Use QuickConnect to access your favorite Internet sites using the access provider you specify. QuickConnect lets you associate specific Internet providers with specific types of Internet addresses. For example, you could choose to launch Netscape for all Internet addresses beginning with http or ftp.

Tips

- You can also type an address or <u>URL</u> in the Connect To text box, then click Connect.
- Click Providers to associate a service prefix with an Internet provider. For example, you can associate the prefix http: with Netscape so when you select an Internet address that starts with http:, Netscape is automatically launched.

Tips If the Internet provider you want to associate with a prefix is not listed in the Connect Using group box, click Other Application, then type the path and filename of the application you want to use. If you don't know the path and filename, click the Browse button to search for the application you want.
