Introduction

Welcome to **Help to Text**, a program that converts Windows .HLP files into text files that can be edited using any editor or Word Processor. This program is not crippled in any way. It is fully functional and has no time limits or restrictions of any kind. All we ask is that if you like the program and find it useful, then fill out the order form in the "Order Form" Help screen.

There are three major reasons why this program can be useful to most Windows users.

1. The current trend in Windows software is to give minimal paper documentation when selling a product. Most of the effort is put into online help, much of which is inside a .HLP file. **Help to Text** will convert these .HLP files into text files. You can then edit the text file to your liking and print it. This process gives you your own copy of the program's documentation.

2. Many times I've found a Help file's keyword search to be useless. The keywords the programmer felt were important, were not the keywords I want to look for. Or I know that the word I'm looking for is on one of the help screens but I can't remember which one. Using **Help to Text** to create a text file, you can search the text file for ANY word or phrase you want. A MUCH more useful tool than the Help Keyword Search.

3. Should you decide you want to print out a help screen exactly as it appears on your screen, you can do that by selecting the the Print Topic menu item. However if you want to print out all, or a range of help screens, the Windows Help processor won't let you do that, **Help to Text** will.

We're confident you will find many more ways to make **Help to Text** useful for you. We have already begun enhancing the software for the next release, and all registered users will be informed of the new release as soon as it comes out.

Help file selection To select the help file (.HLP) you want to convert or print, press this button. A dialog box will be displayed and you can choose any help file in any directory.

If you are converting to text, you need to select a <u>text file</u> also. If you are <u>printing</u> the helps, it is not necessary to select a text file.

Text file selection

When converting a help file to a text file, you need to specify the name of the output text file. Pressing this button will bring up a dialog box that will let you select the text file name and directory path.

If you are printing the helps, it is not necessary to select a text file.

Text output When selecting text output, the converted help file will be written to the <u>Text File</u> you selected. The other option is to <u>print</u> the help file.

Printer output When printing the help screens, the helps are not converted. They are printed exactly as they appear on your screen. The other option is <u>Text Output</u>. The converted help file will be written to the <u>Text File</u> you selected.

Start range

Help screens appear sequentially inside a help file. A range of helps can be converted or printed by specifying a Start range and an <u>End range</u>. If the Start range is left blank, it is the same as starting at the first help screen. If the End range is left blank, it's the same as ending at the last help screen.

To determine what number each help screen is, convert the help file to a text file. Each help screen will be separated in the text file by a header similar to "...... Topic 0" (help screens are called Topics inside a help file). Find the Topic numbers for the help screens you want to print or convert, and use them for the Start and End ranges

End range

Help screens appear sequentially inside a help file. A range of helps can be converted or printed by specifying a <u>Start range</u> and an End range. If the Start range is left blank, it is the same as starting at the first help screen. If the End range is left blank, it's the same as ending at the last help screen.

To determine what number each help screen is, convert the help file to a text file. Each help screen will be separated in the text file by a header similar to "...... Topic 0" (help screens are called Topics inside a help file). Find the Topic numbers for the help screens you want to print or convert, and use them for the Start and End ranges

Status

The status field is used to display various status and help information. You'll notice that whenever your cursor is moved over a field or button on the screen, a help description is displayed in the status field.

Progress information is also displayed here. When the conversion is being performed, the current help screen number is shown.

The right section of the status line contains the name of the <u>Viewer</u> you selected to display the output text files.

Start

This button starts the conversion or printing process. Press it after you've selected your help file to convert. If you're not <u>printing</u>, but going to a text file. select the <u>text file</u> before pressing Start. Also if you want to convert or print a range of help topics, enter the <u>Start and End</u> range numbers before pressing this button.

Cancel

This button ends Help to Text. Press it when you have no more converting or printing to do.

Stop

Some help files are very large and can take a long time to convert or print. While the help file is being processed, you may decide that you want to stop it and continue later. Pressing the Stop button will end the conversion or printing. If you were going to a text file, the file contains the helps that were converted. To continue at a later date, look in the file for the last topic converted and use that number as the <u>Start</u> range to pick up where you left off.

View text

After a text file is created you will want to look at it. Pressing the View text button will open your <u>viewer</u> and read in the file. The Viewer can be any editor, or Word Processor.

Configure viewer

Configure viewer lets you select the program to use for viewing or editing your converted help files. After a help file has been converted to a text file, the first thing you're going to want to do is look at the file by pressing the button <u>View text</u>. The program you selected to use as a viewer will be executed and will display the file created by **Help to Text**.

The default viewer for **Help to Text** is the Windows program NOTEPAD.EXE. NOTEPAD has very limited capabilities since it can only read files that are less than 64K long. Large .HLP files convert to text files MUCH larger than that, and NOTEPAD won't be able to read them.

When you press the Configure viewer button, select the program you want to use as a viewer.

Quick start

Here's the basics on using **Help to Text.** We are going to show the steps to convert HLPTXT.HLP into HLPTXT.TXT

1. Press the button <u>Help file</u>. Select the file HLPTXT.HLP from the list box and press OK.

- 2. Press the button <u>Text file</u>. Type in the name HLPTXT.TXT and press OK.
- 3. Press the button Start.
- 4. When the message tells you the conversion process has completed, press the button View text.

That's it!! The conversion is done, and the file HLPTXT.TXT contains the text ready for your editing or printing.
