

The Apple Share Print Server works with Apple Laser Writer, Image Writer II, and Image Writer LQ printers, and runs on a dedicated Macintosh Plus, Macintosh SE, or Macintosh II computer. It will increase the productivity of any group that makes frequent use of Laser Writer or Image Writer printing.

Product Details	How spooling works: Ordinarily, the user's computer must wait while adocument is being printed. Meanwhile, the computer can't be used for anything else. And if the Laser Writer or Image Writer is busy, the user must wait for it to become	available. AppleShare Print Server reduces this waiting time in several ways. Users send a document over an Apple Talk® network directly to the print server, and regain control of their computers right away. Apple Share Print Servers ends the document along to the Laser Writer	or ImageWriterassoonasthe printer is ready. (Up to five printers can be managed and spooled from a single prints erver.) And because the server can accept files from more than one user at the same time, there's never any waiting for it to be available.
