

Version 1.0 needs Windows 3.00 or greater.

This calendar is good for years 1 - 25000, it uses the Julian calendar until Thursday October 4, 1582 then switches over to the present day Gregorian calendar which makes the next day Friday October 15 1582.

Future versions of this program will have more of a Windows look and feel, along with being more visually appealing and have much more functionality.

To set this program up in Windows:

First unzip the files into their own directory. Then open the program group you would like to keep Perpetual Calendar in. Then from the Program Manager's File menu, choose New. Then choose Program Item. After this, in the Description line write Perpetual Calendar, in the Command line write `perpcal.exe`. In the Working directory write the path, for example, if `perpcal.exe` is in a directory named calendar on drive C write: `c:\calendar`. Then choose Change Icon, A message will say there are no icons available, choose OK then choose Browse. Change to the drive and directory where `perpcal.exe` is, then double click on `icon1.ico`, choose OK once and choose OK twice and you are ready to go.
