Overview

TILER is a Windows NT and Windows 95 application that views and manages GIF, JPEG and Windows BMP image files. Both the "87a" and "89a" versions of GIF are supported. If a GIF file contains more than one image, TILER will only load the first image. TILER can read 1, 4, 8 and 24 bit Windows BMP files; both 4-bit and 8-bit compression is supported.

Image files that are added to TILER are stored in a document as thumbnail images. These thumbnail images are tiled in a window for easy access and quick viewing. Since these thumbnail images can take a lot of time to generate, TILER allows you to save all of the thumbnail images in a document to a file. This file can then be opened at a later time much faster than reloading each image.

Requirements

- Windows NT 3.51 or Windows 95. If your running an earlier version of NT, TILER versions 1.2.1 and earlier do not require version 3.51.
- A video graphics mode with at least 32,000 simultaneous colors.
- Lots of image files.
- A Windows compatible sound board is optional.
- Loading lots of images can take a lot of memory. The more memory your computer has, the better TILER will perform. If you experience memory problems, try shrinking the size of the tiled images.

Windows NT Installation

To install TILER, place all of the files in the ZIP file in the same directory except for CTL3D32.DLL, place it in your SYSTEM32 directory. If there is already a file named CTL3D32.DLL in that directory, use whichever is the latest version. To check the version number, select the file in FileManager and press ALT-ENTER. TILER requires version 2.26 or later.

If you don't have a sound board, you can turn sound off in the "Options" dialog box and delete the WAV files.

Windows 95 Installation

To install TILER, place all of the files in the ZIP file in the same directory except for CTL3D32.DLL, you should delete this file.

TILER is Shareware. You are permitted to use and evaluate TILER for 3 weeks. After the 3 week evaluation period, you must either erase your copy of TILER or register. To register, either send a check or money order for \$25 to:

Version History

- v1.2.3 10/8/95
- Fix directory selection. It would never work under Windows 95 and would not work with more than just a few files under Windows NT (broken by version 1.2.2).
 - New directory browsing dialog. Very Windows95'ish.
 - TILER now remembers its last screen location.
- Fixed problem of not being able to bring TILER to foreground during image read after having been put into background while loading the image.

- Can remove the file extension from image names to save screen space. (See the Options dialog box.)
 - Fixed Windows 95 problems.
 - Added progress bars while loading images.
 - TILER now requires either Windows 95 or Windows NT v3.51.

- GIF image files with more image data in them than there should be will no longer crash the application.
- JPEG file reading is about 34% faster and makes lower memory demands on the system.
