Hard drive issues

- To write directly to CD, your hard drive must have an access time of 20 milliseconds and a data-transfer rate of 600 kilobytes/second or better to keep the CD-Writer's memory buffer full.
- Fragmented files on the hard drive can slow down and possibly interrupt writing to a CD. Use Windows 95 <u>Disk</u> <u>Defragmenter</u> to speed up your hard drive.
- A drive that forces thermal calibration (even if the drive is in use) may cause fatal interruptions to the CD-Writer. In most cases, hard drives made since 1993 will postpone thermal calibration when the drive is in use.

Problems reading what you recorded to CD

- If you have a CD reader other than the CD-Writer, its lasers may not be calibrated to read recordable discs and the following may occur:
 - The disc may be ejected.
 - You may get error messages such as "no CD-ROM" or "not ready reading."
 - You may have random problems accessing some files or the entire disc.

If your CD-ROM drive reads mass-produced (silver) CDs but not recordable CDs, check with the drive's manufacturer to see if the calibration can be changed.

• Test the disc on several CD-ROM drives to determine if it is a bad disc.

If your discs will be read on earlier versions of Windows, all files and directories must use the <u>Joliet</u> file-naming convention.

If your discs will be read on Windows 95 or NT, all files and directories must be written in Romeo filename format.

To write up to 46 sessions on one CD

Note: The disc to which you wish to add data must be in the CD-Writer before you begin.

About recordable CDs

- Files written to a compact disc are permanent. They cannot be erased or written over with new data.
- Each time you write to your CD, you create a <u>session</u>. Easy-CD 95 allows you to write multiple sessions (46 maximum) to one CD.
- Clearly label your CD as an Easy-CD 95 disc. Do not use any other software package to write to the disc. Do not use Easy-CD 95 with a disc that has been written to by another program (such as Easy-CD Audio or Alchemy).
 - Accessing the files on your CD works just like any other diskette or hard drive. You will see only the most recent version of each file included in ALL sessions.

Absorption control error occurred

This most often means that there is a problem with the blank disc you are recording to, perhaps a smear or speck of dust. Clean it (on the non-label side) gently with a lint-free cloth. If the error occurs again, use a new disc.

Application code conflict 209

Occurs when you try to write to special-purpose discs on the CD-Writer. These discs have a protection bit that is recognized by certain recorders and systems and you may not be able to write on them.

Buffer under run

The flow of data to the CD-Writer must be regular so that the working buffer is never empty when it prepares to write a block of information to the disc. This message indicates that for some reason the flow of data from the hard drive to the CD-Writer has been interrupted. To resolve this problem:

- Turn off programs that cause interruptions (such as screen savers and calendar), sign off E-Mail, and log off the network.
- Use the Windows <u>Disk Defragmenter</u> option.
- Specify 1x speed
- Use the Speed Test button to instantly determine the best speed and method for writing files to the CD.
- Write to the hard drive first, then to the CD.

Data over-run/under-run

The SCSI host adapter reported an error. This is caused by improper SCSI termination or a bad SCSI cable.

Error reading file

A file referenced in the list cannot be located or accessed. Ensure that it is not being used by you or by someone else on a network.

Invalid sector address

The software has requested a block from the hard drive that does not exist or is illegal. This may happen with a corrupted hard drive.

Not recordable or write protected disc

Easy-CD cannot write to this disc.

Unable to read Medium TOC, PMA or subcode

Retry operation, this occasionally happens after a bootup.

Data Base Sharing violation on file

File is already open by another program, or the file is protected and cannot be copied. Close the other program and retry, or verify if the file is protected.

Hardware failure

Generic error on the device. Reset the device and repeat the operation.

Unit not ready

Insert a CD or wait for the CD inserted to be recognized.

Data Base Delete record error

The file could have been deleted during the process. Do not modify or delete files during the writing process.

Data Base Error accessing file

The file could have been deleted during the process. Do not modify or delete files during the writing process.

Data Base Seek or request of position error

Database internal error. Write down the code and call Technical Support.

End of virtual CD image reached

The program needs hard drive space for temporary files. The temporary folder does not have enough free space. Free up more space for the temporary files.
Out of memory

Close any open applications and try the operation again.

Medium not present

(This message can change depending on the device.) Insert a CD or wait until the disc becomes ready. The CD will be recognized.

Unrecoverable error

Write down the code and call Technical Support.

Internal or device controller error

Internal device error.

Please wait until the disc is ready and then retry the operation

Data Base Inconsistent CD

Database internal error. Write down the code and call our Technical Support.

Please refresh (hit F5) after the CD becomes ready

Database internal error.

Not enough space on CD

Your CD does not have enough free space to store the files in your current list. Shorten your file list or use a new CD.

Data Base CD write error

Try a different CD.

Disk Defragmenter

A Windows program in the Accessories/System Tools folder that defragments your files and speeds up performance.

Joliet file-naming convention

When you choose Joliet, two file lists are maintained on each CD:

- Long Windows 95 filenames (up to 64 characters).
- DOS-compatible filenames that are truncated from the Windows 95 filenames. The first six or seven letters of each long filename are used, with the tilde (~) added at the end. A unique number appears after the tilde to prevent duplicate filenames.

Romeo file-naming convention

Important: Do not use Romeo if you want to read the CD on operating systems other than Windows 95 or NT.

When you choose Romeo, only one file list is maintained on each CD. The Romeo file-naming convention uses long Windows filenames (up to 128 characters).

Real ISO image

The copy of your files that is written to your temporary directory in the form of a single large file. This file contains all the data to be written to the CD, already formatted into CD sectors and ready for streaming to the CD-Writer.

Session

You can continue to write sessions to a CD until the capacity is reached. The most common disc capacity is 650 megabytes, and each CD can have up to 46 sessions.

Session name

Your name for this group of files. The default is in YYMMDD_HHMM (year, month, day, hour, minute) format.

Speed Test button

Click this button to instantly check the writing speed (1x or 2x) to determine the best speed and method for writing files to the CD.

Speed Test...

Start Explorer

Click to access the Windows 95 program that is used to select your files and folders to copy to the Easy-CD 95 window.

Paste

If you copied files to the Clipboard, click Paste to add them to your list in the Easy-CD 95 window.

Delete

Click to delete a highlighted file from the Easy-CD 95 window.

Delete All

Click to delete all of the folders and files from the Easy-95 CD window.

Toolbar
