What is It?

The Status Monitor keeps you in touch with your printer by reporting printer conditions in the Status Panel. For example, if your paper cassette is empty, the Status Panel will alert you.

The minimum requirements for the Status Monitor to function are:

- Attached bi-directional printer recognizing PJL commands
- Bi-directional printer cable
- Status Monitor software

You can choose to have the printer report to you on some regular preset schedule or disable reporting.

You can choose to have the Status Panel displayed at all times, or to come to the top only when an important message needs to be reported.

The Status Monitor can be minimized and hidden as you work. When the Status Monitor is fully displayed, both the <u>Printer Status</u> tab and the <u>Preferences</u> tab are available.

A third screen, a <u>Menu</u> screen with additional printer settings, is also available if your Oki printer is connected to your computer and turned on. If another printer is connected, the Menu button is greyed out.

Status

The **Status Panel** shows you what is currently happening with your printer.

- When there is a problem, the color behind the small printer icon will flash from yellow to red in order to warn you.
- The background is blue if there are no problems.

The Status Panel has two message lines.

- The first line gives an error message if there is one or displays the readiness state of the printer such as **Ready Power Save**.
- The second shows the ON-LINE/OFF-LINE status of the printer

The Status Panel also displays the time. This can be set in Preferences.

At the bottom of the Status Panel is a **list box**. This displays the default printer selected. It changes if the default printer selected is changed either through Control Panel or through any other application such as Microsoft Word.

The box to the right of **Additional Information** gives a brief explanation of any error condition and what to do to fix it. Further information is available in the <u>Status Panel Messages</u> section of this Help System.

Printer Setup

Clicking on the **Printer Setup** icon takes you to Windows Printer Setup. Here you have the option of choosing a default printer for all print jobs, or a specific printer to use for your current print job. The options available will depend upon the printer driver you have chosen. Refer to your printer driver's documentation to understand your options.

Clicking **OK** accepts the choices you have made. **Cancel** closes the dialog box without making any changes. **Options** takes you to options available for the selected printer driver.

Control Panel

Clicking on the Control Panel icon provides a shortcut to the Windows Control Panel.

Print Manager

Clicking on the Print Manager takes you to the Windows Print Manager dialog box. The Print Manager allows you to control your printer and your print job. You have several options available from within the Print Manager.

- You can choose to pause or interrupt the printer or print job and then allow it to resume printing on your order.
- You have the option of selecting network connections for your printer.
- You can choose which printer you want to be the default printer.
- If a document has not begun printing you can **delete** it here.
- You can change the document's position in the print <u>queue</u>. Moving it up in the queue will cause it to be printed before other documents. Moving it down will cause it to be printed later.
- You can view the name of the document being printed, the file size, and the time and date it was sent to be printed.
- The status tells you if the printer is active or idle.

There are four buttons to the right of the Printer Status tab:

A minimize button is located at the top right corner of the Printer Status screen. Clicking it minimizes the screen to the iconic view. This view may differ from what you see if you choose the **Close** button. **Close** closes the Status Monitor and minimizes to what you have chosen in the Preferences screen.

Overview

If your Oki printer is connected to the computer, is turned on, and is set as the default printer, **Menu** will be available as a selection on the <u>Printer Status</u> screen.

The current printer settings of the printer are displayed. To get an updated status of the printer settings, select the <u>Refresh</u> button.

Click on Menu to open the screen for further options.

The Status Display

You can choose to display the status of your printer in two ways: Status Panel and Mini Icon. As you make these choices, your choice will be displayed in the upper section of the Preferences screen. Clicking on OK will activate your choice.

If Status Panel is chosen, the entire Status Panel display will be visible.

- You will see a small printer icon with a background which changes from yellow to red when there
 is a problem with the printer. The background remains blue if there are no problems, such as in
 Ready mode.
- Next to the printer icon is a two line message explaining the status of the printer.
- At the bottom of the Status Panel is a list of available printers. This displays the default printer selected. It changes if the default printer selection is changed either through Control Panel or through any other applications such as Microsoft Word.
- You can choose to display a <u>clock</u> as a 12 hour clock (i.e., 8:00 in the evening would he displayed as 8:00), or a 24 hour clock (i.e., 8:00 in the evening would be displayed as 20:00.
- You can drag the Status Panel to any location you choose on your computer's display.
- Clicking on the up arrow in the upper right corner causes the Status Panel to expand into the full Status Monitor display with all screen choices available.

If you choose Mini Icon the status panel will be minimized to a movable icon with a title beneath it.

Attempt Bidirectional

Your printer sends and receives requests for information concerning the printer's status. This information then updates the messages you see displayed in the Status Panel. If **Attempt Bidirectional** is selected, the printer will continue this communication and display the status messages. If **Attempt Bidirectional** is not selected, important printer messages will be sent, but will be displayed only in the **Additional Information** message area, not in the first panel.

The amount of time between status message updates can be controlled by entering a number in the **Polling Rate in seconds** box. This can range from 5 to 99 seconds.

Display Priority

If you prefer to see the Status Panel or the Mini Icon only when there is an urgent message from the printer, click the radio button for **Go to Top on Error**.

If you prefer to have it visible at all times, select **Always on Top**.

Clock

You can choose to have a clock visible when the Status Panel is displayed. Click on the box next to **Display Clock**.

Clicking on the box next to **12 Hour Clock** will cause the time to be set as a twelve hour clock (i.e., 8:00 in the evening would he displayed as 8:00). Removing the **x** in the box next to **12 Hour Clock** will display a 24 hour clock (i.e., 8:00 in the evening would be displayed as 20:00).

A printing order is given to documents as they are sent to be printed. This lineup is called a queue.

Close closes the Status Monitor and minimizes it to what you have chosen in Preferences. None of the changes made in the Preferences screen will be saved unless **OK** was selected in the Preferences screen.

When the correct Oki printer is connected to your computer and turned on, **Menu** becomes a selection

Clicking **Help** brings you to the Oki Help System.

Clicking **About** gives you version information about the Oki Status Monitor.

Power Saving sets your printer to a "sleep" mode which helps conserve energy. When your printer is printing it uses a heating element called a fuser to fix the image onto the paper. When Power Saving is turned on, the fuser is turned off and saves electricity by not heating.

Although Power Saving does save energy, it also forces you to wait for the fuser to heat up again before you can begin printing the next job.

You can set Power Saving to **Immediate** which causes Power Saving to begin as soon as a print job is finished.

If you set an 8 minute delay, the printer will wait 8 minutes before entering Power Saving mode.

You can also choose to **Disable** Power Saving so that the fuser heats at all times. This will allow the printer to begin printing without delay when a new job is sent to it.

To print a page showing the features of your printer, select Features. To print a page showing the graphics printing capabilities of your printer, select Graphics Printing.

If you are using A4-size paper, you have the option of selecting to print 78 columns wide or 80 columns wide. The choice is available here in case it is not available in your application software. The setting in your application software will override this setting, however.

Enter the number of copies you wish to print.

You can indicate to the printer the number of lines you wish to be printed on each page of a document. This setting will be overridden by your application software if it also sets lines per page.

To avoid printing blank pages select White Page Skip. This will help you save paper and printing time by ignoring extra pages which are sometimes inserted at the end of documents.

Each of the paper sources available will appear in black type. Unavailable sources will be greyed out. Next to the source you can indicate the thickness of the paper you have loaded. When considering the paper thickness, light may range from 16lb to 18lb paper, medium from 18lb to 24lb paper, medium-heavy paper from 24lb to 28lb paper, and heavy from 28lb to 32lb paper and includes labels and transparencies. Careful selection here will help you avoid paper jams.

OK closes the Menu screen and accepts all of the settings you have chosen.

Clicking **Cancel** closes the Menu screen without making any changes.

To reacquire the current settings of the printer, click Refresh . The printer's settings are read and then reported in the Menu screen.	

Clicking **Help** brings you to the Oki Help System.

OK closes the Preferences screen and saves all of the settings you have chosen.

Cancel cancels any changes made in Preferences and makes no changes.

Clicking **Default** resets all choices in the Preferences screen to the initial default values.
