To make the changes to your AUTOEXEC.BAT file yourself

- 1. Click No.
- 2. When you exit Install after it completes, copy your existing AUTOEXEC.BAT file to AUTOEXEC.OLD.
- 3. Start Windows Notepad or another ASCII text editor.
- 4. Choose File Open and choose AUTOEXEC.BAT.
- 5. Add the Lotus Notes program directory to your path.

For example, if your path is PATH C:\DOS;C:\;C:\WINDOWS;C:\AMIPRO, add your Notes program directory so that your path is PATH C:\DOS;C:\;C:\WINDOWS;C:\AMIPRO;C:\NOTES

Begin Copying Files

Specify Distribution Directory

Specify the drive and directory where you want to copy the compressed SmartSuite files. Users will run Install from this drive and directory.

- 1. Select a drive.
 - Install tells you if the drive you select has sufficient space.

Be sure you entered your name and your company name correctly.

Multiple Copies of 1-2-3 for Windows

There is already a copy of 1-2-3 Release 4 for Windows installed on your hard disk.

You may

Delete the existing 1-2-3 Release 4 for Windows from your hard disk.

Install 1-2-3 Release 5 for Windows in the same directory as the existing 1-2-3 Release 4 for Windows.

Doing so will write over the existing 1-2-3 files. 1-2-3 Release 5 for Windows will then be the only copy of 1-2-3 for Windows on your hard disk.

Install 1-2-3 Release 5 for Windows in a different directory from the existing 1-2-3 for Windows.

When you install 1-2-3 Release 5 for Windows, some settings in your 123R4.INI file are preserved in your 123R5.INI file.

NOTE: If you are installing 1-2-3 on a server, you should not install 1-2-3 Release 5 in the same directory as 1-2-3 Release 4.

Node Install Options

Specify the file server where the Lotus shared tools are located. Select whether you want to copy sample and template files to you hard disk.

- 1. To specify the drive where the Lotus Shared Tools reside, select the drive from the "Shared Tools drive on file server" drop-down box.
- 2. To copy the 1-2-3 sample and template files to your hard disk, select the "Personal copies of samples and templates" check box.
 - If you decide to leave the sample and template files on the network server, you should be connected to the server when you want to have access to these files.
- 3. Click Next.

Multiple Copies for Organizer for Windows

You already have a copy of Organizer for Windows installed on your hard disk. Lotus recommends that you install Organizer 1.13s in the same directory as the existing version.

Click Next to continue installing Organizer.

Freelance Graphics Default Preferences

Specify the default directories for various components. If you name a directory that does not exist, the Installation program will create it.

- 1. To change the default directory for Presentation files, enter the full path name (including the drive letter) in the Presentation directory text box.
- 2. To change the default directory for SmartMaster Sets, Palettes, and Symbols, enter the full path name (including the drive letter) in the SmartMaster Sets, Palettes, and Symbols directory text box.
- 3. To change the default Backup directory, enter the full path name (including the drive letter) in the Backup directory text box.

Multiple Copies for Approach for Windows

You already have a copy of Approach for Windows installed on your hard disk. Lotus recommends that you install Approach 3.0 for Windows in the same directory as the existing version of Approach for Windows.

Click Next to continue installing Approach for Windows.

Ami Pro currently running

You tried to install Ami Pro 3.1, and the install program detected an existing version of Ami Pro running.

- 1. Choose Exit Install.
- 2. Close the version of Ami Pro that is currently running.
- 3. Run the install program.

Specifying paths

Install checks for an existing release of Ami Pro. If Install finds existing MACROS, DOCS, STYLES, ICONS, or DRAWSYM directories, it displays the paths to those directories. You can leave the existing paths and overwrite any files with similar names or specify different directories.

If you modified any macros, sample documents, style sheets, SmartIcons, or clip art files provided with Ami Pro and saved the changes to the original file names, you should specify another path. Otherwise, you can install these files into the existing directories.

To specify directories for style sheets, documents, macros, icons, and clip art

- 1. Specify the complete paths to the directories where you want to install the Ami Pro macros, sample documents, style sheets, Smartlcons, and clip art.
- 2. Choose OK.

Install installs the files into the directories you specified.

Installing the Document Sharing Application

Included in Ami Pro 3.1 is the Document Sharing Application, a Lotus Notes database that helps manage the creation and storage of documents among members of a workgroup.

You must have Lotus Notes to use the Document Sharing Application. If you choose to install the database, the install program places the DOCSHARE.NSF file in your \AMIPRO directory.
