Check to highlight $\mathtt{ftp:}//$ URLs which will start File Transfer and enable you to login to the specified remote system. Shade check box to use System Wide Settings. Clear check box to not search for this URL type.

Check to highlight mailto: URLs which will start Mail and open a new message with the recipient's mail address in the To field. Shade check box to use System Wide Settings. Clear check box to not search for this URL type.

Check to highlight news: URLs which will open the specified news group within the web browser. Shade check box to use System Wide Settings. Clear check box to not search for this URL type.

Check to highlight <code>gopher:</code> URLs which will open the specified gopher group within the web browser. Shade check box to use System Wide Settings. Clear check box to not search for this URL type.

Check to highlight telnet://URLs which will connect using telnet to the specified remote system using a terminal emulator. Shade check box to use System Wide Settings. Clear check box to not search for this URL type.
