

Report including Charts

There is no special chart support by FlexCel, but again, you just have to send the data to a list in Excel, and the charts will be upgraded to match it.

Concepts shown

- Charts might be difficult: Sometimes Excel goes out of its way guessing what you want to do and what are the cells you want to use. While this is very good in normal situations (Excel almost always gets it right), it gets difficult when you are trying to define a chart out of **##xx##** and **...delete row...** fields. So a nice trick is to write two rows of real data first, define the chart, and after that substitute the first row of real data with **##** fields and the second with a **...delete row...**
- Auto filter: This is a nice Excel feature you can use to filter the spreadsheet. Nothing special has to be done; this is automatically supported by Excel.
- Immobilizing panels: This is another Excel thing, handled without any particularities.
