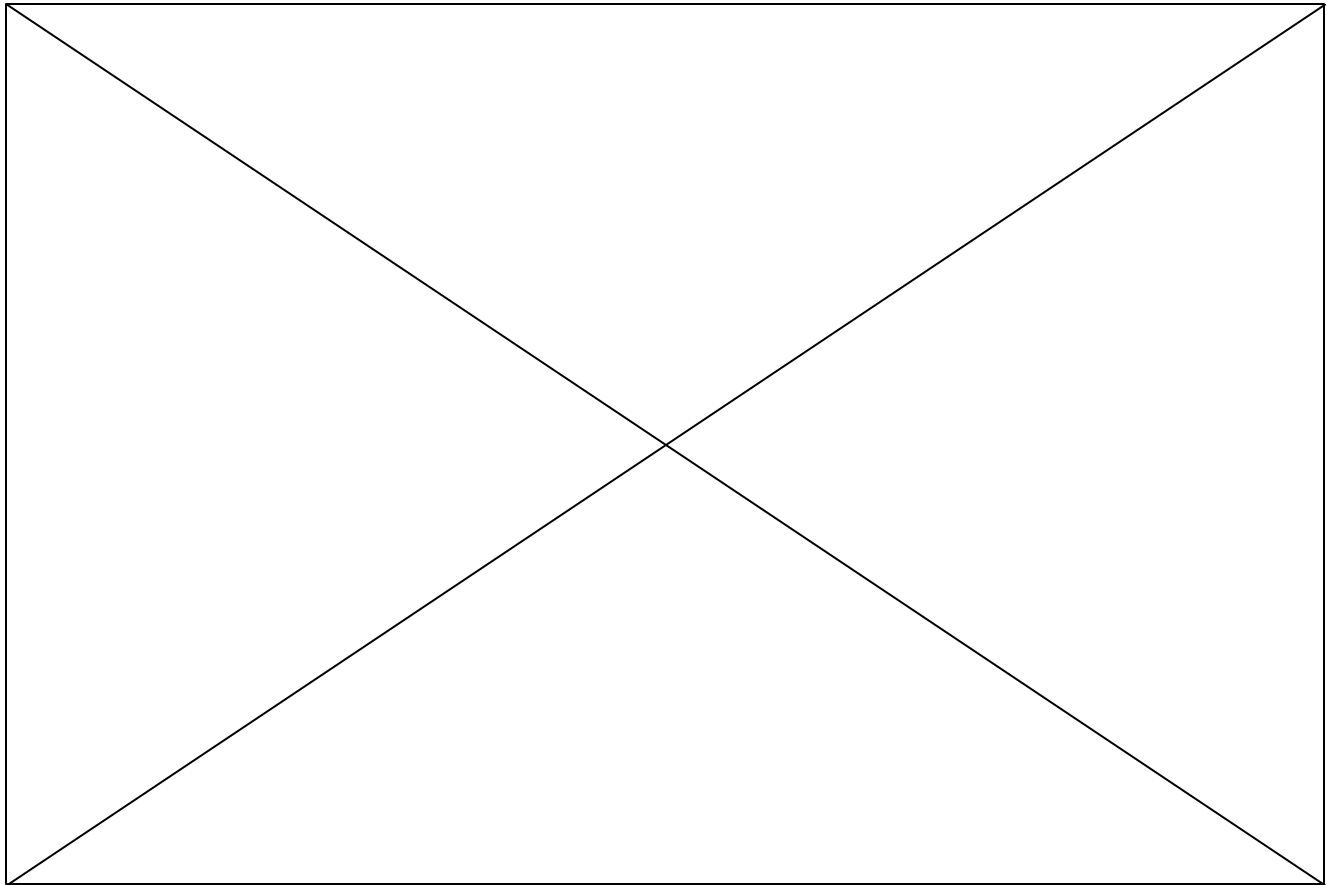


AppleSharePrintServer



Overview

The AppleShare® Print Server lets you continue to work on your Macintosh®, Apple IIGS®, Apple® IIe, or MS-DOS-compatible computer while your documents are being printed.* It reduces the time that your computer is tied up with printing tasks.

The AppleShare Print Server works with Apple LaserWriter®, ImageWriter® II, and ImageWriter LQ printers, and runs on a dedicated Macintosh Plus, Macintosh SE, or Macintosh II computer. It will increase the productivity of any group that makes frequent use of LaserWriter or ImageWriter printing.

Features

- Runs concurrently with AppleShare File Servers software
- Never "busy"
- Print queue management
- Power failure recovery
- Compatibility with all standard applications
- Multiple concurrent printers support

Benefits

- Allows both programs to run on a single, dedicated Macintosh SE or II computer.
- Allows documents to be received from more than one user at the same time, even while the printer is busy.
- Eliminates waiting for other users to complete spooling.
- Enables the network administrator to print a high-priority document next, remove documents from the queue, or suspend printing.
- Saves your important documents, even after a power failure.
- Eliminates need for special training.
- Allows any combination of up to five LaserWriter, ImageWriter II, and ImageWriter LQ printers to be spooled simultaneously.

*An Apple IIe must be equipped with an Apple II Workstation Card; an MS-DOS-compatible requires a LocalTalk® PC Card and AppleShare PC.

Product Details

How spooling works: Ordinarily, the user's computer must wait while a document is being printed. Meanwhile, the computer can't be used for anything else. And if the LaserWriter or ImageWriter is busy, the user must wait for it to become

available. AppleSharePrintServer reduces this waiting time in several ways. Users send a document over an AppleTalk® network directly to the print server, and regain control of their computers right away. AppleSharePrintServer sends the document along to the LaserWriter

or ImageWriter as soon as the printer is ready. (Up to five printers can be managed and spooled from a single print server.) And because the server can accept files from more than one user at the same time, there's never any waiting for it to be available.

System Requirements

To use the AppleSharePrint Server, you must have the following:

- An Apple LaserWriter, ImageWriter II, or ImageWriter LQ printer
- A dedicated Macintosh 512K Enhanced, Macintosh Plus, Macintosh SE, or Macintosh II computer (If the print server runs on the same computer as AppleShare File Server, a Macintosh SE or II is required.)

- A Macintosh (minimum 512K), Apple IIe (with Apple II Workstation Card), Apple IIcs, or MS-DOS-compatible (with a LocalTalk PC Card and AppleShare PC) for each user on the network
- Appropriate LocalTalk cables and connectors for each computer as well as for the print server and printers
