General Program Operation File Cleaner

Upon launching File Cleaner Wizard the following window (Fig 1 – 1) will appear.

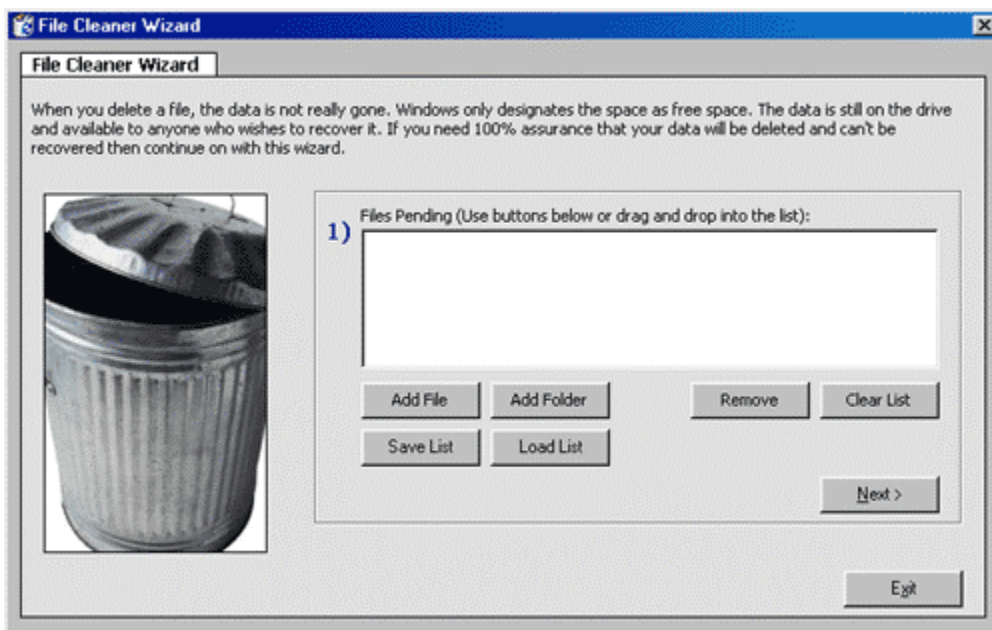

To begin removing sensitive files you must first add them to the “Files Pending” list. There are a few different ways to do this.

If you want to delete a single file:

- Click the Add File button. Select the file.
- Drag and Drop the file on to the Files Pending list

If you want to delete multiple files:

- Click the Add File button. Select multiple files while holding the 'Shift' or the 'Control' key.
- Drag and Drop the files on to the Files Pending list

If you want to delete an entire directory:

-Click on the Add Folder button. Select the folder.

If you find yourself deleting the same files over and over all the time you can create a List. Next time you need to delete the same files just load the list and you are all set.

To create a list, when all the files are listed in the Files Pending list click on Save List.

To use a previously made list, click on the Load List button and select the desired list.

If you add a file you didn't want to delete, select that file on the list and click Remove. If you want to empty out the whole list, click on Clear List.

Once you have selected the files you wish to delete click Next.

The following Window will come up (Fig 1 – 2)

At this point you can choose how thoroughly to delete the files. You have 3 choices.

Quick Wipe – This is the quickest but least secured method. This will overwrite the files 4 times with different character each time.

Department of Defense Method – This will overwrite the file 7 times with different strings. This is uses other measures as recommended by the DoD for their own computers.

Super Secure – This method is the most secure method but is also extremely slow. A total of at least 24 overwrites takes place.

Once you have decided upon the method of your choice click Next. A progress bar will appear. Wait for it to finish and your file are history.

General Program Operation Disk Cleaner

Sure Delete consists of two different utilities. This is the second of them, Disk Cleaner.

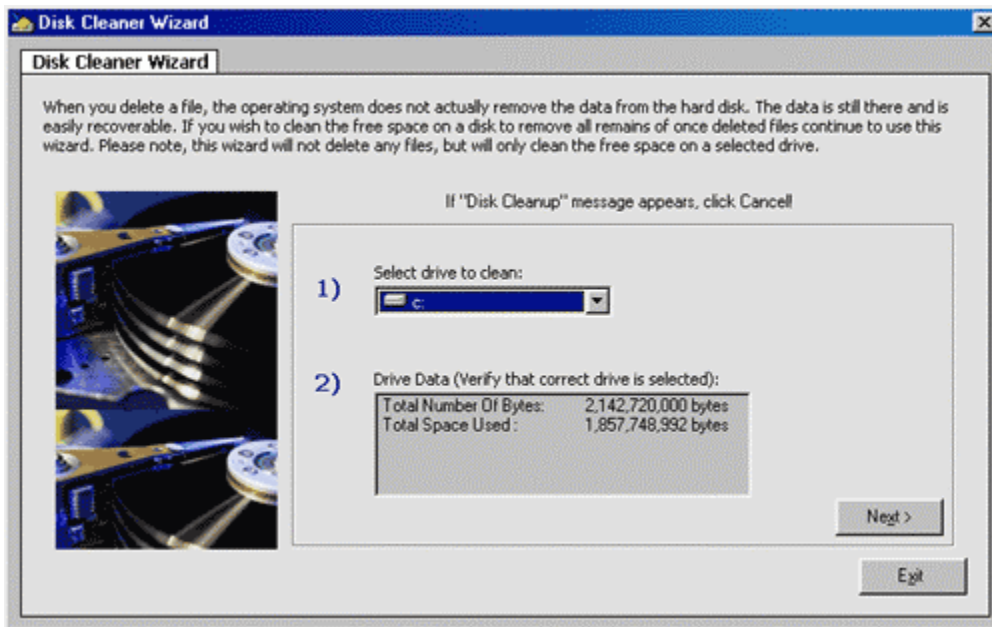

Disk Cleaner will wipe the HD for any remains of deleted files that are still scattered on the HD.

- Disk cleaner **will not**:
- Erase any files
 - Recover free space

Once you have chosen which drive you want to clean click Next. Fig 1 – 4 will come up.

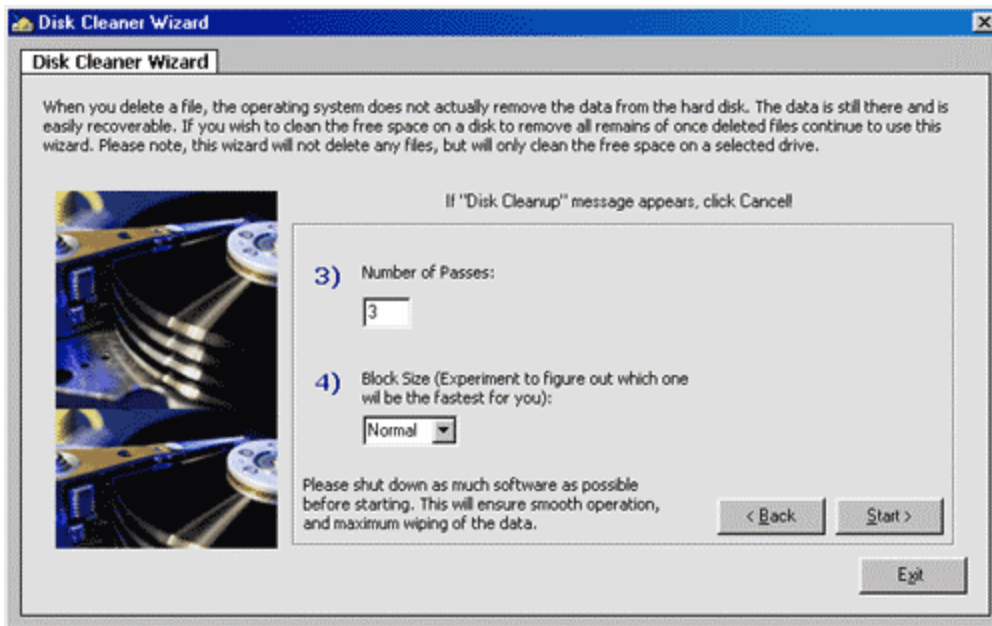

At this point you have two choices.

Choice number one is the number of passes. The more passes you select the cleaner your HD will come out. The recommended setting is 3 passes, but you could go up to 11. Going over 5 passes is pretty much pointless, unless you have some VERY secret.

Choice number two is the Block size. This doesn't affect the security procedure at all. This however helps speed up the process. Some computer handle small bits of data faster then bigger ones, while other computer are faster with bigger bits then smaller.

After setting the two options click Start. Figure 1 – 5 will come up. You are all set just wait for it to finish.

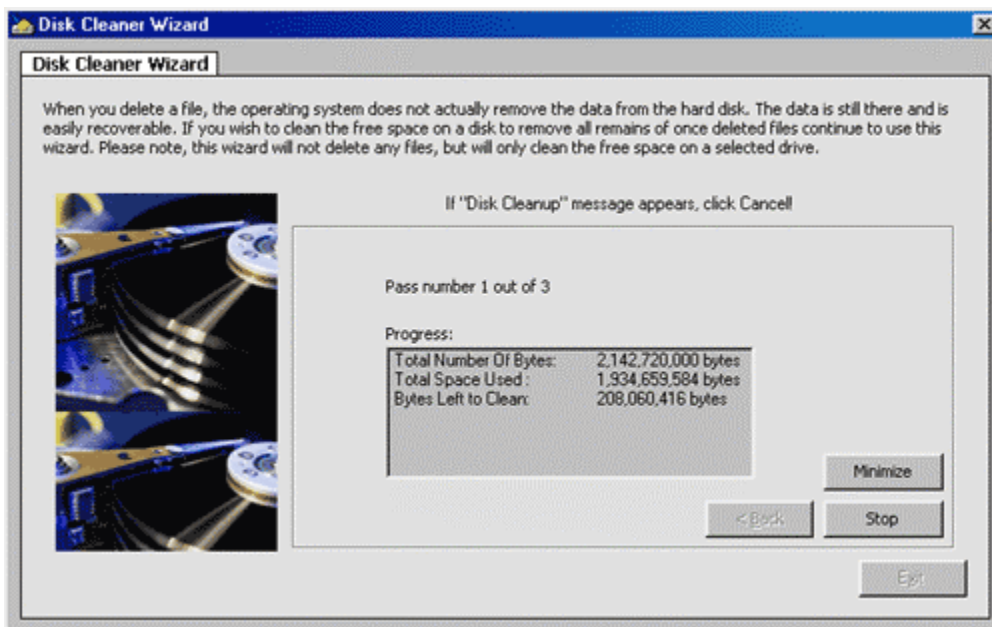

Troubleshooting

Q: I've run Disk Cleaner and now I find that I am missing some HD space.

A: Look in the root of your drive for sdel.tmp file(s). There might be more than one, with a number on the end. Delete all of them.

Q: File MSVBVM60.DLL is not found

A: Download and run ftp://ftp.microsoft.com/Softlib/MSLFILES/VBRUN60.EXE. It will install all the needed DLL files.

Q: Runtime error 453. Cannot find DLL entry point GETDISKFREESPACE EXA

A: The original Windows95 (which you have) doesn't support HDs over 2GB in size. Starting with Win95B MS has instituted support for 2GB+ size HDs into Windows. In adding support for large HDs MS changed a few API (Advanced Programming Interface) instructions around which forced the programs to have 2 sets of instructions one for 95A and one for all the future versions of Windows. The 95A code of Sure Delete was very buggy and was taken out, which unfortunately left SD with out support for Win95A.
