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Getting started: Test driving Boss Everyware

Boss Everyware assembles data about computer usage and user work time. The data is recorded and appropriately formatted such that it can be imported easily by a database management system or a spreadsheet application.

Tracking real URLs

The Secret Agent can write the URLs of visited sites. Real URLs, not only the page titles shown in the window captions. You can instruct the Secret Agent, whether or not to write the URLs of visited sites and if it should, write them in the column which is intended to store the parent window titles or in the other column. In the latter case the value to be written, when the user is not working with the browser, is "N.A.", which means "Not Applicable". Supported browsers are: Microsoft Internet Explorer (tested on MSIE 3.0, 3.02, 4.0, 4.01), Netscape Navigator (tested on 3.0, 4.03, 4.05) and Opera (tested on 3.21).

Reporting usage of user-specified applications only

The Secret Agent can observe the interaction of user-specified applications only. You don't need to browse through the report of user activity in its entirety if you only want to examine the usage of few applications.

To specify the applications, open the Options Panel within the Boss Everyware Manager and press **[Specify].** Fill in the list of executable files within the dialog box which appears. To add an item to the list you can either type the file name in the field at the top of the box and then press the button which is marked by the down arrow or you can select the files from the directory box by pressing the **[Browse]**. If you want to include all the DOS-based programs in the list, press **[MS-DOS]**. For screen savers, press **[*.SCR]**. If **listed here** is checked, the Secret Agent will report interactions with listed applications only, otherwise (if **not listed here** is checked) it will report interactions with all the applications except the listed ones

Auto-generating of report file name

To make the report names more informative and to allow easier navigation through reports written from different users and/or at different times, the report file name can now be generated automatically. With this feature turned on, every time the Secret Agent starts, it creates a new report with a new name. The auto-generated report name is composed from the user name followed by the date/time stamp. If the volume you choose for the report location does not support long file names, the first two characters of the file name will be the first two letters of the user name, followed by month (two digits), day (two digits) and the number of reports from this user on this day.

Live report grid

Now you can open/execute every open-able/executable item within the report grid of the Boss Everyware Manager. To do that, double-click on the cell containing URL, path/exe-file name, or directory. You can now also sort the report grid by double-clicking on the appropriate column header (the first gray cell in the column) to sort the report by.

Password protection

The key functions of the Boss Everyware Manager, such as decryption of the encrypted report files, configuring and start/stop of the Secret Agent are now password protected. The first time you access one of these functions, within a Manager working session, you need to type the password which gives you permission to use all of these functions within the current session. The default password is **bew**. It is recommended to change it the first time you use the Boss Everyware Manager.

Reported Information

User Name

Name of the user who logged on.

Application / Program name

Executable file name of the application the user interacted with.

Window title / Document name

Title of the window the user interacted with. Usually the document handling applications will place the name of the opened document onto the window title.

Examples of window titles:

"Microsoft Word – BEWhelp.doc" "Microsoft Excel - 51_all.xls" "FreeCell Game #27734" "Exploring - E:\RAIL\DRAFT\TX_S\SR96"

URLs of visited sites

Real URLs of all visited sites. Supported browsers are: Microsoft Internet Explorer (tested on MSIE 3.0, 3.02, 4.0, 4.01), Netscape Navigator (tested on 3.0, 4.03, 4.05), Opera (tested on 3.21).

Start / End time

Date-time stamps of the user's interaction with a particular window /application.

Duration

Duration of user's interaction with particular window /application

Form of the report

Report can be written either directly into a text file, formatted such that it can be imported easily by other data handling applications or into encrypted file. An encrypted file can be translated into the readable text file using the Boss Everyware Manager. On a local area network, usage information from several workstations can be written into a single report file (encrypted or not) on the shared drive.

Structure

Boss Everyware consists of two parts:

Secret Agent

BEWHA.EXE The Secret Agent is a small hidden program that examines the user/PC interaction and creates the report. The Secret Agent can be installed separately from the Manager if so desired (see <u>Secret Agent working in a local area network</u>). The Secret Agent does not appear in the Task List (shown by Ctrl-Alt-Del) and automatically regenerates its registry settings if an unauthorized user changed them.

Manager

BEWMAN.EXE The Manager is a normal application that can be used for configuring The Secret Agent, viewing reports, decrypting encrypted reports and appending a report file to another one.

Other utilities

INSTALL.EXE Complete Boss Everyware Setup.

TERMHA.EXE Utility which stops The Secret Agent. Needed to allow the user to change the configuration for The Secret Agent without the Boss Everyware Manager (via a *.REG file).

BEWREMOV.EXE Uninstall the Boss Everyware.

Boss Everyware. Overview.

Step 1. Installation.

Run install.exe.

Press [Next] until it transforms into [Finish].

Press [Finish]. Close the program group which appears.

Press [OK] on the box saying Boss Everyware is now installed.

Don't reboot the computer. Choose the Boss Everyware Manager from the Start menu (section **Programs | Boss Everyware**). The Boss Everyware Manager window will appear as well as **Step 2** of this test drive.

Step 2. Running the Secret Agent. Opening a report.

Step 1. Installation

Within the Boss Everyware Manager window, press **[Run]** (it's marked by a **Play** sign). Minimize or close the Manager window.

Work for awhile as usual editing documents, managing files, browsing the web, playing DOS-games, enjoying screen savers etc.

Restore the Manager window (or run the Manager again).

Click **[Open]** and choose the report file. By default the report file is stored in the drive C root directory (**C**:\) and has the auto-generated name composed from your user name followed by the date/time stamp. It should have the extension **TXT**. In the grid which appears, you may now see a record of all your actions. You can sort the grid by double-clicking the column header. You can also open a Web page, execute a program or explore a directory by double-clicking the cell where one of these items is contained.

Press **[Stop]**. Type **bew** at the login prompt. This gives you access to some key functions of the Boss Everyware Manager. It's recommended to change this default password.

Note: it is not mandatory that the Manager program be turned on in order to record user interaction with the computer, i.e., the Secret Agent can also work without the presence of the Boss Everyware Manager on the computer

Press [Options] in the Boss Everyware Manager window.

You may change all the options as you wish. Choose name and location for the report file. You can see how the different options affect the content of the report in the **Report Example** box.

Click **[OK]** to close the options box and press **[Run]** again.

Now you may try to view the report file using **Notepad** to see what it looks like. You can also easily open it by your spreadsheet application or database management system. <u>Importing Report files by other applications</u>

And if you are familiar with using a database management system then you have unlimited possibilities with Boss Everyware to analyze and store data about computer usage and thus employee productivity.

Step 4. Importing reports

Well, now you want to monitor a computer yet you don't want the user to know you are monitoring, to avoid any interference from the user. Here are few pointers on how to do that:

1. On your PC: Install Boss Everyware using INSTALL.EXE.

2. On your PC: Open the Options panel within the Boss Everyware and choose the options according to the way you want the Secret Agent to work on the other computer. Make sure the option Run Secret Agent At Boot Time is on and the location for the Report file is specified correctly for the monitored computer. Report files can be stored on a network location.

3. On your PC: Click [Save As] on the Options panel. Specify location for the BEWHA.EXE on the other computer (on the next step you will copy this file there). Type the name for the registry update file. The extension of this file must be .REG.

4. On your/monitored PC: Copy the file BEWHA.EXE, TERMHA.EXE and the recently created *.REG file into the specified location (which you specified in the previous step) on the PC to be monitored.

5. On the monitored PC: Run the TERMHA.EXE to make sure the Secret Agent (which probably was installed before) is not running.

6. On monitored PC: Double-click the copied *.REG file within the Windows Explorer. Update the System Registry.

- 7. On monitored PC: Remove the copied *.REG file and TERMHA.EXE from this PC.
- 8. Monitored PC: After reboot, the Secret Agent is activated and starts to write its report.

Installing Boss Everyware

Run **install.exe**. You will be asked to specify where to install it, as well as, whether or not you would prefer to install both the Secret Agent and the Manager or just The Secret Agent by itself. If you choose to install both the Secret Agent and the Manager, you can specify the group and the shortcut location for the Manager.

Configuring Boss Everyware

You can control the form and details of the reports written by the Secret Agent using the configuration panel situated within the installation utility and the Boss Everyware Manager.

In the Boss Everyware Manager, select the **Service | Options** menu item. This will display the options panel where you can change the various parameters listed below. To make the configuration process visual and intuitive, the options panel is accompanied by the Report Example box which shows an example of a report written according to the currently displayed set of options.

List of configurable parameters

Run Secret Agent at the boot time

Check this item if you want to the Secret Agent to start automatically every time Windows boots-up.

Show warning "System is being monitored"

If checked, the message System is being monitored will appear every time the Secret Agent starts.

Write reports daily at a specified time

If checked, the Secret Agent will write the report within a specified time period.

Write report for specified applications only

If checked, the Secret Agent watches the interaction of specified applications only. To specify the applications, press **[Specify]** and fill in the list of executable files within the dialog box which appears. To add an item to the list you can either type the file name in the field at the top of the box and then press the button which is marked by the down arrow or you can select the files from the directory box by pressing **[Browse]**. If you want to include all the DOS-based programs in the list, press **[MS-DOS]**. For screen savers, press **[*.SCR]**. If **listed here** is checked, the Secret Agent will report the interactions with listed applications only, otherwise (if **not listed here** is checked) it will report the interactions with all the applications except the listed ones.

Report file page

Report file name and location

Here you can specify the report file name and location. Extension for the text files is **.TXT** (TAB separator) or **.CSV** (Comma separated) and for encrypted report files - **.BEW**. In case the Secret Agent can not write into a specified location (network inaccessible, access denied etc.) it will write the report into Window's system directory.

Auto-generate file name

If checked, the report file name will be generated automatically. If the volume you have selected for report location supports long file names, the file name will be the user name followed by the date/time stamp. If the volume does not support long file names, the first two characters of the file name will be the first two letters of the user name, followed by month (two digits), day (two digits) and the order number of the report for current date.

Re-create report file at start

If checked, the report file will be emptied every time the Secret Agent starts. The back copy of the previous report is stored in the file with the same name but with the \sim in extension.

Write over report file in X days

If checked, the report file will be emptied every X days on the start of Secret Agent. The back copy of the previous report is stored in the file with the same name but with the \sim in extension. Use this if you want to track user activity for the last week in order to avoid growing the reports to the huge files.

Field separator

Specifies the character to separate different values in a report string. There are two allowed values: TAB (fields which are separated by tabulation) and CSV (fields which are separated by commas). The default value is TAB. It allows the importation of the report files most into other applications like MS Excel, Lotus 1-2-3 or MS Access. If you want to use ODBC text driver to access Boss Everyware report data, the CSV may be more appropriate (comma used as default field delimiter in this driver). **If you want to log the URLs** of visited web sites TAB is recommended because some URLs contain a comma that causes (in the case of the usage of the CSV separator) the corresponding report line to be unintelligible.

Encrypt report file

If checked, the report file will be written automatically in an encrypted format, so you can read it only if you're using the Boss Everyware Manager.

Reported information and Times page

Exe-file name

This option orders the Secret Agent, whether or not it should write the exe-file name of the application interacting with user and if it should, whether with or without the full path.

URL

This option instructs the Secret Agent, whether or not it should write the URLs of visited sites and if it should, write them in the column which is intended to store the parent window titles or in the other column (in this case the value to be written, when the user is not working with the browser, is "N.A.", which means "Not Applicable"). Browsers supported are Microsoft Internet Explorer (tested on MSIE 3.0, 3.02, 4.0, 4.01), Netscape Navigator (tested on 3.0, 4.03, 4.05) and Opera tested on 3.21.

Write computer's name

If checked, the report string will begin with the name of the computer where the Secret Agent is working. Useful if you collect information from different computers on a network. In this way the information can be combined into a single report file.

Write user's name

If checked, the report string will contain the name of the user who logged on. Useful if you collect information from different computers on a network. In this way the information can be combined into a single report file.

Write parent window text

If checked, the Secret Agent writes the title of the parent window corresponding to the foreground window, the user is currently interacting with. Useful if you want to filter out all the short lived dialog boxes.

Write actual window text

If checked, the Secret Agent writes the titles of the foreground windows, including the dialog boxes like "Open file", "Save file as..." etc.

Summation of activity time

This option instructs the Secret Agent, in which format it should write the time difference between the starting-point and ending-point of the user's interaction. Formats can be HH:MM:SS, the sum of the seconds or the sum of the milliseconds.

Write the end time

This option instructs the Secret Agent, whether or not it should write the end times of the interactions.

Write time in AM / PM format

If checked, the Secret Agent will write the starting/ending-point times in 12-hour AM /PM format with seconds. Some database applications (for example, MS Access) will not import information correctly from the text files in this format. If it's not checked (default), the time will be written in 24-hour scale format.

Selective reporting list

To add an item to the list you can either type the file name in the field at the top of the box and then press the button which is marked by the down arrow or you can select the files from the directory box by pressing **[Browse]**. If you want to include all the DOS-based programs in the list, press **[MS-DOS]**. For screen savers, press **[*.SCR]**. If **listed here** is checked, the Secret Agent will report the interactions with listed applications only, otherwise (if **not listed here** is checked) it will report the interactions with all the applications except the listed ones.

Copy the Secret Agent executable file into the desired location. If not configured, it will work according to the default configuration, which you will see when you open the configuration panel for the first time. Specifically, the report will be writing into the "C:\BEWREP.TXT" file.

You should always have at least one copy of the Boss Everyware Manager running on at least one computer.

Using the configuration panel within the Manager you can generate a file to update the system registry with the new set of options. To do this, open the configuration panel and select the **Service | Options** menu item.

Regulate the options according to the way you want the stand-alone Secret Agent to work. Click **[Save As]** on the configuration panel. Type the name for the registry update file. The extension of this file must be .REG.

Note if several Secret Agents combine their reports into one single file on a shared network drive, they must use the same configuration set or the combined report may become unintelligible (because of columns mix).

After you have stored the set of options in the external file, click **[Cancel]** on the configuration panel to avoid changing the configuration of the Secret Agent already installed on this computer.

Now copy (or make visible if the computers are bound in a LAN) the prepared registry update file to the computer where you want to configure the Secret Agent. **Stop the Secret Agent using TERMHA.EXE.** Double-click the registry update file from Windows Explorer to update the system registry and change the configuration of the Secret Agent. Restart the Secret Agent (BEWHA.EXE).

Encrypted reports

How to force Secret Agent to encrypt report files? How to decrypt encrypted report files?

How to force Secret Agent to encrypt report files?

Within the configuration panel check the option **Encrypt report file** and click **[OK]**. Next time the Secret Agent starts, it will write the report in encrypted format. The default extension of encrypted report file is **.BEW**.

Configuring Boss Everyware How to decrypt encrypted report files?

How to decrypt report files?

First, open the encrypted report file selecting the **File | Open** menu item in the Boss Everyware Manager. After the report appears on the screen select **File | Save As...**, specify the file name and click **[OK]**. The report will be saved as a normal text file under the name you have specified and it may now be imported by another data handling application if so desired.

How to force Secret Agent to encrypt report files?

Consolidating reports.

If you want to consolidate reports from different computers, you may instruct the Secret Agents running on the workstations to write their reports into the same file. To do this, please specify the same **Report File Name** in the options panel for all the Secret Agents or use the same registry update file (generated by pressing **[Save As]** within the options panel.) on all the workstations. You will distinguish records from different workstations by Computer– or User name also written in the report.

You can open any report by the Manager while reporting is being performed. It does not affect the working process of the Secret Agent. In this case you may use **[Refresh]** to reload the report currently opened by the Manager. However if you open the active report (where the Secret Agent is currently writing) by a spreadsheet or DBMS application (like Microsoft Excel or Microsoft Access), the report will be locked by the Secret Agent. In this case (as well as in all cases when the record into the specified report file is impossible to open) the Secret Agent starts to write the report file to the Windows system directory. When the specified file/location becomes accessible, the Secret Agent continues with the writing to the specified file.

If you want to analyze a report on another location as it is written, you can copy or move it even if the Secret Agent is currently working with this file. If you move or delete the report file, the Secret Agent creates the new empty report file with the same name as the moved/deleted one and writes further report to this file.

You can also consolidate different reports manually, using **[Append to]** within the Boss Everyware Manager. To do this, open the report file you want to append and select the **File | Open** menu item within the Manager. Then select the **File | Append** to menu item. In the dialog box, which now appears, select a report text file to which you want to append the opened report. Click [OK].

Note: All the consolidated reports must have an equal number of columns. Otherwise the resulting report may become unintelligible. It is preferable that all the reports are written using the same set of options.

Importing reports by MS Excel

Select File | Open menu item.

Specify Text files in the Files of type pull down box.

Select the report file and press [Open]. The text import wizard window now appears.

If the **Field separator** parameter that the Secret Agent used writing this report was TAB (default), press **[Finish]**. If not, press **[Next]**, and specify the field separator (specified there as "delimiter") used by Secret Agent.

Press [Finish].

Importing reports by Lotus 1-2-3

Select the File | Open menu item.

Specify **Text** in the **File type** pull down box. If the **Field separator** parameter that the Secret Agent used writing this report was TAB (default), press **[OK]**. If not, press **[Text Options...]**, and specify the field used by the Secret Agent.

Select the report file and press [OK].

Importing reports by MS Access

Switch to the **Tables** page in the database window.

Press [New]. Select the Import table option from the list which now appears.

Specify Text files in the Files of type pull down box.

Select the report file and press [Import].

If the **Field separator** parameter that the Secret Agent used writing this report was TAB (default), press **[Finish]**. If not, press **[Next]**, and specify the field separator used by Secret Agent.

Press [Finish].

ODBC data source configuration

If you are familiar with a Database Management System you may want to create application to analyze the Boss Everyware reports using queries, custom reports etc. In this case you may need to connect to the Boss Everyware reports via ODBC data sources.

This assumes that you have a Microsoft 32-bit ODBC Text driver already installed.

To create an ODBC data source, open **ODBC Data Source Administrator** utility from the Control Panel. Open the **System DSN** page. (Creating the System data source described here. Creating the File data source or the User data source is very similar. If you don't know the difference between these kinds of Data sources, please refer to **ODBC Help**).

Press [Add]. Select the Microsoft Text Driver in the list of drivers which now appears.

Press [Finish]. Type the file name of the System data source you want to create.

Clear the box **Use current directory** in the **ODBC Text setup** dialog box appeared. Select directory where the Boss Everyware report files are stored.

Press [Options>>].

Press **[Define format]**. Keep clear box **Column Name Header**. Select in the **Format** pull down box the appropriate field separator - you can specify the default value (valid for all report files which appear in that directory) and/or for each particular report file.

Note: By default the ODBC driver uses the **comma** (CSV) as separator. If you've used **TAB** as a delimiter in your report files don't forget to specify this here!

Press **[OK]**. The data source is created.

Now you can use the Boss Everyware reports in a wide variety of database systems. It's recommended, of course, to translate these report text tables into the format of the appropriate database table.

Removing Boss Everyware

The simplest way to remove Boss Everyware is to choose the **Boss Everyware** item within the **Add/Remove programs** applet of the Control Panel. However, you can also remove the Boss Everyware software by

<u>Using the installation utility</u> <u>manually</u>

Removal using installation utility

Run install.exe.

It will detect the presence of Boss Everyware installed on the computer and **[Uninstall]** will appear. Press it. After the message "Boss Everyware was removed from your computer" appears, press **[Close]**. Boss Everyware is now completely removed.

Installing Boss Everyware Secret Agent working alone

Removing Boss Everyware manually

Note: It's preferable that only **experienced users** attempt to remove Boss Everyware manually. If you are not familiar with the system registry, use the installation utility to remove Boss Everyware.

Removal using installation utility

- 1. Stop the Secret Agent using TERMHA.EXE
- 2. Delete the files listed below from your hard disk.
 - BEWHA.EXE BEWREMOV.EXE TERMHA.EXE README.TXT BEW.HLP BEW.CNT BEW.GID REGISTER.EXE REGISTER.HLP INSTLIST

Locations of these files are stored in INSTLIST, which can be opened by Notepad.

3. Delete the program group of Boss Everyware in the Start menu.

4. Run the System Registry Editor. Delete the next registry keys:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Jmerik\BossEveryware (locations of the Secret Agent and the Manager are stored here)

If the Secret Agent was started when the computer was booted-up, delete the value "BEWHA.EXE" in the key HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Run Warning: Be careful not to delete this key!

Definition of shareware
