What is K/oS Zoomer

Zoomer is a small program, that when launched opens a small window where it displays the area around the cursor magnified 2 or 4 times.

The [Zoomer window](#) can be moved, resized or set to occupy the top 1/8th of the screen, as a system toolbar. It also supports two different refresh rates. The contents of the window can also be [freezed and copied onto the clipboard](#).

Zoomer was first developed for visually impaired people, but I have received feedback from graphic artists, web page designers and user interface designers that they also find it a great help with their work.

Zoomer runs on Windows 95 or Windows NT 4.0.

Notes

- Zoomer currently does not handle changes in screen resolution. You will have to restart it if you change the resolution.
- When using Zoomer with custom pointers (like those fancy 3D pointers that come with the Plus! package), the cursor blinks at each update. This is not particularly disturbing unless the program is in the Update Always mode.

I believe that this problem arises from the way Windows handles multi-color cursors, so the only thing I can recommend is to change back to the normal system cursor.

- Zoomer may not display colors properly in 256 color display modes.

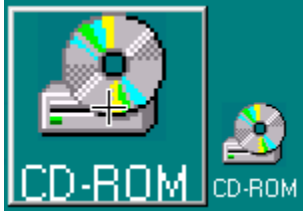

Using the Zoomer window



After you have started Zoomer, it will open a window similar to this one.

Moving the Zoomer window

Left-click and drag the window to reposition it.

Resizing the Zoomer window

Resize the window by dragging it's border (like any Windows window)

Menu Functions

Right-click Zoomer to bring up the menu:



Detailed item description:

Show/Hide Shows or hides the Zoomer window.

2X Zoom/4X Zoom Select 2 or 4 times magnification

Cursor Indicator Select the type of the preferred cursor position indicator (None, Crosshair, XORing Crosshair, Zero Sight or Arrow)

Always on Top Toggle whether the Zoomer window stays always above other windows

Toolbar mode Toggle system toolbar mode / window mode

High Sample Rate The Zoomer window is refreshed more frequently - this results in a smoother display at a cost of using more processor time

Update Always Toggles whether the Zoomer window is updated only when the mouse cursor moves, or always

Enable Freeze Key Enables or disables the freeze and copy keys. You might want to disable the hotkeys if they are interfering with another application

Help Displays the file you are currently reading

About Zoomer Displays the About Box

Exit Exits from Zoomer

Using Zoomer from the tray

After Zoomer is started, its icon will appear in your tray. Because the window is visible at this time, the icon looks like a normal magnifying glass.



If you select "Hide" from the Zoomer menu, the icon will change to an "empty" magnifying glass.



To access the Zoomer menu, just click or right-click the icon. Double-clicking the icon will hide or show the Zoomer window.

Using Zoomer's Hotkeys

If 'Enable Freeze Key' is enabled in the Zoomer menu, you can press **ALT+F12** to 'freeze' the Zoomer window.

This means, the contents of the window are not updated if you move the mouse. That way, you can easily view the contents of the window to analyze it.

To deactivate the freezing, simply press **ALT+F12** again.

To copy the contents of the Zoomer window to the clipboard, simply press **ALT+F11**.

At no time, Zoomer will "eat up" the hotkeys (**ALT+F11** or **ALT+F12**). After processing them, it passes them to the active application.

Loading Zoomer at Startup

You can have Zoomer loaded up at system startup by creating a shortcut to `Zoomer.exe`, and placing it into your StartUp folder.

If you set the shortcut to start Zoomer minimized, Zoomer will be started with it's window hidden.
