Welcome to the most popular Windows95/NT Internet test program.

The program helps you to define the data transfer speed in a network.



With this program you can measure the real transfer speed between Internet provider and your computer and define the time when Internet speed is highest.



Any Speed measures speed of a local network or a CD ROM driver, and shows the results in a graphical kind.

Any Speed puts the results in the trend file and can build the trend chart of any day.



Any Speed allows you to connect to a Dial-Up Network with much greater ease. It will automatically press **connect** for you on the **Connect To** dialog box.



With AnySpeed you can run a programs when network speed has some value. For instance it allows you to run Microsoft Exchange when network connection is established.






Any Speed tests the Internet connection with a host on the network. Any Speed sends ICMP Echo requests in the form of a configurable data packet to a remote host, and shows the results for each Echo reply. You can change the ping packet size, interval between sends and answer timeout.



Because Any Speed know ping packet size and time of transfer it can define the Internet <u>speed</u> - how many bytes (kilobytes) you can transfer or receive from Internet per second.

Each value of speed is shown in a graphic kind with the predetermined color on two diagrams - diagram of current speed



and the trend diagram of whole day.



Horizontal axis (hours)

You can measure transfer speed to different network hosts by adding theirs <u>address</u> to the <u>test list</u>.

For each tested address you can define action that will be performed when the network speed will be less a value or more then a value. For example you can <u>run a file transfer</u> <u>program</u> when network connection is established.

To measure speed to an Internet host

- 1. From the <u>Any Speed main screen</u> click button
- 2. In the <u>Adding New Resource</u> dialog box check **IP address** check box.
- 3. Type the address of an Internet host or press button
- 4. Setup all additional parameters and press button
- 5. From the Any Speed main screen click button

Measurement of the local network speed.

Any Speed can measure speed in a local network. Any Speed will transfer a test file to a file server and on the basis of time of record can determine the real speed of a network.

You can measure read and write speed to a different file servers by adding theirs directory names to the <u>test list</u>.



You can define the action, which will be performed every time when speed of network will be less certain value. For instance it can be an alarm message.

To measure speed to an network file server

- 1. From the <u>Any Speed main screen</u> click button
- 2. In the <u>Adding New Resource</u> dialog box check **Network drive** check box.
- 3. Type the directory name on a file server or press button <u>Browse...</u> (You must have the write rights to this directory).
- 4. Setup all additional parameters and press button
- 5. From the Any Speed main screen click button

Definition the real speed of a CD ROM drive.

If you don't know the real speed of your CD ROM drive you can define it with Any Speed.

The speed can be defined by reading a large <u>file</u> from a compact disk and measuring the read time.

Any Speed allows you to connect to a Dial-Up Network with much greater ease. It will automatically press **connect** for you on the **Connect To** dialog box and on other dialog boxes.

You can <u>customize</u> the <u>dialog boxes and buttons names</u> if you have non-English version of Windows or if you use other dial-up program.



Also you can add in the list of dialog boxes the name of dialog box from other program which must be pressed automatically too. For example it can be dialog box **Internet Mail** from Microsoft Exchange.

To keep a dial-up connection

Settings

- From the <u>Any Speed main screen</u> click button
 In the dialog box <u>Global Preferences</u> check the box **Keep Dial Up connections**.
- 3. Put in the string grid the dialog box titles and their buttons to push.
- 4. Click button

If this button is checked Any Speed will search predefined dialog boxes and will push predefined buttons.

This value defines frequency of searching process.

The automatic receiving e-mail and news.

Any Speed can not receive the e-mail or news by self. But Any Speed can help you to perform it automatically.

For automatically receiving e-mail and news you can perform following setting:

- 1. Setup your e-mail program check up new messages every 10 min. (or 30 min.)
- 2. Run Any Speed and in the dialog box <u>Global Preferences</u> check the box Keep Dial Up connections.
- Add information about confirmation dialog box which appear when line is busy to the string grid. For instance for Microsoft Exchange it will Internet Mail - dialog box title and Ok - title of push button.

Now when line is busy during connecting to the e-mail server and e-mail program will show a confirmation dialog box, Any Speed click it and your e-mail program will try to connect in another time.

If your e-mail program can not connect by self, Any Speed can run it when internet connection will be established.

For doing it you need to <u>setup the action</u> on network speed increasing. For instance you can setup the running e-mail program when connection is established e.g. network speed more then 0.5 <u>KBps</u>.

Kbytes/sec (1024 bytes per second).

Downloading a file when network connect is established and continue downloading after redialing.

Any Speed can run a program for transferring files when internet connection will be established.

- 1. Add an Internet address to the test list.
- 2. Check **Perform max. speed action** check box in the <u>Adding new resource</u> dialog box and press **Max. speed action** button.
- 3. In the <u>Action setup</u> dialog box check **Run a program** and type the name of file transferring program.
- 4. For prevent to run the new copy of transfer program each time when connection is established, check **Perform min. speed action** in the <u>Adding new resource</u> dialog box and in the <u>Min. action setup</u> dialog box check **Close a program** and type the name of file transferring program.

Now when network connection will be established, Any Speed will run the file transferring program, but when connection will dropped down, Any Speed will close this program.



• Directories List Box

Select the directory where you want to store the file. In the current directory, files that match the file type in the Save Files As Type combo box appear in the Files list box.

• Drives Combo Box

Select the current active drive. The directory structure for the current drive appears in the Directories list box.

The columns of table are separated with "Tab" code (digital code - 9). For instance this text can be opened in the Microsoft Word or in the Microsoft Excel.



Setting the resource parameters

Click **Next** button for viewing next topic. Click **Previous** button for viewing previous topic. This button defines the test of a network drive. It can be a mapped drive or a directory on a file server. You must have the write rights to this directory.

This button defines the test of a read-only file. It can be a file on a CD-ROM. For prevent reading the file from Windows cache, you need to select the file with size as big as possible.

This button defines the test of an Internet address. It can be an Internet host or WWW server or FTP server. Name of tested resource. Network drive, read-only file or an Internet <u>address</u>. Depends on resource type, this button allows you to set a network drive or read-only file or an Internet address.

This color will be used for drawing the resource speed graph.

This button allows you to select desired color.

Delay between each test performing (in milliseconds). If your computer has become to work slowly, you should reduce this value. Any Speed will wait answer from the object during this period (in milliseconds). If you have received message "**Timeout**" probably you need to increase this value.

Size of test file or IP packet can be from 1024 till 65535 bytes. Usually, Any Speed defines this size automatically depending on network speed. If speed is high Any Speed increases the size of test file and reduces this value when network speed becomes low.

Uncheck this button if you want to define size of test file or IP packet size manually.

Check this button if you want action will be performed.

If read speed or ping speed will be less or equal this value the action will be performed.

If read speed or ping speed will be more or equal this value the action will be performed.

This button customizes parameters of the action.

Here is what it does:

1. Displays a dialog with a scrolling list of programs. The user can mark his selections, buying a number of single user licenses, a site license or a worldwide license for these programs.



Question:

I ran Anyspeed to find out what the speed of the connection to my service provider is. The ping speed was roughly 2.32 KBps. What this value means?

Answer:

Everywhere in Any Speed, KBps means - kilobytes per second.

Question:

When will AnySpeed invoke the application (Internet Mail)? Is AnySpeed supposed to run all the time?

Answer:

Yes.

Question:

Do I have to specify the whole "**connect to**" name (from the dialog box) or will AnySpeed do a partial match?

Answer:

Any Speed will search a dialog box title or button's caption with the text as partial match. For example: Title "Reestablish Connection" can be found as "Reesta" or "Connection".

Question:

How can I do auto logoff after getting my mail?

Answer:

For automatically receiving e-mail and news you can perform following setting: 1. Setup your e-mail program - check up new messages every 10 min. (or 30 min.) and disconnect automatically.

2. Run Any Speed and in the dialog box Global Preferences check the box **Keep Dial Up connections**.

3. Add information about confirmation dialog box, which appear when line is busy to the string grid. For instance for Microsoft Exchange it will **Internet Mail** - dialog box title and **Ok** - title of push button.

Now when line is busy during connecting to the e-mail server and e-mail program will show a confirmation dialog box, Any Speed click it and your e-mail program will try to connect in another time.

Question:

I have set AnySpeed up to monitor the news server from which I am downloading data. Any Speed is reporting a transfer rate between .3 and .6 KBps. However I am really receiving a throughput of about 5.0 KBps. Now how is Any Speed telling me what my true speed is?

Answer:

Any Speed measures the network speed by sending a packet and defines the time of transfer when got the packet. The length of ICMP packet is constant when it going from your computer and when it goes back to the computer as ICMP echo. But when you download a file, you send a small request and receive a lot of bytes with response. That is why the ping speed and download speed can be different. Also Any Speed fills the ping packet with random bytes, which can not be compressed during transfer process, but text data (e-mail, news or WWW) can be compressed by modem or by other communication devices. The speed value which shows Any Speed means - it is speed of transfer of a large compressed data packet (.zip or .arj file). For non-compressed text the transfer speed can be higher.

Question:

There seems to be no way to remove a resource. The button for that purpose is always disabled.

Answer:

This button is disabled when test process is started (button "Start" pressed) and enabled only if test process is stopped (button "Stop" pressed).

Question:

AnySpeed keeps giving me access violations.

Answer:

I think this happened because you had try to measure speed of a network computer without write access to the directory or probably you have two or more identical directories in the test list.

Question:

Transfer test shows the transfer of my CD-ROM at a little above 900 KBps. What it means?

Answer:

900 KBps for CD-ROM means 6 speed CD-ROM (6 x), because one speed CD-ROM drive transfers data with 150 KBps.

Question:

I run the ping test and it reads 2.43 KBps. I have a 28.8 baud modem. If a kilobyte is 1000 bytes and I multiply this times 2.43 I get 2,430 bps. Is my modem really running this slow or am I missing something?

Answer:

When your modem connects with ISP, the connection speed, which you see on "Connected" dialog box, is amount of bits per second, which can pass through the modem. But you can't divide this value on 8 for getting the real transfer speed in bytes per second, because during transfer each byte will be including the start bit, stop bit and parity bit. Also each network protocol (PPP, IP, TCP, FTP and so on) will include own protocol information.

Question:

We are running a 10Mb Ethernet network. AnySpeed reports throughput of 20Mbps however. How can that be?

Answer:

Any Speed can not measure the speed correctly when network cache is used. If there is a Microsoft network, you will see the correct speed value after couple of minutes when the network cache will be overflowed and will finish work. If there is a Novell network, you should switch off the network cache:

1. Open the dialog box "Network settings";

2. Choice the properties of **Novell Netware Client 32**;

3. In the tab "Advanced settings" set parameters "Cache writes" - OFF and "File Cache Level" - 0.

Question:

I added ftp.download.com, and when I downloaded a file, my download window showed download speeds as high as 2.5k/sec, while I noticed a decrease in ping speed down to .6 k/sec in my Anyspeed window for the site. Am I interpreting the results correctly?

Answer:

It is happened because the ICMP packets (ping packets) are transferring with lowest priority and when you run an FTP downloading, the time of going through of ICMP packets is increased.

Question:

My 10base-T network shows numbers like 700 KBbs with only two users on the net. I would expect something closer to the Ethernet 1000 KBps.

Answer:

It never is so because each packet, received from the file server, includes protocol information, header and so on. This information can occupy up to 40% of all data.
