## Introduction

Very Little Bob Help File will give you an overview of all commands available to send one or more keystrokes to the active program.

## Syntax

Your\_Program @ List\_Of\_Command

EX. :

- Starting Application (application is not already loaded) :
- c:\excel\excel.exe @ %FN where %=ALT, F=File and N=New (open new file).
- d:\word\word.exe c:\doc\test.doc @ {TAB}this is new where {TAB}=TAB, "This is new" is your text.
- Sending Keys to Other Applications (application is already loaded) :
- Microsoft Excel @ %FN where %=ALT, F=File and N=New (open new file).
- Microsoft Word c:\doc\test.doc @ {TAB}this is new where {TAB}=TAB, "This is new" is your text.

## **Commands Reference**

ALT ----> % SHIFT ----> + CONTROL ----> ^

For example, to have the Shift key held down while V and L are pressed, use "+(VL)". To have Shift held down while V is pressed, followed by L being pressed without Shift, use "+VL".

To specify repeating keys, use the form {key number}; you must put a space between key and number. For example, {RIGHT 42} means press the Left Arrow key 42 times; {b 10} means press b 10 times.

Sendkeys also can't send the Print Screen (PRTSC) key to any application.
