Using the buttons.

There are two buttons in regular mode, but several in casino mode.

Regular mode. The buttons in regular mode are reused throughout the game.

- 1. Left button: This button changes at each stage of the game.
 - a. When the game is over this button is used to deal the cards.
- b. After the deal this button is used to draw new cards. Choose which cards to DISCARD first.
- c. If a double-up machine is being used and the hand was a winner, this button is used to double-up.
- d. If double-up was chosen, this button is used to tell the computer to pick one of the four remaining cards.
- 2. Right button: This button changes at each stage of the game.
 - a. When the game is over this button is used to change the bet from 1 to 5 coins.
 - b. After the deal this button is used to reject all the cards in a bad hand.
- c. If a double-up machine is being used and the hand was a winner, this button is used stop doubling up.
- d. If double-up was chosen, this button is used to see if one has a chance to win this double-up round.

Casino mode. Each button serves its own purpose.

- 1. The five discard buttons are used to flip the cards over.
- 2. The cash out button is used to convert your credits back to cash.
- 3. The bet one button is used to bet one credit.
- 4. The insert button is used to insert a coin into the machine.
- 5. The play max button is used to bet five credits and deal the cards.
- 6. The deal/draw button is used to deal out cards and draw new ones.

How does the jackpot grow?

The jackpot goes up one coin for every coin that is played on the machine. That is a 100% payback, so go for the royal flush!

Using the menus.

Using the file menu.

- 1. Reset Stats will reset all stats to zero. Only use this if you want to erase all records of play.
- 2. Preferences allows one to select special options.
- 3. Get more cash brings up a box with squares numbered 1 to 20. If you are down to your last dollar, then pick a square and win the amount under it. Good luck!
- 4. Exit takes back to Windows.

Differences between casino and regular mode.

- 1. Statistics: More stats are shown in regular mode.
- 2. Buttons: The buttons are like the game machines in casino mode. There are just two buttons in regular mode.
- 3. Display: The current payoff display is highlighted in casino mode. Just the current payoff table is displayed in regular mode.
- 4. Credits: Credits are only used in casino mode.

Using the mouse.

The mouse is used on menus and buttons, but can also be used to flip the cards directly. Click right on the card to flip it over.

Preferences.

One can choose the machine and other prefs here.

- 1. Card back: The card back can be chosen here. There are eight to choose from.
- 2. Denomination: The money denomination of the machine can be chosen here. Bet from a dime to \$100.
- 3. Game: Pick which type of game to play here. There are different rules and payoff tables for each one. (registered version only)
- 4. Preferences: Turn sounds on and off and choose between casino and regular modes.
- 5. Machine: Pick double-up and progressive machines here.

Stats that are saved.

Several statistics are saved to disk everytime you play each machine.

- 1. All win and loss types.
- 2. Double up wins, losses and ties in double up machines.
- 3. The amount of games played.
- 4. The credits in casino mode.
- 5. The coins-in in casino mode.
- 6. The last hand dealt.
- 7. The total of all ranks dealt in double-up machines.
- 8. Losing streak.
- 9. The jackpot in progressive machines.
- 10. The cash on hand.
- 11. The Last amount won.
- 12. The last type of win.

Keep those sounds going.

To keep the game running as smoothly and as fast as possible in a multitasking environment, the sounds are used as delays in some parts of the game. If the sounds are turned off, the game may run too fast.

There are stats all over the screen!

Read this to figure out what the stats mean.

Casino mode:

- 1. The money amount in the upper left corner is the denomination of the machine.
- 2. Coins-in is the amount of coins inserted for the next deal.
- 3. Credits is how many coins that have been won. You can cash these out back into cash.
- 4. The type of game is indicated at the top right.
- 5. In double-up machines, Double for indicates the amount that can be won in the next double-up.
- 6. Winner paid tells how much was won.
- 7. The large print in the middle below the cards is the type of hand dealt or drawn.
- 8. Coins tells how many coins you have for the machine. This varies by denomination.

Regular mode:

- 1. The money amount in the upper middle is the denomination of the machine.
- 2. The type of game is indicated just below the denomination.
- 3. The large print in the middle below the cards is the type of hand dealt or drawn.
- 4. In double-up machines, Double for indicates the amount that can be won in the next double-up.
- 5. In double-up machines, the rank totals for the computer and player are tallied up in the lower right corner.
- 6. The recorded stats are on the top left and top right.
