Finding Files Needed during Installation

If a message that "The file could not be found" is displayed during installation, the best way to respond to this message is to change the path under the **Copy files from:** prompt to the folder where you think the file is located. There are several ways to find the file in question:

- Use the Windows** 95** "Find" function to find the file.
- Guess where the file is likely to be:
- Try the folder or diskette drive where the NetWare* Client* 32* for Windows 95 files are located.
- Try the Windows and Windows System folders.
- If you installed Windows 95 from the network, temporarily copy the Windows 95 cabinet files (with an extension of .CAB) to your workstation's hard disk. (Do this in case you lose your network connection during the installation.)

Increasing the Environment Size for the MS-DOS Prompt

You can increase the environment size with Client 32* by adding an environment pad.

This setting adds space only to the existing environment.

To make changes to the size of the initial environment for the MS-DOS** Command Interpreter (COMMAND.COM), edit the MS-DOS Prompt properties. You can do this by opening an MS-DOS Prompt and then selecting the

By default, the FIRE PHASERS login script command plays the PHASERS.WAV file. Other wave files can also be specified in a login script using the FIRE PHASERS command. For example, FIRE PHASERS BELL.WAV would play the BELL.WAV file. This works only when using the Novell* NetWare* LOGIN utility under Windows** or Windows 95**, however.
