled in this sample version.** If you want access to them all, you'll have to part with **\$9.95**. Wolly would have liked to have seen an explanation of a couple of the more unclear options before he'd leap into the unknown. Perhaps exposure to this will inspire a few of us to delve into the Windows 95 Resource Kit to discover a few obscure little switches on our own.





Wolly likes almost everything in the Metz Library, so he took a look at Metz Stop. As predicted in last month's Briefs, we now cover our second in the parade of "gettin' outa Windows 95" programs. Ok, this one lets you choose your default action, instead of having to click on it with that pesky old Windows 95-included function. Big deal, sez Wolly, with a tinge of sarcasm (Wolly taints much of his speech with sarcasm). Download METZSTOP.ZIP (149K) and register it for \$5 if it is a big deal to you. Wolly almost understood all the Win31 getenzeeout programs, since rebooting frequently was the key to survival. But hey, aren't you supposed to be able to stay in Win95 all day????


MATH WIZ FINANCIAL CALCULATOR



Talk about a **multi-function calculator!** Math Wiz doesn't present an image of the usual imitation HP12 or variant, but delivers **a series of screens** for a variety of purposes. Besides **typical mathematical functions**, the system offers a **financial**, **irregular cash flow**, **date**, and **trigonometric function calculator** as well as **amortization tables**. There's a help file to document **MATHWIZ** (96K), an all-around calculatin' wizard, which can be registered for **\$19.00**. Go forth and multiply!



If I could only undo what I've undone



Edit and play with WAV files using Sound Gadget Pro's easy to understand interface. It has a limited number of effects, but if all you need is nice clean editing along with conversion, amplification, enveloping, and such, SGPRO101.ZIP (1065K) may just be the ticket, and the ticket costs only \$20.00. This is the first release of this Windows 95/NT product, which doesn't include an undo function, something Wolly would like to see. Perhaps in a later version.



ONE PAGE CALENDAR

Today is the first day...



Need a plain, single page calendar of the month or year? Here it is, free, courtesy of Kent Briggs, your PC and printer. Choose your format, month, year (from 1583-9999 — now that's taking planning ahead to a whole new plane) and font (size doesn't work), then preview and

print your creation. Nice, **clean of messy holidays and moon phases,** ready for you to scratch your life plans onto. **OPCW10.ZIP** (146K) is **freeware** and fine.

SABACC FOR WINDOWS


May the force be with you



I guess if you practiced enough and found yourself in the right bar in the right quadrant, you could win the Millenium Falcon. That's what Han Solo did as a result of playing the game of Sabacc with Lando Calrissian. This well-written presentation of the game offers colorful Star Wars characters as the card backs along with several regional variations. Please excuse Wolly's miserable 16 color shrunken graphic -- the card artwork is quite nice. Fortunately, Sabacc also includes good documentation and the rules for each style, since Wolly's memory is a bit foggy since Darth Vadar zapped him, after he unwisely made fun of his Mac. Apparently freeware, WINSAB12.ZIP (202K) is a must-have for gamers and fans of Star Wars.

QREAD 95

NotePad as it should oughta been




Were you as disappointed with the Win95 version of Notepad as Wolly was? Looks like there'll continue to be a market for **Notepad replacements** until at least Windows 97. Wolly really likes this **32-bit** one. The program makes it easy to **read files of any size** (unlike Notepad) **in any font**

on your screen. QRead automatically adjusts the font size or line breaks to fit the window (Wolly likes this a lot). It also provides tools for reading and organizing: reading lists, timers, clipboard view, drag and drop compatibility, printing, multi-file search, bookmark, and file delete. Notepad might have all that in Windows 99. Plus, you can customize the program on a file by file basis. Sure, you could use Win95's WordPad for some of this, but QRead is much quicker. This \$23.00 shareware product can be found as QREAD920.ZIP (331K).

ADDRESS BOOK FOR WIN95

I'd call a friend if I could remember their number



Wolly hates writing out anything by hand (mainly because he can't read his own writing). With Discoversoft's Address Book for Win95, now he can print flawless address books. We're talking about the kind you can make with regular 8 1/2" X 11" paper and a couple of staples. This program lets you easily make phone lists for each phone in your home and custom address books for every member of your family. Maybe you'd like to keep extra address books in your car, office, RV, or boat (just what Wolly needs for his 40-footer anchored right off the Joisey Cape). This easy-to-use program also prints mailing labels, phone and birthday lists, and more. Assign up to ten categories to each name (friends, relatives, etc.) and then view or print addresses by category. Its versatile record structure supports address and phone info from different countries, and you can list up to 8 phone numbers and have custom notes for each name in your book. If it only it had a toolbar, it would be perfect! But Wolly thinks you'll get more than \$10 (the registration fee) use out of it. For a real deal from Discoversoft, grab AB-W95.ZIP, 734K.

The latest from the WinOnLine™ Review staff



Commence 3.0

When I looked at **Commence** version 2.1 in the August 1994 issue of the WinOnLine ReviewTM (WOLR88) I was at once impressed and intimidated by the sheer power of this program. It remains my PIM to this day, in its newest version, and I have the networked version constantly available through my two machines. A primary claim to fame was its exceptionally low resource requirements, a large concern of mine in my days with Windows 3.1.

Jensen-Jones, Inc. has made most of the improvements to **Commence** under the hood. Data capacities are increased, TAPI support offered, e-mail support added, and there's a long list of improvements to the interface. In fact, that's the first new feature that is noticed: multiple custom desktops can be created for specific work requirements.

The unfortunate thing is that, while the program is more powerful, it is still just as intimidating, in spite of Jensen-Jones' claim that it is easier to use. It remains an incredible power in the PIM database world — I suspect that you could make this system do anything that you wanted, provided you had the patience and database experience to create the ultimate custom system to serve your needs. I have neither; my attempts to mold Commence to my needs have ended in lost patience and frustration. Intuitive it is not. Take heed that it is probably as much my fault as the program's; I have a low frustration level for programs that are supposed to make my life easier when they in fact don't. Your mileage may vary. While an end user may find day to day use relatively easy, he or she had better have a programmer-type in the wings to perform any major customization to the system.

In spite of this mixed commentary, I'll still recommend that if you have the credentials and the need, consider the power of Commence. For the last few years, Art Metz and METZ Software have put out some of the best quality Windows shareware programs. They're so good that most are sold through commercial retail channels as well. I wouldn't think of running Windows 3.x without METZ Task Manager, and METZ Launch is still part of my Win95 system. **METZ Phones** has always been a very capable program to manage phone and address lists, and includes network support. We reviewed version 5.02 in the WOLR Shareware Edition 40 about eighteen months ago, but a lot of new features have been added. Here's an update and look at the latest release.

There are tons of programs to manage address and telephone lists, from simple low-end applications to full fledged, sometimes overwhelming database programs. But, what if all you want is a powerful but easy to learn and use phone book program that's network capable, has security functions, and doesn't use a lot of system resources, you should check out METZ

Phones 5.6.

Here are some of **METZ Phones** key features:

- Support for all major networks including Novell Netware, Banyan Vines, IBM PC LAN, 3COM 3+ Share, DEC Pathworks, Microsoft LAN Manager, Microsoft NT Advanced Server, Windows For Workgroups and Windows 95. Everyone in a company or group can have easy access to central databases of common address and telephone information.
- **METZ Phones Administrator** (new with version 5.6 and available separately) lets network administrators control access to address books on a file, group, and user level. Access rights include file, feature, and field access control.
- Microsoft Office compatibility. Toolbars, commands and menus are similar to the ones in Microsoft Office Suite applications.

- Automated label formats and printing, with a built-in library of standard Avery label templates for quick printing. You can define your own label or modify the pre-defined label formats. METZ Phones even has a test button to let you print out a sample sheet of labels on


plain paper so you don't have to sacrifice a sheet of labels to test your creations.

Versatile searching capabilities. You can sort by a very precise range to get just the information you want. The search results can be combined into customized lists that can be exported or printed. You might even want to group your phonebook entries by categories so you can display information like they do in the Yellow Pages.

Low consumption of resources. According to the company, when **METZ Phones** is minimized, it frees much of its resources. And, METZ Phones uses less than half the resources of many other PIM products.

Unlimited phone numbers per entry. Unlike other programs that give you space for just 2 or 3 phone numbers, **METZ Phones** lets you include as many numbers as you'd like.

By the way, all you software techies might be interested in knowing that the program uses the Borland Database Engine for database management and was written in Microsoft C++. Also, if you're not using Windows for Workgroups or Windows 95, you will have to load the DOS program SHARE before you start up Windows.



Checking out the **METZ Phones** Toolbar from left to right, you'll see icons for these commands: Create A New Database, Open An Existing Database, Print A Report, Cut, Copy, Paste, Undo, Print Labels, Print Envelopes, Copy Addresses To The Clipboard, List View Options, Display Pending Calls Through Today, Find/Search, Create A New Record, Delete The Current Record, Display The Dial Pad, and Display The Help File.

Underneath the Toolbar, you'll see the Alphabet Bar, which allows quick access to find

records in the List Window that begins with a certain letter.

Looking at the METZ Phones Button Bar from left to right, here's what the icons do: Display The First Address, Display The Telephone Numbers, Display The User Defined Fields, Display The First Note Field, Display The Second Note Field, Display The Second Address, and Display The Third Address. Below the Button Bar, you'll find the Command Bar. It lets you move among the address book record, or perform commands (like Delete, Save, and Print) on the current record displayed.

At the bottom of the **METZ Phones** main window, you'll see the Status Bar. Not only does it show the current time and date, but it gives you helpful information on what to do next when you move your mouse cursor around the screen. And, if you double click on the date or time, the Windows Control Panel is displayed. (Neat feature!)

I found **METZ Phones 5.6** very intuitive to use, and the program performed well with Windows 95. (METZ is planning to release a 32-bit version of the program soon.) However, you can tell the program is aimed at the business and office user, especially if you're on a network. A business or corporate user in need of a simple, flexible and phonebook program that's easy on system resources will find that **METZ Phones** can definitely do the job.



SnapShot/32 -- cute name, don't you think? Actually, from a marketing standpoint, it *is*! It states in a succinct, attractive fashion, the purpose and target operating environment for this application. Let's face it: Screen capture is not brain surgery. Furthermore, there are a million and one ways to accomplish it, not the least of which is the good ol' Alt-Print-Scrn hotkey combo that is built into all Windows environments. Even then, you want a fast and efficient way to deal with the resultant image.

So... what makes **SnapShot/32** a better "mousetrap?" There are several things. One of its strengths is that it only takes about five minutes to become proficient at turning out crisp, professional screen captures in Windows NT and/or Windows95. Optionally, you can include the cursor image in your capture if it suits your purpose.



Snap/Shot32 is the epitome of user friendliness. It rests unobtrusively minimized on the desktop or on the taskbar, jumping into action whenever you apply the assigned hot-key combination. Hot-key assignments are easily configured for full screen, highlighted Window or Client, and rectangular captures in a simple dialogue box (pictured above.) In fact, that capture was processed with **Snap/Shot**!

No doubt you've noticed the "Repeat Last Capture" and "Stop Auto Capture" items. These are part of the **Auto-Save** feature which will repeat or continue to capture a designated portion of screen at user-specified intervals, until you tell it to stop. This is excellent for putting together instructional materials and reshooting minor changes. The program will even auto-increment filenames.

Snap/Shot32 saves images in BMP, GIF, or JPEG formats, making it quite handy for World Wide Web and other graphics applications. GIFs can be saved with transparent backgrounds, and JPG files may be saved with user-designated degree of lossiness. It also creates

the new "progressive" JPG which is rapidly becoming popular on the Web. Provisions for saving captures in different BMP color depths are also just a check-box away, since each format has its own custom dialog box for its own unique set of options.

As if all of these features wouldn't be enough to pique your interest, shareware author Greg Kochniak threw in yet another couple of pearls. In addition to *saving*, **Snap/Shot** will also print your capture! It will expand the image to the size of the paper and your selected margins, and can add a frame. If needed, you can even reduce the output to black and white or do a reverse.

This application is just plain useful! There's one more bonus I'd like to bring to the reader's attention. Because **Snap/Shot** is built for the Windows 32-bit environment, it adheres to all the conventions you quickly become used to. I, for one, appreciate increasingly the application that permits me to save my long filenames. One can quickly tire of dealing with the "hunt 'n peck" method of ferreting out long filenames from a sea of tildes (the "~" symbol).

Frankly, I was pleasantly suprised by this one. I encourage you to check it out. You won't be disappointed.




I have long been a strong believer in the Confucian concept, "A picture is worth a thousand words." Whenever I'm called on to explain something to someone, I often rely on pictures or drawings to explain my points. Perhaps my proclivity toward illustration is a practice brought on by my engineering training or my teaching background. In any event, showing a picture of something is usually better than trying to verbally explain it.

Anyone who frequently uses screen images to illustrate their documents quickly realizes that a good screen capture utility is an essential tool on their system. Those familiar with the Windows operating system and procedures knows that an entire screen can be copied to the clipboard by simply pressing the Print Screen button. However, using this Windows feature requires several additional steps. Since the captured image is only added to the clipboard, you'll need to open Paint Brush or a similar graphics editor to save the image as a file. You'll usually need to trim the image as well. After trying out several different screen capture programs, I've settled on a program called *SnagIt*. This program not only does all I need, but is very simple and easy to setup and use.

The *SnagIt* program is a straight forward utility that makes screen captures in Windows a snap. Having used earlier versions of the program for quite some time, frankly I'd be lost without it. When the new version, *SnagIt 2.5*, was released I quickly jumped in line to get an upgrade. The most compelling features of *SnagIt*, have long been its simplicity and capabilities.

The complete operation of the *SnagIt* program is shown under Quick Help in the Help menu section, and it really is that simple to run the program. When activated, the program comes up with your last setup arrangement displayed on the opening screen. If this is the setup you require, you can simply begin your screen capture. Or, if another type of capture is necessary, you can easily make the necessary modifications to the setup.



Changing the setup is simply a matter of selecting your choices from the menu options. The program accepts input from a wide variety of sources and will output to your printer, clipboard, or disk. You can select to save the output as either monochrome, color, or a dithered grayscale image. This is especially useful if you need to output a screen capture to your laser printer. I frequently use *SnagIt* to capture program screens for printed materials. The monochrome option automatically selects the colors for you. No need to go into the image with a paint program to clean up the colors so they can be printed in black and white. Light colored areas on the screen print as white and darker areas print black.

The **User-set Scale** option is also handy when printing. Since my computer is setup with an 800 x 600 SVGA, the images typically print out too small for most of my work. So, I simply change the scale value from 1 to 2 and the size of the printed capture is doubled. A couple new scaling features are added to this version. The **Auto Scale** option will automatically size the output image to suit the size of the paper you are printing. A **Proportional Scale** is also available to allow the screen size to scale the image you are capturing.

The output can also be set to suit many situations. You may elect to send the captured image to your printer, to the clipboard, or to a file. If you select the file option an additional dialog box appears to allow you to select the file format and the location for the file. The image may be saved as a BMP, PCX, or TIF file. You can even specify the directory where the files will be saved. While you may specify any file name you wish, for individual captures, a program default to save the files as SNAGXXX is also available. Here each capture you make is automatically assigned a name and place in the specified directory. The XXX value changes with each successive capture. The first capture is saved as SNAG-1.XXX, the second as SNAG-2.XXX, and so on.

SnagIt is also equipped with a very useful macro for those using Microsoft Word for Windows. This macro gives you access to the **SnagIt** program directly from your WinWord menu. Word for Windows versions 2.0 and 6.0 are supported with this macro. Complete instructions for installing and using the macro are also included. Also new to this version is the ability to set the hot keys, and you can even Hide or Unhide the program icon. Both the program documentation and help systems are very well done and offer many tips on getting the most out of the program.

If you find you need to use screen captures for your work and are tired of the hassles of using the Windows program for this process, take *SnagIt 2.5* for a test drive. This is a very useful utility that can greatly simplify your work.


Both these programs offer a wide range of design options and are well appointed with all the tools and templates needed to quickly and easily create professional quality marketing materials. An additional bonus is their tie in to several commercial paper companies. Most of the templates included in the packages relate directly to a wide selection of pre-printed papers from BeaverPrints, PaperDirect, Image Street, and ImagePlus. Samples of these papers are also included with the programs.

The combination of the *My Professional Business Cards* and *My Advanced Brochures*, Mailers, & More programs and these preprinted forms are a powerful team. Using these predesigned templates helps speed the design process and make all your materials look great. Likewise, few would disagree with the idea that color helps achieve the maximum impact from our documents. But, not many of us are willing to invest in a color printer just to print an occasional flyer or brochure. With these pre-printed materials, all the color and designs are already printed on the blank forms. Even the fold line scores and corner cuts for business cards are included with many. From the time I loaded this software on to my computer it only took five minutes to understand the basic principles of this program. The program steps you through the complete design process and makes creating professional quality business cards a real breeze. When editing, you can add, delete, or rotate text frames, or rotate the image to view from any angle. Here you can view your complete card design from any angle before printing it. Images can be resized and arranged with other objects to create all original logos. You can also place photographs or scanned images onto your business cards. All of these options greatly enhance your design choices and result in card designs that are exactly what you want. The program has a good help system and several easy to understand tutorials are included to help you get started with the graphics and some advanced graphics editing procedures.



My Advanced Brochures, Mailers, & More

Like business cards, brochures, mailers, letterheads, envelopes, and similar documents are a vital part of doing business. With the My Advanced Brochures, Mailers, & More program, preparing these materials is both very easy and quite quick. And the result is a collection of coordinated, or matching, documents that can really make your business look great.



You can choose from over 300 pre-printed color papers, from a variety of sources, to create your business literature with style and flair. Choose from a wide variety of different brochure designs. Templates are included for 2-, 3-, and 4-fold brochures in several styles and variations. SIDEKICK DELUXE

a review by Ed Hoffman

It seems like one of the major challenge facing us all is getting organized. This is especially true for those involved in the business world. Virtually every business person I know carries some type of daily organizer book. With some folks, it's almost an extension of their hand. To meet this ever increasing demand several personal organizers are available, most notably several brandnamed organizer books. Despite the utility of these organizers, they all require manual entry of any information. This limitation has not gone unnoticed in the world of software. The host of computerized organizers have become so prevalent that there is even a software category devoted to these programs: Personal Information Managers, or PIMs.


These programs help you keep track of all the important business or personal details of your life -- no more missed appointments or forgotten birthdays. From phone numbers and addresses, to detailed listings of all your business appointments, the right PIM can definitely make life easier. But there are a few very useful and full featured PIMs now available for Windows 95, and I am pleased to see an old favorite, *SideKick*, now available for the new operating system.

This program offers all the features you would expect to find in a well organized paper type organizer, but by tapping the power of the computer, *SideKick* is a veritable cornucopia of features and capabilities. This program is virtually a *DayTimer on steroids*. Not only is there a place for telephone numbers, notes, appointments, and everything else one would expect to find, but all this information can be easily tied or linked together.



The **Calendar** is easily accessed by clicking on the icon. Rather than a simple picture, this is a dynamic icon that actually shows the current date. Once opened, the calendar offers a variety of different views. By clicking on the tabs across the bottom of the window, you can show the calendar in daily, weekly, monthly or yearly views.

The daily view shows information in separate five windows. The top left window shows the date and a view of the calendar for the month. Directly below this is the To Do and Calls window. Here all your important activities for the day are easily listed. The window at the top right lists your appointments. And below this is a window you can use to show a variety of different information such as contact logs, goals lists or data from any of your card files. When not needed, this information may be hidden and the appointments section will occupy the complete right side of the window.




Adding information to the calendar is quite simple and either individual or recurring events, calls, or appointments may be entered. Information noted on the daily views also appears in the weekly and monthly calendars. Data may be entered from the keyboard, or where appropriate, an individual may be added to the To Do or Calls list by dragging the name from the card files area. To call anyone on your calls list, simply highlight the name and click on the telephone icon. A dialog box appears showing all the listed phone numbers for the person and an area for you to add notes about the call. A dial pad is also provided should you need to enter the information manually.



The **Time** icon is shown directly below the Calendar icon. This is also a dynamic icon and shows the actual time. When clicked, this icon opens a window that shows the Earth Time. This is a map of the world with eight customizable city buttons. With this you can instantly know what time it is in up to eight cities you select. Another novel feature of the map is that it shows whether it is night or day anywhere on earth by shading a portion of the map. As the day progresses, the shading moves to cover those areas of the earth where night has fallen. So, if you wonder whether it is 3:00 in the morning or afternoon in Tokyo, a quick glance at this map will show you.



The Card File icon gives you instant access to all your different phone books. Several different books may be opened at the same time. To switch between them, simply click on one of the tabs across the bottom of the window. The card file window is divided into three general areas. The windows to the left show an alphabetical listing of all the names listed in the card file. When one of these is selected the specific card appears in the top right window. Below this window, on the right side, is another multi-function window that will show your calls, appointments, goals list, contact log, or To Do list. When not needed, this window may also be hidden and the complete card for the selected individual is shown on the right side of the window. Though generally used for listing names and addresses, the card files are actually individual databases that you can configure in virtually any way you wish for use with items other than names and addresses.





Selecting the **Write** icon gives you instant access to a functional word processor for writing notes and letters. An assortment of sample letters are provided for a variety of typical business purposes. These may be used as they are, or edited to suit your specific requirements. A spelling checker and mail merge features are also available within the program to simplify your writing tasks. A calculator is also built into the program to help make any quick calculations.



An **Expenses** icon is provided to help you keep track of your various expenses. This option

allows you to enter all the specifics about the expense as well as any personal notes you may wish to include. A variety of general expense items are provided in a pick list to help speed the recording process. Once all the information is entered a report may also be prepared and printed with the program.



The **Reminder** icon gives you quick and easy access to the tasks you have listed elsewhere. Clicking this icon shows you an organized and easy to read listing of all your To Do items, calls, and appointments.

The program will allow you to organize and print a variety of different reports. These may also be formatted to suit many of the standard paper organizers. Templates are furnished for a variety of different size Day Timer, Day Runner, Franklin and Filofax organizers as well as a *SideKick* format. This PIM is well thought out and offers a wealth of customizable features to help you better organize your time and simplify your scheduling. The CD version of the program comes with a wide array of information files and a complete tutorial. For those who have not yet made the jump to Windows 95, a Windows 3.X version of *SideKick* is also available. Regardless of your organizational requirements, this is one Personal Information Manager program that will likely more than fill your needs.

Ed. Note: As we went to press, SideKick 95 Deluxe became available at a list price of \$79.95. Available only on CD ROM, it includes Dashboard 95, two personal organizational videos for playback on your PC, and several informational files for use with SideKick 95. A similar bundle is available on CD ROM with the Windows 3.1 versions of the programs. Dashboard, available bundled and separately, will be reviewed in an upcoming issue.

NORTON UTILITIES FOR WINDOWS 95

a review by Ed Hoffman

One of the first programs I purchased soon after acquiring my first PC clone, was the *Norton Utilities*. Since then, I've regularly upgraded my copy every time a new version was released. Evidently I'm not the only one that appreciates the functionality and usefulness of this program. Microsoft has also included portions of the *Norton Utilities* in the new Windows 95 as well as the last few versions of DOS. When the Windows 95 version of this program became available, I was right in line to get my upgrade. As usual, the folks at Symantec have produced another *gotta have* utility.

Anyone who uses a computer will, at some time, make full use of this Norton program. Whether as a tool to recover deleted files, a system de-fragmentation utility, a system diagnostic tool, or any number of other functions, the *Norton Utilities* is a program that should be part of every computer system. Like the earlier versions, the Windows 95 variant of this package is a good investment that can save a great deal of aggravation and frustration.

The Norton Utilities, rather than a single program, is actually a collection of several individual utilities. Each of the distinct elements in this series is intended to service specific functions. Combined, these utilities will help you to keep your system purring along and operating at its peak efficiency. The following is a brief description of the eleven components that make up this utility collection.



Disk Editor

The **Disk Editor** program is a disk editing tool that runs from DOS. Yes, Windows 95, still has a DOS component, though it is more in the background than before. With this tool you can edit or repair virtually any area of a hard drive or floppy disk. You can work with individual files, directories, the boot record, partition table, or the file allocation table (FAT). This is a tool that only experienced users should attempt to use. A well written and understandable tutorial about disk storage is also included in the manual.



Image

The **Image** utility is a program that takes a *snapshot* of the critical data and information on your disks. The file allocation table (FAT), boot record, and root information are all copied to a special file. This information is then used by other utilities in the package to undelete erased files and folders. With this information you can restore your data if a disk is either formatted or severely damaged.



Info Desk

As the name suggests, the **Info Desk** utility is a detailed Help system for the program. Each feature of the program as well has how they are used is fully described. This system is well organized and quite inclusive. If you have a question about using any specific utility within the

complete program, this help system will describe both the feature and operation of the utility.



Norton Diagnostics

The **Norton Diagnostics** is a utility that makes a comprehensive check of your system. Virtually everything inside your computer box is evaluated. To get a more accurate picture of your system configuration, this utility must operate from within DOS. You can check data such as your hardware and interrupt configuration, your system board, memory, and ports as well as the CMOS and IRQ status. You can also check all the hard and floppy drives on your system, and either review the test results on screen or print out a report.



Norton Disk Doctor

The **Norton Disk Doctor** is one of the more indispensable elements within this collection. This utility will repair a host of problems common to disk storage. Things like truncated files, cross-linked files, or similar screw-ups are easily fixed with this utility. This is a utility that I regularly run to keep everything on my hard drives neat and tidy. If problem files are detected, the utility gives you the option of deleting the offending portions, or saving them to a file. There is also an undo command that will allow you to undo what the utility does, if you feel you would rather have it the old way.



Norton System Doctor

The Norton System Doctor is a utility that monitors and analyzes portions of your computer system that you pre-select. Items such as CPU usage, disk integrity, network connections, and several others you can choose are all monitored. If a problem is encountered, the utility will either notify you of the particular condition, or fix it automatically.




Rescue Disk

The **Rescue Disk** utility is a handy tool to help protect you and your system from disaster. This utility is used to automatically copy all the critical system files to a floppy disk. Then, should the unthinkable happen and you have a system crash, the floppy can be inserted and you will be able to get inside your machine to see what went wrong. Several of the other program utilities and selected DOS utilities are also copied to this disk. The System Doctor can also be setup to schedule periodic updates of your rescue disks.



Space Wizard

The **Space Wizard** is a unique utility that will help you identify the files, of questionable value such as old TMP files, that might be taking up valuable space on your hard drive. This wizard allows you to either do an express or a comprehensive evaluation of your drives and when suspect files are identified, you have the option of ignoring, deleting, or compressing the files.





Speed Disk

One of the more annoying facts of life with computers is the way data is copied to your hard drive. Basically the system puts your data where ever it finds room. This results in pieces of your files being spread out in several places on your drive. Eventually, this will degrade the performance of your system. The **Speed Disk** utility finds all the pieces of your files and puts them back together, in order. This allows you to retrieve the files faster and will improve the overall performance of your system. When scouting your drives, this utility will also alert you of any potential problems. Then, if necessary, it will automatically start the **Disk Doctor** to make the corrections. The utility will also allow you the option of performing a surface scan of your drives to head off problems before they have a chance to cause you problems.

System Information

The **System Information** utility shows you a detailed listing of every aspect of your computer system. From the name and date of your system BIOS to the type and version numbers of your operating system, everything about your system is displayed. You can automatically see every detail about your system in a series of selected categories. The information is grouped into System, Display Printer, Memory, Drive, Input, Multimedia, and Network categories. You can also run a test of your overall system performance. Here the results are shown in a bar graph where your system is compared against several other common computer configurations.



UnErase Wizard

The **UnErase Wizard** is a utility that helps to protect you from yourself. Each time you erase a file in Windows 95 the recycle bin will give you the opportunity to reclaim the file. However, if you have yet to move to the Explorer in Windows 95 and use the File Manager instead, the deleted files are not sent to the recycle bin. However, the *Norton Utilities* will track these files

regardless how you delete them and they can be undeleted with the UnErase Wizard.

If you plan to move to Windows 95, the *Norton Utilities* will even help prepare your machine for the installation. Running this program before installing Windows 95 will help resolve any problems and will make the whole installation process smoother and less prone to problems. It is one program that you should definitely have on your system. Having had my bacon saved several times, with earlier versions of these utilities, I've come to appreciate the power and functionality of this collection.



Forms, of one kind or another, are a mainstay of businesses today. No matter how large or small a company may be or what type of product or service they offer, all businesses are consumed in forms. Though some forms used today are standardized, pre-printed documents you can pick up at your local office supply, most are custom documents made to suit a particular purpose. In years past, a company would need to go to their printer and pay a small fortune to have these forms designed and printed. Today, however, with a simple computer system and a forms generation program almost anyone can quickly become the resident forms maven.

Most forms generating software programs serve two basic functions: they design forms and fill out forms. As you might suspect, the range of offerings in this software category is quite amazing. Some low-end offerings are quite spartan and are actually little more than a modified form of a labeling program. Others at the higher end incorporate every design and text tool imaginable. However, only the more imaginative forms generation programs offer the features more in tune to the needs of the typical business user. One such innovative forms generation program is *OmniForm 1.01*.



Like other similar offerings, the *OmniForm* program may be used to create custom forms that you design yourself. Here you need only open a new form in the design mode. All the tools necessary to quickly and accurately produce your forms are readily available. A wide selection of design and drawing tools are accessible in a tool bar at the left of the design window. Other design options are also available across the top of the window and within the menu options.

Many of these tools are fully configurable. Should you need a rectangular box, for example, simply select the rectangle tool and draw the box in the approximate position you want.

You may then precisely position the box by dragging it to the desired position, using an on screen grid. Or for more precise positioning, you may also enter the exact coordinate position from the keyboard with an optional dialog box. Once positioned, if you decide you would rather have rounded corners on the box, simply click the right mouse button and a dialog box appears to modify the box. Here you select the Object Appearance option and another box appears where you can easily modify the specific attributes. Selecting the Rounded option will change the square cornered rectangle to a rounded rectangle. You may even select the exact size of the corner radius within this dialog box. Other optional settings, such as the line weights, background colors and other similar options may also be selected.

Once the basic form is roughed out you can then enter the fill-in fields. Entries in each fill-in field can be specified as text, numeric, date, time, and a host of other options. Calculation fields may also be setup to do all the necessary arithmetic for you automatically. When the form is complete, you can then begin to do the actual entry of information. Here again the *OmniForm* program offers a wealth of features. A built in database feature allows you to maintain all the information entered in your forms. Then, the next time you need to fill out a form, the information is right at your fingertips. If you presently have a database that you use for information, the *OmniForm* program can import or export data using Open Data Base Connectivity (odbc)TM.

Despite all the design capabilities of this program *OmniForm* offers another feature that can be very useful if you already have a collection of standard forms. Rather than requiring you to redraw your existing forms the program can also import these forms for you. Using either a scanner or a fax machine you can copy the existing forms into the *OmniForm* program. The program will then automatically scan the form and identify the areas where the fields should be and places fill-in fields in the appropriate places. You can then edit these to suit your particular requirements.

If you have decided that now is the time to computerize your forms generation activities, then take the *OmniForm 1.01* program for a test drive. Though it may not make creating your forms any more fun, it will certainly make these activities much easier and a whole lot faster. The *OmniForm 1.01* program operates well in both Windows 3.X and Windows 95.


If you are in the engineering field and have ever seen an odd, red-suspendered, white-bearded fellow speak, it was

probably Ed.



It's been three years since Lotus issued a significant upgrade of *Ami Pro*, the innovative and beloved word processor. They were not wasting their time; they rewrote the program from the bottom up, changing it so dramatically that they gave it a new name: **WordPro 96**. But I have good news and bad news to deliver.

The good news is that **WordPro** has instantly set a new standard for word processing power and grace. Unlike WordPerfect and Microsoft Word, which seem to be locked into mutual imitation, it shows that its makers stopped and really *thought*: thought about what would make working and writing easier, instead of about what would make a dazzling impression on the sales floor. Again and again, as I made myself familiar with the program I thought: *Now why didn't I ever think to want that?* A couple examples of its brilliant design can be seen below.




Parts of the main screen look almost exactly as they did in *Ami Pro*: the "SmartIcons" above and the "live" status bar--which not only tells you what font you're using (for example) but also provides a pop-up menu to let you change it without opening the Font dialog -- beneath the main screen. But it is the new elements in this screen that are really impressive. Above the text window you can see divider tabs, not unlike the kind you find in Windows spreadsheets. You can create divisions of text, and sections within divisions, and they all can appear as folder tabs above the text. Click on one, and you move immediately to that part of the document. Anyone who writes long documents will see the usefulness of these tabs immediately, and after you've

spent some time working in **Word Pro**, navigating MSWord and WordPerfect documents seems unbearably clumsy.

Floating about the text is the "InfoBox," which users of Lotus Approach will recognize: its seven tabbed screens provide access to every aspect of formatting -- fonts and sizes, alignment and indenting, style definition, etc. It is astonishingly useful, and easy to keep handy. Simply double-click on its title bar, and it rolls up out of the way, showing only the tabbed division. This makes it easy to leave the InfoBox open, tucked up by the title bar of the main screen, so that whenever you need to change formatting you can click on one of the tabs and go to work. And this is possible because, like most of the important dialog boxes in **WordPro**, the InfoBox is a "modeless" dialog: you can navigate through and work on your text while leaving it open.

Modeless dialog boxes are hardly a new idea; you can leave the "Find" dialog in MSWord or WordPerfect open while you work with the text you have found. But they are awkward, sitting in the middle of the screen, sometimes right on top of the word that they have found. Lotus's InfoBox is an elegant solution to this problem. But it is not the most elegant, because Lotus has outdone it within this very program, and its "Find" dialog is a good illustration. The dialog sits up below the icon bar and above the folder tabs, so that you can leave the dialog open as long as you want and still work in the document, without its ever getting in your way.



The spell checker similarly attaches its dialog box to the top of the screen, and it offers another welcome innovation as well. Rather than moving word by putatively misspelled word through your document, it highlights *all* the words that it suspects of being misspelled. Select any of them, and the dialog shows its suggestions for that word. If you call up the spell checker when you have a word selected, it will check just that word.

"Versioning" options in **Word Pro** make the other leading word processors look primitive. The most important of them is the ability to save multiple versions of a document within the same file. If you are part of a workgroup, the workgroup leader can assign different levels of access to the document for different users; when several people are editing a document, their edits and comments can display in different colors.

And **Word Pro** sports a completely new macro language, considerably easier and more flexible than the old *Ami Pro* macro language. This is "LotusScript," the cross-application

programming language that has already been incorporated into the now defunct *Improv* and which will appear in new versions of all Lotus products, including *1-2-3* and *Approach*. Users with programming skills will be able to build programs using more than one Lotus application. Scripts are written in a new Script Editor, which is the best programming environment offered by any of the major word processors: it has not only its own menu and toolbar, but lists all commands, classes, data types, and the like at the bottom of the window, so that they can be found and pasted into the new script. The script itself can be stored in any document or style sheet, or can be run as a startup script every time you run **Word Pro**.

Other miscellaneous virtues of the program include first-rate import and export filters (these include an HTML filter, which is used in **WordPro**'s ability directly to open documents from the World Wide Web), a "thumbnail" page view for navigating documents, and "Click Here" blocks that can be inserted in templates. These last are directions that appear as text (like "Click here to insert return address") which disappear as soon as you click on them, to be replaced by the text whose place they hold.

So what's the bad news?

This program should never have shipped as it is now. Plenty has been written in the computer press over the last two years about "commercial betas": programs released while still unfinished, so that those unlucky or innocent enough to buy them just after release provide, in the complaints and problems they call into customer service, the kind of feedback that is more properly provided by beta-testers *before* release. Like every reviewer, I try a lot of software in its first release, but I have never tried anything as glaringly incomplete as this. A few of the most obvious examples:

First and most obviously, its use of memory and resources is swinish. Even when it is the only program open, **Word Pro** uses every last byte of my 20MB of RAM. If there is another program open, or even if I leave the InfoBox on screen, the hard disk starts being swatted, hard, as Windows places more and more into virtual memory. At that point, of course, everything slows down, and it takes ever longer for characters to appear after they are typed.

Second, quite apart from the issue of free memory, some standard actions take longer than they conceivably ought to. Opening or saving even a short document can take fifteen or twenty seconds. If you have **Word Pro** set to save your documents at given intervals, and have several documents open, you might as well go for a coffee during the timed save.

Third, the program is unstable. I had meant to include a screen shot of revision markings, but I couldn't: it crashed with a General Protection Fault every time.

Fourth, there is no direct way to assign commands, macros, or special characters to keystrokes. To insert special characters, Lotus expects you to use Windows' useless Character Map. It is apparently possible to assign keystrokes using LotusScript's "Accelerators" property; users without the time or inclination to learn the scripting language will have to wait until some kind soul creates a utility for assigning keystrokes.

Fifth, even those who do want to learn the scripting language won't get any help from the Help file. As of this writing, a full month after the program's release, many topics in the LotusScript help, like the "Accelerators" property, are incomplete or entirely non-existent.

My final judgment on **Word Pro** is: Watch this space. I would not advise anyone to buy it as it now stands, but there are several good reasons for hope. Lotus is aware of all these problems (their Compuserve forum erupted with complaints almost immediately after the program was released) and has promised to right them. More important is that, just as *Ami Pro* was the first word processor to be written from the ground up for Windows, **Word Pro** is the first to be written from the ground up for 32-bit Windows. In other words, this first release, for Windows 3.1, is in effect a *port* of a 32-bit program to the 16-bit environment. Lotus says that the Windows 95 version will be released later this year, with an improved, faster release of the Windows 3.1 version to follow shortly thereafter. We've already arranged to review the 32-bit release. I hope it gets up to speed, both literally and metaphorically: it would be a pity if such brilliant software could not be made to work.





COREL OFFICE COMPANION



You can always tell when a software concept is successful when other software companies begin to produce products to expand or compliment it. Such is the case with the Office Suites and "Works" programs, those ready-to-run word processing, database, presentation and more packages from Microsoft, Lotus and WordPerfect (among others). More and more companies are getting into the Office Suite add-on game, including **Corel with CD Office Companion.** On one CD-ROM disk, you'll find a whole bunch of stuff that could be useful in nearly any office, whether at home or at work. Here's what's included:



Corel FLOW 2, a "drag and drop" application to create flow charts and business diagrams. 2000 symbols and 30 connector styles are included, plus it features direct line and text editing, a workspace that can be customized, and even has its own spell checker. (By the way, the **Office Companion** version of Corel FLOW is identical to the standalone version with the exception of modified clipart and photo libraries.)

Corel GALLERY 2 (reviewed separately in <u>WOLR Issue 99</u> by Bob Gollihur) — or most of it, anyway. Included are 15,000 vector-based clipart images, 500 high quality TrueType fonts, 200 photos in BMP format, and 75 WAV files (mostly sound effects, sampled in 8-bit mono at 11k). Also you'll find a utility for capturing screen shots and a font manager that allows you to create and manipulate custom TrueType font groups. Missing from this version (compared with the standalone version of Corel GALLERY 2) are the video clips, and some photos have been changed and reduced, no doubt to conserve space on the CD-ROM.



Corel PLANNER, a Windows PIM, which to me looks a lot like Lotus Organizer, but according to Corel is based on technology licensed from Time Systems, Inc. It includes planning calendars, a contact manager and address box, goal and expense tracking, and a section for notes.

- Corel BOOKCASE, which features computer versions of the Concise Columbia Electronic Encyclopedia, Webster's II New Riverside Directory, The Information Please Almanac (in "Regular," "Business," and "Sports" editions). and Simpson's Contemporary Quotations. Also included are 700 standard business form letters that can be easily customized in any word processor or text editor.
- CorelFAX, a full-featured fax communications package. You can fax from within any Windows application that supports printing, and it features an integrated phone book, delayed fax scheduling, background fax transmission and receiving, and normal and broadcast faxing.

Corel Web Mosaic, licensed from Spyglass, Inc. is a genuine Mosaic browser for connection to the World Wide Web. It also includes Internet Eudora e-mail capabilities, but you do have to have an existing Internet provider in order to use it.

Also included are a CD audio player; a screen saver module that allows you to use your own photos as a screen saver; a utility that changes your wallpaper every time you start up Windows; the WinDAT WAV editor; and Wintune 2.0, the Windows Magazine system diagnostic software. (If you already have Corel's CD Power Pak, you're probably familiar with most of these already.)

I really liked version 2 of Corel GALLERY, which is a lot easier to use than the first version, plus it comes with more images and a high quality font collection. Forget buying it for the sounds, however. I expected Corel to include sounds as good as their images, but these are at the best slightly below average. Since many of the fonts come from Bitstream, you may already have some of these if you own Bitstream's "500 Font CD For Windows" package, however.

CorelFLOW is simple to use, although I found it a little slow when dealing with some of the more complex flowchart images, like the human heads and bodies graphics. (I tested it on a 486/66 with 16 meg of RAM.) I also thought Corel PLANNER was just a tad sluggish to use, even though it's as simple to use as a DayTimer. Both programs seem to be full of useful features and could be very useful additions to any home or business office.

Corel's CD-Audio is a very good looking player for your audio CDs in your CD-ROM drive. It comes with an audio database editor to keep up with the content on your CDs, should you want to input titles and track information. The WinDAT WAV editor, while a lot better than Windows Sound Recorder, has a couple of annoying characteristics. Every time it runs, it associates itself with the WAV extension, so that every time you click on a WAV in File Manager, WinDAT comes up to play the WAV. However, before the WAV plays, you have to click on an "OK" button to clear a splash screen which is essentially an advertisement for Voyetra, who makes it. Voyetra is obviously trying to getting you to upgrade to the full version of WinDAT.

While not a substitute for a dedicated multimedia encyclopedia, you'll be able to find a wealth of useful information in Corel BOOKCASE. It's as simple to use as a Windows help file, but you won't find any graphics, animations or audio clips. Nearly everyone will get use out of some of the 700 standard business form letters.

Corel CD Office Companion is well recommended. There's a lot of useful stuff squeezed onto one shiny five inch disk. Corel GALLERY is truly the star of the package, and CD Corel Office Companion is typically priced only about 30 dollars than the standalone version of Gallery 2. For instance, if you're interested in both Gallery 2 and CorelFLOW 2, it makes more sense to pick up CD Office Companion and save around 40 bucks instead of purchasing both separately — plus you'd get the additional programs and utilities. Corel CD Office Companion comes with a good looking full-color user's guide that contains pictures of all fonts and images.

If you're planning on sticking with Windows 3.x for awhile, all of these programs should

work on your system if you have at least 4 megs of RAM, a 386 and 40 megs of hard drive space for a typical installation, plus a 256 color VGA display. Corel does recommend 8 megs of RAM and a 486 running a SVGA display, however. If you're using Windows 95, wait for the 32-bit version of **Office Companion**, which should be out by the end of the year, as a few things don't work correctly with Win95 (most notably, the Fax program and Gallery's font management utility).

WINFORMANT PROFESSIONAL

a review by Len Lindsay

Wow! When I last reported this product to you it was shareware that was really great, and it has since become a commercial product that has gone through two commercial releases. The current product, **WINformant Professional**, has a great deal to recommend it to anyone who uses a computer with Windows. While the first commercial release, wInformant 2.0, is extremely useful in Windows 3.X, it does not function well in the Windows 95 environment. The newest release, however, does very well there!


The program consists of a convenient icon-based toolbar divided into the seven utilities included as a part of **WINformant Professional**. We will take a short look at each of these and a more in-depth look as a few of the most powerful utilities.



Search is a very powerful, easy to use file finding facility that allows the use of standard DOS wildcards. You may search for many different types of files at the same time just by putting a space between the desired file search parameters (eg. confi*.* *.INI). You can also have **Search** look at up to 20 different paths and or drives (depending on your request), but I have found that I have much more interest in this facility for a simple quick search.



Roundup is one of the most robust file finding utilities that I have ever used. Looking at the main screen of this utility will show the ease and intuitiveness of this set of utilities. In the upper windows are some names of the script files which have already been defined as examples for the new user. All you have to do to run one of these searches is highlight the desired search and click on the **Roundup** Icon. You can run more than one of these searches at a time by simply using the control key along with a mouse click to select multiple roundup scripts. This is so powerful because of the scripting facility. It basically functions the same way that Search works, but you are able to write, name and save the desired search.





Swapfile allows users of Windows 3.X to manipulate their swapfiles and even will make some recommendations after looking at the system resources. This feature does not work in Windows 95 as the swapfile is generally set to be controlled by the operating system itself.



DLL/VBX finds redundant DLL and VBX files, meaning that the Windows\System Directory is first scanned and the DLL's and the VBX's are examined. The remainder of the drive is checked to see if there are files identical to those found in the first search. It checks size, date, name, etc., to see if the files are really redundant.




Profile Editor is the easiest to use INI editor that I have seen, and it allows you to perform searches that allow you to find more than one instance on the original search. The section editor

for this utility really works, and it is helpful in understanding what you are doing with your INI files!



Uninstall is the simplest and the fastest uninstaller available that I have seen. There are a lot of features that I really like about this utility. First is ease of use. In the graphic below you can see that the Corel Graphics group (all programs) has been selected and is ready to be uninstalled.



Also notice that the directory C:\CORELDRAW\PHOTOPNT is not highlighted. This is done so that you do not lose any data files that are in that directory, but you can select any files or directories or other items listed just by selecting them with a mouse click. I have found it advantageous to check the list if I am making a very large uninstall just as a check. If you want an automatic uninstaller this is not the ticket for you, but I want to have some control over what is happening and I think that I cannot just trust that all of the selections will be made properly. I would rather make a mistake myself rather than have a program make it for me!

I have found that it will not always take out every last little piece of INI file or some other files that are so obscure that nothing will find them. In conversations with people in the unistaller business, they say that there is almost no way to check everything out when you are

examining a program for removal.



Restart: This is handy for the times when Windows becomes unstable and you want to close windows. It will do a standard restart of Windows.



Eject: When you say eject, that is just what this utility will do for you. Click on this Icon and you are out on your floppy drive!

I have found this little toolbar to be one of the most useful, versatile group of applications. It is not the end all for everyone, but for anyone with any expertise it is really an unbelievable set of utilities. As a person who does a lot of on site work away from the workbench it is so useful because you can take the whole thing with you and run it from a floppy (it is written in C++ and is less than 1 meg in size!) The installation is quite painless and there is mostly a no-brainer. The help files are extensive and easy to use, and there is a comprehensive manual as well.

There will be a CD-ROM version available by the time this is published, and it will include Windows 95 Autoload, an uninstaller, and a multimedia demo.




What's funny? Yeah, what makes us laugh? Most of us know when something tickles our funny bone and we respond with anything from a subdued titter to a roaring guffaw. OK, some of us just laugh. But, whether you are a chuckler, a smiler or a chortler, I'm willing to bet you've never given any thought to why something is funny. You may or may not be able to tell a joke, but I'll guarantee you never tried to write one.

If you take a moment to consider what's funny, you will come up with some principals or techniques that make a statement laughable. *Comedy Writer* has done just this sort of analysis of humor and then applied the power of the computer to help you be funny. The folks at *ideascapes*, the company that brings us *Comedy Writer*, have applied six techniques for humor: substitution, surprise, exaggeration, shock, understatement and the "play-on-words." When you consider "what's funny?" those are pretty accurate descriptors of what Jay Leno or David Letterman do each night to make us grin rather than groan.

Comedy Writer employs lists on all sorts of topics which can be randomly combined in a variety of situations to provide hopefully humorous outcomes. The computer is used as a group of joke-writers sitting around a conference table brainstorming tonight's monologue. You can start with an idea, a scene, a person, or, if you are suffering from writer's block, with a blank sheet of paper. From your start point, the computer will deluge you with ideas which usually will trigger more ideas which you can sort to build the type of humor that appeals to your audience. Some of it is drivel, but some combinations are hilarious.

Let's say you want material about fishing. You start with the "idea" screen and the only thing you can think of: "What if you went fishing and caught..." The program will then let you choose from 65 lists of topics ranging from animals to attitudes, from movie titles to historical events, from tools to titles. Select one and click on "random", and the program will insert selections from the list. I selected "beliefs" and got "What if you went fishing and caught heroic Roman legends?"



The concept, of course, is ludicrous—but isn't that the beginning of funny? So I went to the "idea build" screen with my initial statement and added, "and it made you want to.." then selected "hobbies" from the list and wound up with. "What if you went fishing and caught a belief in heroic Roman legends and it made you want to raise poisonous reptiles?" Well, I'm not sure I've got a real thigh-slapper here yet, but, wait a second...what if, instead of going fishing myself, I created a character who went fishing? (Which is, the very essence of the concept of *Comedy Writer*, the genesis of creativity—a trigger of new ideas.)

So, I selected the "person" screen and with just a few clicks on the "random" button I had a profile of my fisherman. He was Robin Williams who spoke in bureaucratese, ate mushrooms, believed in Zen Buddhism, wore polyester and had at least a dozen other computer generated random attributes. Actually, the personality, when I thought about it, was beginning to get funny. I knew his favorite movie, TV show, cliché, habit, hobby, story, musician, and his hot issue de jour. There was enough to build on.

In the absence of a start point for a humor situation, I could have selected from the "ideas" screen a start point for something funny. I tried "AM drivel" and got "what if I was a talk show host with [attitude], who wanted to discuss [hobby]. All I needed to do then, was click on "random" and get, "what if I was a talk show host with an inferiority complex who wanted to discuss tai kwan do." A little massaging and editing, and I've got a concept with potential for a giggle. There are numerous joke formats and scenarios, certain to trigger the creative juices and fit the occasion.

Another method of developing a humorous situation is the "scene" form. Here, the

computer will insert random elements into a form to provide the three parameters for a scene: character, location and environment. *Comedy Writer* provides a character age, occupation, name and attitude. Then the program suggests an event at a location during a certain kind of weather at a given time. All parameters change each time random is selected or you can lock in particular parameters to develop a situation. When you get a scene you think is funny, you can then proceed to develop it further with the ideas screens. One scene I generated was: a 72 yr. old State Farm Insurance president named Elvis attending a coming-out party in Bangladesh during an ice storm. Well, it's an unlikely combination, but I could keep the old insurance guy named Elvis and work on the event a little bit. I think there's potential here.

Comedy Writer offers an "idea/search" form which allows you to quickly scan through a list for possible related words. When you are stuck for inspiration, **Comedy Writer** provides "partner", an eccentric second banana who will provide you with lead lines that have a humorous setting and allow you the opportunity to develop the punch line and get the rimshot....ba-dump-dump... First try with partner: "Has anyone ever told you that you resemble a young Barry Goldwater." My response, "No, I thought I was more an older Macauly Culkin"...ba-dump!

You don't have to be a standup comic to benefit from *Comedy Writer*. If you need to do public speaking, a funny concept can never hurt. If you are engaged in creative pursuits such as art, design, marketing, advertising, or writing, *Comedy Writer* can give your creativity a needed nudge. Consider building your next party around *Comedy Writer* instead of a bottle of Mazola oil and a game of Twister. Just randomize a scene and let everyone build a character to populate the scene...then force the folks to adopt the personality of their character for the remainder of the night. Ahhh, the possibilities for disgusting behavior are endless.

Disclaimer and Cautionary Statement (our lawyers made us say this): This program was reviewed by Ed Rasimus, retired fighter pilot and self-styled humorist. If you don't think he's funny, he'll bomb you back into the Stone Age—that means your Web browser won't work and you'll have to get your e-mail from a UNIX server. Just so you can't say we didn't warn you.



Psssst. Wanna buy 8 MB of RAM for \$29.95? No, it's not black market stuff — it's black magic stuff. Actually, it's called **SoftRAM95** from Syncronys Software. You're familiar with disk compression, right? You know: Stacker, Doublespace, Drivespace, etc. You compress the data on your hard drive and get double the space? Take that same idea and apply it to your data while it's still in memory. Viola! Double your RAM.

RAM doubling software works differently and in one or more areas of memory. Some versions compress the data in the systems resources area (which are those 64 KB chunks of memory that you always run out of in Windows 3.x). Others compress the virtual memory that Windows 3.x writes to an uncompressed portion of the hard drive. Windows 95 itself seems to eliminate those problems by increasing the systems resources and allowing virtual memory to be written to a compressed drive. The one remaining area, therefore, is hard RAM and that is where **SoftRAM95** works. Syncronys uses what it calls "...patent pending RAM compression technology..." Perhaps it is best explained by a quote from their README file:

"386 and higher processors have special purpose hardware that supports a demand-paged virtual memory system based on a linear address space accessed via 32 bit address. A demand-paged virtual memory system allows Windows to allocate more memory than the PC physically contains. SoftRAM95 takes advantage of this special hardware and creates additional RAM by dynamically compressing the contents in HardRAM. This is achieved through a series of high performance compression methods. SoftRAM95As unique RAM Analyst continually reviews the memory requirements of all your applications and pre-calculates the most efficient compression method for each page of memory. SoftRAM95 also defragments memory in real-time to provide more contiguous memory. In sum, SoftRAM95 makes more RAM available to your applications and data.


SoftRAM95 creates additional linear address space to maintain its RAM and then redirects the page-fault interrupt pointer to its own page-fault manager which then processes the page-fault according to its type. SoftRAM95 is different than DOS Memory Managers which typically optimize the DOS memory below 1 MB. In contrast, SoftRAM95 actually creates additional memory through compression."

I tried **SoftRAM95** because it was especially written for Windows 95. It also works with Windows 3.x, but don't try it with NT or OS/2 emulators. One floppy disk and 15 minutes later, you're in business, and most of that time is waiting for Windows to reboot. Use the *Add new program* routine in the Control Panel and just follow the Setup Wizard. The only change I can see is a new program in my Startup folder. Like any other Windows 95 program, it puts its info into the System Registry. No dip switches to set; no INI files to tinker with; no hardware to install. This is even easier than Plug 'N Play!

You get a 2-second logo at startup that lets you know SoftRAM95 is loaded. After that, you can't tell it's there, and it needs only about 1 MB on your hard drive.

SoftRAM95 works flawlessly with both my new Pentium 60 with 8 MB and an old 486DX33 with 16 MB. It was obvious to me that Windows 95 ran better on the older system, so I concluded that RAM made a bigger difference than processor. Having bought Windows 95,

however, my pocketbook was virtually uninhabited. The thought of paying another \$350-\$400 for 8 MB more RAM was not pleasant. At \$29.95 (sale price), I thought it was worth a chance. Cheapest RAM I ever bought! Even when I do add more RAM, **SoftRAM95** will provide the effect of increasing it, although you don't get the doubling benefits after 32 MB.



You can pop up a control panel that displays your current settings and gives you several options. The odometer-style gauge shows the amount of hard RAM, the amount of additional RAM provided by **SoftRAM95**, the amount of virtual RAM provided by Windows 95 and a total amount. On both my systems, Windows 95 likes between 40 and 50 MB total with the difference being made up with virtual memory.

You can adjust the amount of memory **SoftRAM95** uses although I'm not sure why I would want it at less than 100%. You can enable and disable it from here and set it to maximize RAM or system speed. If you want to watch the numbers spin as you open and close applications, you can keep the panel visible at all times.

Thusfar I've had no incompatibilities with any software I'm running. At any given time, I'm likely to be running my e-mail program, WordPerfect, ProComm Plus, Quicken, various internet browsers and assorted bricbrac. I haven't seen any problems with anything yet.

They load faster, run faster, switch faster. I can have, say, Program A, Program B and Program C running together. The first couple of times I switch between A and B, I get some hard drive activity as virtual memory is being used. As I work with A and B (and switch between them), **SoftRAM95's** RAM AnalystTM optimizes the memory (i.e., puts the more active programs into RAM and leaves the inactive programs out on the hard drive in virtual memory). After a few switches back and forth, there is no more hard drive activity. A and B appear to be

fully in RAM and the switching is instantaneous.

Syncronys does include an uninstall routine, though, which I like. If I ever think it's causing a problem, I can easily remove it and see if the problem remains.

The software package comes with a small printed manual. As far as I can tell, the online help is a verbatim copy. I like to read the manual before I install software so I'm comfortable with what the software is supposedly is going to do. I also like having the manual online after I install it because I know I'm going to misplace the printed manual. (Only Wolly can still find the manual for every piece of software he's ever installed.) If you have problems and the troubleshooting hints don't work, a toll-free number is provided.

While popular opinion may tell you that you can't get something for nothing, I have not found any negatives using this software, and I sure have seen a lot of benefits in my particular situation.




ALTEC LANSING MULTIMEDIA ACS500

As I wandered through the din of this summer's New York edition of PC Expo, I returned to one booth several times. Altec Lansing was exhibiting their newest entry into the PC speaker arena, and definitely raising the standards of the genre. Their new product, the **Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500**, is a three piece computer surround sound speaker *system*, complete with an integrated Dolby® Pro-Logic decoder. They were demonstrating these units using a movie soundtrack with incredible results. While it was difficult to hear with all the extraneous noise in the huge exhibit hall, there was no doubt that these speakers were something very special.

As I noted in my last PC speaker review, I am picky about my computer and other sound systems. While still not claiming the title of audiophile, my background in live and recorded music and sound has made me a discriminating listener, or at least a fussy one. The WinOnLine ReviewTM has no labs for measuring response curves; we don't claim to be *Stereophile*, *Audio*, or even *Stereo Review*. We do, however, have golden ears and a critical nature (please note that a wide grin accompanies this statement). To keep the suspense at a minimum, rest assured that the **Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500** system quickly became the permanent replacement for my beloved Marantz 2230/two-way bookself speaker (6.5 inch woofer/dome tweeter) combination that originally accompanied my PC. This new Altec Lansing speaker system is *extraordinary*.





The physical design of the ACS500 satellite towers is at once unobtrusive and quite attractive, yet evidently designed for the proper sonic effect. The inner surfaces of the eighteen inch tall units are nearly flat, designed for placement alongside your monitor. The tower's drivers are all magnetically shielded to prevent screen distortion. The lower half contains the primary drivers: a 3 inch mid-bass speaker and .5 inch dome tweeter, facing forward. The top section is aimed inward at a gentle angle; at its base is a 1.25 x 2.5 inch full range driver designated for the center channel signal. The outside of this attractively sculptured tower is gently curved towards the front, and a second 3 inch mid-bass speaker occupies the upper portion, aimed at roughly a 20 degree angle, handling the surround sound duties. Their modest footprint is approximately 6.5 inches deep and 5 inches at their widest point. This illustration best shows their shape; another later in this article better indicates driver placement within each tower.

The subwoofer is a heavy, impressive behemoth, measuring 13W x 10D x 6.5H inches. The single 6.5 inch driver fires upward, with a pair of ports on one end as shown in the illustration above. While there is a convenient level control on the main control satellite, there is a second volume knob on the subwoofer itself.


Published specifications from the ACS500 manual are as follows. Our subjective testing by several pairs of "golden ears" largely agreed with the stated frequency response; it falls off rapidly below 35Hz or so, but is amazingly strong above that point. Since the low E string on a bass is at 42Hz, we are most impressed.

Audiophiles might argue that the crossover to the subwoofer is quite high; in most cases, 100Hz is more appropriate so that the unit cannot be localized. The idea behind subwoofers is to have them augment the satellite speaker's response without being aurally detectable. However,

due to the placement and the modest distance between the listener and the main satellites, this did not prove to be a valid concern; I could not "find" the subwoofer with my ears. Close-up listening to the unit makes me wonder whether the crossover frequency is, in fact, actually that high. The subwoofer does its job admirably; rotating the level control from cut to full shows how it fills out the audio spectrum, just as intended. This system is designed for accurate reproduction; it is neither boomy nor obvious. Regardless of the automobile aftermarket's latest emphasis, sub-woofers were invented long before rap music and were originally intended to extend bass response, not rattle teeth.

Hooking up the **Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500** system doesn't require an engineering degree, and the assembly illustrations are clear, resulting in a minimum of dangling wires. The subwoofer receives its AC power from a standard line cord and feeds the satellites their power. A single cable terminated with a both a 9 volt power connector and a 3.5mm phone plug delivers current to the main satellite speaker and returns the bass frequencies to the subwoofer's built-in amplifier. The right satellite speaker provides power and input to the left through a single DIN-terminated cable, and also accepts the standard 3.5mm stereo phone plug from your audio card's output, resulting in a neat, clutter-free install. An 800 number is provided for immediate technical assistance, should it be required.




The rear panel of the right satellite includes an output jack for each of the Dolby® Pro-Logic circuits: L-R Stereo, Surround Sound, Center Channel, and Sub-Woofer (used for the system unit). These auxiliary outputs could be used in the generally unlikely event that you'd want to use external amplifiers and speakers. The documentation states that the internal amplifiers are disabled by their use, but the Surround Sound output is powered for driving external speakers, if desired. A second, parallel input is also offered. This could accommodate a variety of inputs, including a microphone mixer for using the system for a presentation. Separate level controls are not provided for each input. Three pushbuttons also populate the rear panel: power, a pink-noise generator to assist in balancing the system, and one to toggle between Stereo and Pro-Logic. We'll talk about its effect later. The front panel includes a pilot light and four level controls for the master center, surround, and sub-woofer volumes.

The manual suggests locating the subwoofer under your desk. Speaker placement for the satellites is unaddressed and obvious: alongside your monitor. However, this brings forth my slight disagreement with one aspect of the **ACS500's** design. Desktop positioning places the center line of the tweeters at 6.6 inches from the desk surface. Ear level is approximately 16

inches in my particular situation, with my chair adjusted for the height of my 17 inch monitor. The 24 inch distance from the speakers puts me just on the edge of what I perceive as the tweeters' "sweet spot." The illustration from the manual below shows what I would consider a good listening position in relation to the speakers. The problem is, achieving it would require placing your chin on the desk. However, in actual practice, high frequencies are still crisp and sufficient in most cases; I perhaps this is just my own fussy little preference. After all, the alignment is perfect for my stepson's *teenage game-playing slouch*.

The designer of the **Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500** responded to my comment, stating that the 30 degree dispersion pattern (from the centerpoint) of the tweeter provided sufficient coverage of the signal to the listener. I agree that the high frequency response from the tweeters is sufficient; my 'tweaker' nature, however, may someday cause me to try to figure a way to elevate the speakers a few inches to experience the effect of the placement. But it's nothing I'm obsessing over.

While installation and each control are addressed, there is minimal documentation explaining the practical use of the ACS500 system and the potential use of its various rear output jacks. It also makes the assumption that the buyer knows what Dolby Pro-Logic is and how and when to use it. This fine audio encoding system was born for movies and multimedia and is gaining fast in the movie world. If you are curious to know more, I suggest you visit the fine Dolby World Wide Web site I found at http://www.dolby.com/ht/ds&pl/ds&dspl.html and see the wide variety of media and equipment that has adopted this technology.

A representative from Altec Lansing readily admitted that you can't find a lot of computer titles that are Dolby® Pro-Logic encoded on the shelves of your local stores, and they could be accused of being "ahead of the curve." Regardless, the sonic superiority of this system is remarkable, with or without the Dolby® Pro-Logic circuitry. The system is gaining in popularity and increasing its licenses, so more material for the PC will no doubt be issued soon.

Listening is the true test, isn't it? The **Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500** passes with flying colors and then some. This is an extraordinary speaker *system*, with depth and clean power that surpasses anything that I've seen described as computer speakers. Highs are clear and mostly crisp, and the mid and low bass delivers the physical impact you expect from a more highly

powered system, without flabbiness. This is a tight, well balanced, accurate speaker system.

The Dolby® Pro-Logic produces different effects depending on the program material. I wish its pushbutton was placed on the front of the system, since its use will likely not be constant in most cases. Engaged, the main vocal on some audio CDs fades into the background, and could not sufficiently be retrieved even by increasing the level of the center channel. However, in some cases the effect was positively dramatic, especially with some instrumental music. Properly Dolby® Pro-Logic encoded material brings remarkable results. So did a digital recording of a cathedral organ — if you could hear the clean power and depth of the bass response, and the soundstage that the system delivered, you would never again refer to them as mere "PC speakers." Again, our "golden ears" group agreed that the overall response of the system was incredibly without any significant dips or bumps.

The resident slouching teenager, mentioned above, was visibly impressed with the sound from some of his games. My only challenge now is hearing the TV over the roar of the motorcycles in the next room.

We auditioned the speaker system on a computer equipped with a Soundblaster AWE-32. WAV files were reproduced flawlessly, and reproduction of the wavetable synthesized instruments, ensembles, and effects was excellent. If you want one of the finest sound systems designed for use with a personal computer, you will be delighted with your purchase of the Altec Lansing Multimedia ACS500 Surround Sound Computer System with Dolby® Pro-Logic.



IMAGEPAD GRAPHICS TABLET

a review by Bob Gollihu

Long before the keyboard was ever conceived, we primitives scratched our glyphs into rock, onto papyrus, and probably into the trees that framed our prehistoric lavatories. The urge remains; the keyboard is hardly an artistically creative tool, unless you dip it into a bucket of paint and splatter the remainder all over a nearby canvas (hmmm... maybe I *do* have a future in art).

Drawing with a mouse is like writing your name with a blackboard eraser. Have you ever tried it? Makes even the worst artists (present company included) look even more inept. Enter the graphics tablet.



Info Products delivers a inexpensive tablet with a great bundle of software. The ImagePadTM Graphics Tablet is a compact 1000 lpi (lines per inch) resolution device with a six inch square active area. The stylus, which feels very comfortable in the hand, is wired to the unit. Setting up the unit is simple, although it does add slightly to the rat's nest at the back of your computer. Requiring an open serial port, its connector includes a power jack that runs to male and female DIN connectors to plug into your keyboard jack and into which you plug your keyboard — it reads more complicated than it actually is. It is in this manner that the unit receives its power, so it doesn't add more cables or require another AC receptacle. Also provided are adaptors for PS/2 keyboards and 25 to 9 pin serial connectors in order to accommodate most installations.

The installation program supplied did not work in Windows 95, although Info Products promptly sent me a beta of their updated installation program disk. The technical support folks responded to my fax within an hour, and I did not have to identify myself as a reviewer to get quick and competent service. While the new utility disk for Windows 95 was not 100% perfect, it did result in a successful install in minutes. If you purchase a unit without the newest drivers, contact Info Products for assistance. Drivers included on the original utility disk provides support for many environments.





The ImagePadTM Graphics Tablet I tested was bundled with two pieces of software, one for graphics, and a most unique program, aha! InkWriter. The program does not do handwriting recognition, rather it is a handwriting word processor. The fascinating program allows a mix of keyboard entry and handwriting, and you can select portions of your handwritten text to select and move, delete, embolden, colorize, etc., and will automatically wrap your writing. It apparently treats each as an individual graphic segment, so it is important that sufficient space be left between words if you want to access and handle them.



There are many options within the program, to widen the line spacing as well as select the color of ink, width of impression, and "paper" colors. Drawings can be created and moved around within your work. The **aha! InkWriter** will import and export text and graphics directly or using the Windows Clipboard facility. You can even fax and e-mail directly from the program. In short, it is, in fact, a **handwriting word processor**, just as they say. The publisher, aha!, has a freely distributable viewer for output from the program, so I can send message in my bad handwriting and friends can view it, although not necessarily be able to read it.

Also bundled with this version of the **ImagePadTM Graphics Tablet** is GST Software's **1st Design,** a simple but competent graphics program. It's a good fit with the graphics tablet and offers a wide range of capabilities. The program actually includes features such as autotracing, graduated fills, rotations, etc. While it's no substitute for a high-end graphics package, it should be quite sufficient for many users who don't need a disk-clogger with a steep learning curve.



The pad itself is attractive and compact. Approximately nine by ten inches, it is only a half inch at it highest point, and it tapers down towards rounded corners. The stylus cable is thin, light, and flexible, and more than two feet long.

At present, my installation has the tablet co-existing with my Microsoft Mouse drivers in Windows 95, allowing me to use either as a mouse or drawing device, attached to COM1 and COM2. The ability to quickly use either for whichever purpose that suits me at any moment is very convenient. I can readily recommend the **ImagePadTM Graphics Tablet** for graphics and general use, especially in view of its low price tag.




