## Viewing the Map

Railroads are displayed as black lines on the map. The thicker lines represent railroad segments that have heavy traffic (over 40 megatons per mile per year). Lines which have been recently abandoned are represented by gray lines.

Information about railroad segments can be displayed by moving the mouse pointer crosshairs over a rail line (see [Railroad Information](#)).

To pan the map, place your mouse cursor on the map and move it while holding down the left mouse button.

To zoom in or out click on one of the Zoom buttons:

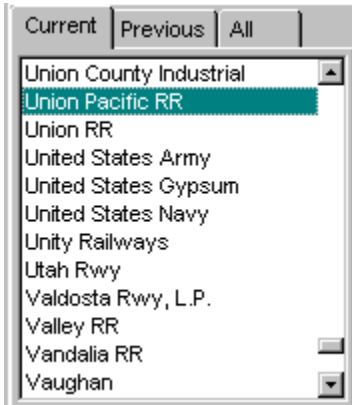

**Zoom an area**

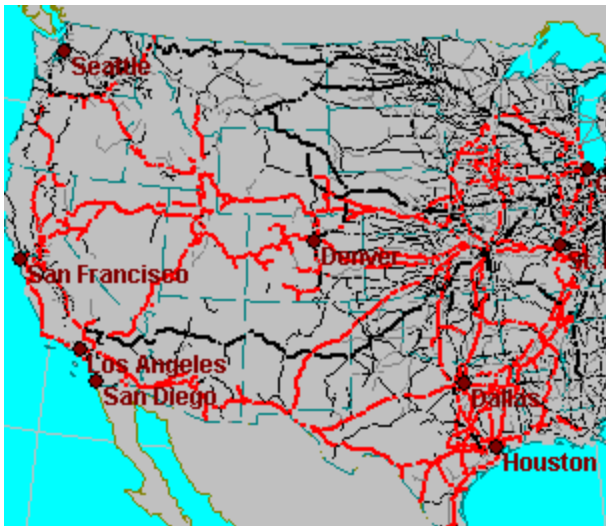
Place the mouse pointer on the map, hold down the right mouse button and drag the cursor to the right and down to draw a box around the area that you want to zoom in on.

### View a Railroad

The left panel includes three lists of railroads. The list can be selected by clicking on the tab above the list. "Current" includes railroads that the FRA lists as currently owning trackage (1999). "Previous" lists railroad companies that no longer exist, but once owned trackage, which appears on the map. "All" is a combination of both lists.



Select a railroad scrolling the list to the railroad you are seeking and then clicking on its name. The trackage owned by that railroad will be shown in red on the map. (Hint: you can speed up your search by typing the first letter of the railroad's name)



**Railroad Information**

As you move the mouse pointer cross hair across the map, information about the track segment under it will be displayed in the lower-left panel.

**Traffic Density**

Railroad freight traffic density is measured in millions of gross tons per mile per year (MGT). Here, it is displayed as a number from 0-7:

- 0 - less than 1 megaton, no traffic, unknown or abandoned
- 1 - 1.0 to 4.9 MGT
- 2 - 5.0 to 9.9 MGT
- 3 - 10.0 to 19.9 MGT
- 4 - 20.0 to 39.9 MGT
- 5 - 40.0 to 59.9 MGT
- 6 - 60.0 to 99.9 MGT
- 7 - Over 100 MGT

Note: the takeover of Conrail by Norfolk Southern and CSX will probably change the traffic density on many lines in the eastern United States.



**FRA classification**

The Federal Railroad Administration uses the following criteria to classify railroads:

Class 1 - Annual operating revenue greater than \$255.9 million

Class 2 - Annual operating revenue \$20.5 to \$255.9 million

Class 3 - Annual operating revenue less than \$20.5 million

**Signaling Types**

CTC - Centralized traffic Control

ABS - Automatic Block signal

ACS - Automatic Cab Signal

ATS - Automatic Train Stop

ATC - Automatic Train Control

MAN - Manual, including dark

TTO - Time Table / Train Order

Blank – unknown

**Abandonment Date**

Abandoned railroad segments are shown as light gray lines on the map. If the year of abandonment is known, this information is shown in the information panel.

**System Requirements**

## Operating System

Microsoft Windows 95/98/NT 4.0 or higher.

About 10 Megabytes of disk space.

Memory: 32 Meg or higher recommended.

When the program is started, it will check for available memory. If there is less than 32 megabytes available, a dialog box will appear and ask if you want to display the map with less detail. The low detail map does not show abandoned lines, urban boundaries, Canada and Mexico. If you have less than 32 megabytes available and find that the map display time is too slow, try using the "Reduced Data" option.
