Guidelines


- 1) Complexity and realism are not important.
- 2) The use of text is optional.
- 3) Imaginative and/or ingenious use of DAUB's features will rate highly.

4) All other things being equal, judges will look for artistic worth.

Remember, anything of reasonable quality stands a good chance of making it onto the registered disk set. If a large number of good graphics are received, most of them will probably be accepted as 'runners up'.

Any comments regarding DAUB itself are welcome, as you can be sure that they will influence future development. Of particular importance to you, the user, is the ease of use of the program, so any comments/complaints in this area will be given top priority in future versions of DAUB.
