# Bali TOOLS

## Description :

Use the mouse on programm icon (Exit door) to :

- Quit Windows if you double click with the left button
- Restart Windows if you double click with the right button
- Temporary Inhibit the [screensaver](#) if you click with the left button

Use the mouse on date icon to :

- Call setup dialog if you click with the left button
- Start the task you setup in the Desk parameters if you click with the right button

With this dialog, you may :

- Compute using the [calculator](#)
- Query your [mailboxes](#) right now, or automatically
- Manage a [phone book and "to do" list](#)
- Modify the desktop [wallpaper](#) right now, or automatically
- [Launch applications](#) directly from the tray area
- Count how much [time you spend in a particular task](#)
- [Inform your friends](#) that you are on line

**If you have a sound card, the time will be announced every half an hour.**



# Bali TOOLS

## Bali MEMO phone book :

Bali TOOLS is accompanied by Bali MEMO (Windows 3.x or 95/NT). That software let you manage your contacts (Names, phones, and memo text), and your list of "things to do". Bali TOOLS may use automatically Bali MEMO.

Bali TOOLS let you visualize the phone list of Bali MEMO, and launch the application. It may also query the list of "things to do" to recall you automatically when necessary. Type a frequency of **0** if you don't wish to use This fonctionnality.

[Bali TOOLS will not recall you if the screen saver is active, or if you decided to make it inactive.](#)

To get a contact information card, right click on a name, and choose "Contact Information" in the popup menu.

## Using Bali MEMO :

Please read the Bali MEMO online help to get more informations.

The calculator let you compute simple processes (+ - \* / % ± memory).

You can use the keyboard or the mouse.

For instance, to compute the "all taxes included" of 1082.35, type in :

**1082.35\*20.6%+**

To compute  $(256*12)+(150/3)$ , type in :

**256\*12=M 150/3=M R**

To compute  $(256/16)-(48*12)$ , type in :

**256/16=M 48\*12=SM R**

**To be able to use the Email functionality,  
your computer must be able to access Internet.**

Click on **[Email]** to launch your favorite Email application.

Type in a frequency if you want Bali TOOLS to query automatically your mailboxes, otherwise type in **0**.

If you've got some mails in your mailboxes, Bali TOOLS will list the authors and subjects, then announce it by voice (NEWMAIL.WAV) and change the icon on the tray area.

To load and visualize your messages, you may use your mail application. Or you may select them in the list, and right click with your mouse to display a popup menu, and then display or delete the selected messages. Messages using Base64 encoding method should be decoded. Any attached file will be in the message body.

Click on **[Query]** to query your mailboxes right now.

Of course, you have to define your server(s), user name(s) and password(s) by clicking on **[Setup]**.

Bali TOOLS will not query your mailboxes if the screensaver is active, or if you decided to make it inactive.

If, like me, you think that you have a lot of bitmaps that you would like to use as desktop wallpaper, and you want to change sometimes, Bali TOOLS is made for you ! Just group your bitmaps in a folder, and indicate that folder to Bali TOOLS by clicking on [\[Bitmap Folder\]](#). Then, choose a frequency to change the desktop wallpaper (or type in **0** if you don't want to use that functionality).

To change immediately the wallpaper, click on the button [\[Change\]](#).

[Bali TOOLS will not change the wallpaper if the screensaver is active, or if you decided to make it inactive.](#)

Bali TOOLS let you temporary inhibit the screensaver, which may be usefull if you don't want to be disturbed during a particular task. Click on the icon of Bali TOOLS to inhibit ou reactivate the screensaver. While inhibited, the icon is red.

Bali TOOLS will not query your mailboxes nor recall you the "things to do" or change the wallpaper while you inhibit the screensaver.



That functionality is checking the list of active tasks, to detect if there is one having the title you have defined. You may check for any task, but if you use the Email functionality, you should choose the task indicating that you are connected to Internet. It should be something like

**Connected to**

Like this, your time spent surfing on Internet will be counted, and Bali TOOLS will be able to detect if it is necessary to dial your provider or not while retrieving messages.

You may reset the meter (except during a detected connection).

The title of the task must have at least 5 chars.

## E-Mail setup :

Use this dialog to declare your mail application (the one used to read your messages), and to declare your account(s).

You may define 2 POP3 accounts.

Indicate for each account the server (something like "mailhost.provider.us"), your user name and your password.

Check the box on the bottom of the screen if you want to force Internet connection when Bali TOOLS automatically questions your mailbox (if there is no active connection at this time). If you don't check this box, and if no connection is active, Bali TOOLS will not query your mailbox automatically (but you can do it manually).

**Please note that Bali TOOLS detects an Internet connection using the [task listening](#) you have defined.**



# Bali TOOLS

## Internet mail checking :

### Interface with Windows remote access :

Bali TOOLS is trying to simplify your manipulations while querying your mailboxes. It is able to determine when you are connected, to press [Ok] button for you, to count spent time on Internet, ...

You are supposed to use a "Dialup" connection, with a modem or an ISDN card. We recommend that you install "Microsoft ISDN Pack 1.1" that you may download from the Microsoft site.

Bali TOOLS needs that you type in 2 strings (minimum 5 chars), using the "Internet" tab :

- The first one is necessary to [recognize the window opened when a connection is active](#). You should type in something like **Connected to** (depending on your Windows language). When a window's title contains that text, Bali TOOLS considers that a connection is active.
- The second one (at the bottom of the screen) should contain the exact title of the [window opened for you to type in your login and password](#) while connecting to Internet. This text might be **Connecting to**. If you type in this title, Bali TOOLS will be able to press the [Ok] button for you. That means that you must have recorded your password during a previous connection.

Once you have typed in those strings, Bali TOOLS may detect a connection, and then count the time you spend on Internet. You may visualize that time, reset the counter, and edit the log file which contains all connections since last reset.

If you check manually your mailboxes, and you are not connected, Bali TOOLS will establish a connection (type [Ok] alone), get your messages headers, and disconnect !

### Setting up your mail accounts :

In the "Mail" tab, click on the [Setup] button.

You have to indicate the path of your mail application, and your mail(s) account(s) reference(s) (you should indicate at least one).

- For instance, if your mail application is Microsoft Internet Mail, type in :  
**C:\WIN95\EXPLORER.EXE /root,C:\WIN95\Internet Mail.{89292102-4755-11cf-9DC2-00AA006C2B84}**

Replace the correct Windows path on your computer.

- Your server name must be something like : **mail.yourprovider.com**  
Your login and password are those your provider gave you.
- The check box at the bottom of the screen means, if checked, that Bali TOOLS should attempt to connect to Internet if no connection is active, while automatically querying your mailboxes. If not checked, and if you are not connected, your mails are not checked (they are checked only while connected).

From the "Desktop" tab, you may define some icons to display in the tray area (actually 12 icons may be defined).

A command must be a valid executable or a document, if Windows is able to find an association for that document. The Icon displayed in the tray area will be extracted from the file you indicate. The first icon of that file will be used, unless you specify another one by adding a comma and a number at the end of the file name.

Example : [C:\Windows 95\System\Shell32.DLL,5](#)

If you have defined at least one mail server and if that one is SMTP compatible (you may send messages using it), Bali TOOLS will be able to inform some of your friends using themselves Bali TOOLS, that you are on line. To send such messages, click on the round icon in the top left of the Bali TOOLS Window.



# Bali TOOLS

## Introduction :

Bali TOOLS needs Windows 95 or NT to function properly.

It adds two small icons in the tray notification area.

Here is what you can perform :

- Quit Windows directly
- Restart Windows
- Inhibit temporarily the screensaver
- Use a calculator
- **Query your mailboxes**
- Manage your phone numbers and "to do" list
- Change automatically your desktop wallpaper
- Launch applications or documents directly from the tray area using your defined icons
- Count how much time you spend in a particular task (for instance an Internet connection)
- Inform some of your friends that you are actually connected to Internet

The second icon is the day of the month.
