

## Quick Start Instructions for the Point of View Demo Disk 8/7/90

To use the **Point of View** Demonstration disk, you will need:

- a Mac Plus, SE or II.
- System Version 6.02 or greater and Finder version 6.1 or greater.
- Optional Equipment-Pioneer 4200 videodisc player and the Apple Visual Almanac videodisc.

To use the videodisc, you will also need all appropriate cables for attaching the player to your computer (see the videodisc manual if you are not sure how to do this). The videodisc player should be hooked up and turned on before you start the **Point of View**

Demonstration disk. The Demonstration uses Side B of the Apple Visual Almanac videodisc, distributed by Apple Computer.

To start the **Point of View** Demonstration disk:

1. Turn on your Macintosh in the usual way.

- A. Floppy-Disk Drive Users: Insert your system disk into a floppy disk drive and turn the

computer on using the switch to the left rear of the machine.

B Hard-Disk Drive Users: Turn the computer on by flipping the switch to the left rear of the machine (Macintosh II users may simply need to tap the startup key [the one with the arrow pointing to the left] at either the top right or top center of the keyboard.)

2. Insert your **Point of View**

Demonstration disk into the floppy disk drive.

3. When the **Point of View** Demonstration disk icon appears on the screen, place the cursor over it (using the mouse) and click the mouse button twice in rapid succession. This opens the Demonstration disk.

4. On the computer screen, locate the **POV Demo** program icon. Use the mouse to place the mouse pointer over this icon and click the mouse button twice, rapidly. This starts the **Point of View** demonstration program.

5. There are three ways to explore using the **Point of View** Demonstration disk.

A. To get a quick overview of program terminology and an explanation of Views and most of the many **Point of View** features, run the Presentation **Presenting Point of View**.

To do this, first get the program running, as described above, then use the mouse to position the cursor over the Explore menu, at the top of the screen, and hold down the mouse button.

While depressing the mouse button, move the cursor down until the item Presentations is highlighted. Release the mouse button. A dialog box pops up. Use the mouse to place the cursor over the title Presenting Point of View, then rapidly click the mouse button twice. The Presentation is designed to run automatically. Simply follow the instructions that appear on the screen.

B. To investigate a typical historical question using the Point of View Demonstration disk, refer to the Point of View Demonstration Script:

A Student Exploration, which accompanies this disk.

C. To do a Features & Benefits

demonstration, refer to POV demo script: A Features & Benefits Demonstration, which also accompanies this disk.

6. If you are going to use the Visual Almanac with the Point of View Demonstration Disk:

A. Before trying to access a videodisc, choose Preferences under the Point of View File menu. Using the pop-up videodisc player menu, choose either Pioneer LD-V4200 or LD-V8000.

B. Be sure your videodisc player is turned on before you try to access the videodisc for the first time. If you do try to access the videodisc with your Disc player off, you will have to go back to Preferences and re-select the appropriate videodisc player.
