Quick Start ...

First of all, note that submenus won't open until you move the mouse out to the small arrow!

1 - Browsing:

Right-click a drive, a folder, or 'My Computer' and go out on the new item you will find in the menu called 'ShellGEM'. Browse your machine and open the file or folder of your choice.

2 - Copying, Moving, and Creating Shortcuts

From an open Explorer-window, drag any file(s) with the *right* mouse-button and drop it on a folder or drive. You will get 3 new items in the menu that pops up. Those are "Move to Folder", "Copy to Folder", and "Shortcut(s) in Folder".

3 - Extracting / Decompressing / Unzipping

Locate a zip-file, a rar-file, arj-file, or a jar-file in an open Explorer-window (read Extraction below). Pick it up with the *right* mouse-button and drop it on (or in) a folder or drive. In addition to the 3 items you get in #2 above, you will now also find "Extract to Folder" and "Extract Here".

Slow Start - Some Details ...

ShellGEM is a shell context-menu for Win95. It adds a neat "folder/file-browser" to the normal shell menu. And also file-management functions to the drag-drop menu.

Direct right-click: In the menu you get when you right-click a folder/drive/MyComputer directly, you can browse through your machine and locate and open the folder or file of your choice. If you see a special submenu icon (a submenu-icon on top of a Files-icon), it means that the folder doesn't have any subfolders. Opening this submenu will show the files in the folder directly without having to go via an unnecessary "Files" item. Note that this item can sometimes "lie" in the sense that the folder might not always contain any files that will be displayed in the menu and will thus show up empty.

Right-button drag and drop: If you, with the right mouse button, drag and drop an object on a folder/drive (win98 users can now also drop on the desktop) you can get these extra items available in the menu:

Copy to Folder - Lets you browse the directorytree of your computer and *copy* the selected objects to the folder of your choice.

Move to Folder - Lets you browse the directorytree of your computer and *move* the selected objects to the folder of your choice.

Shortcut(s) in Folder - Lets you browse the directorytree of your computer and *create shortcuts* to the selected objects in the folder you select.

Extract to Folder - Lets you browse the directorytree of your computer and *extract* the selected objects to the folder of your choice. This item will only be displayed if the file(s) you right-drag are zip-files, rar-files, or jar files (recognized filetypes are: .zip .arj .rar .r00 .r01 .001 and .j).

Extract Here - Same as Extract to Subfolder only extracts to the folder/drive you dropped the file onto.

Some people might argue that the functionality offered by the drag and drop menu should be implemented in the normal right-click menu. This is intentionally left out since it would make the menu system larger, more confusing, and less managable. In addition, you can already drag and drop files within the same folder - which doesn't take much more time than a right-click - so the functionality is there, it only requires a slight shift (or extension) of working-style. See Tip#3 below for more details.

Don't be confused by the 'new' menu-concept introduced with ShellGEM. The submenus will not open until you move the mouse pointer onto the little "submenu arrow". This helps keeping the menus small and efficient to work with since no submenus will open and clutter up the screen until you specifically ask for it by moving the mouse out to the arrow. Also, if you have selected *not* to show Files too, you will not see this submenu-arrow if the folder has no subfolders - except for drives on the network or locations where it cannot easily be determined in advance if the container has any subfolders.

Note: if your target folder contains no subfolder, what is presented in the first submenu are the drives in your "My Computer".

Tips ...

Tip#1 To make life easier for yourself you are advised to unselect the option 'Show unassociated files'. This will reduce the size of the menu considerably.

Tip#2 Use the menu-system provided by ShellGEM to create your own (specialized) 'start-menus'. Create a folder (or a shortcut to a folder) on the desktop and fill the folder up with shortcuts to your favorite programs. Create different categories and you can have a much tidier desktop.

Tip#3 A quick way to exploit the drag & drop menu is to select the file(s) in question, lift them up with the right mouse-button and drop them where you found them - in the same folder. You can then use all functions offered by ShellGEM's drag & drop menu and won't have to wade through dozens of explorer windows. This is especially true if you have your target folder in History or Favorites!

Extraction ...

The file-types that are currently recognized by ShellGEM are:

.zip .rar .r00 .r01 .arj .001 and .j

Files of type .001 are first tested to be unRAR'ed, if that fails they will be tried to be unARJ'ed.

ShellGEM can extract many files at once (except for unRAR which can handle only one archive, although split into multiple files). Just drag & drop all files and select the folder you wish to have them extracted into.

UnZIP and UnRAR are both built in, but for unARJ and unJAR to work you have to set the path of

their respective executables under extract-options.

If you select many files for extraction and you have selected the option to extract into <filename> folder, the following happens: A directory with the same name as the *last* selected file will be created (without the extension), then all files in all archives are extracted to this folder. I.e. a new folder isn't created for each and every selected file.

JAR note! When referring to a JAR archive here it has nothing to do with java archives. Jar in this program refers to the jar compression algorithm which cannot handle java archives. Although sometimes a jar archive can have the extension .jar, the detection of this file-extension is left out to avoid confusion. The most used extension for JAR archives is the one detected in ShellGEM, this extension is .j

Options ...

Selecting the "Options..." item in the menu will display a window where you can set options of your choice. This is also the only place where you can set the ARJ and JAR executables, as well as setting which optional editor to open unassociated files in.

Most options are also available on the submenu presented under "Options...". Note here that if you hold down the shift-key on the keyboard while right-clicking a folder-object, most options below will be treated as *Selected*. So it is perfectly safe to deselect the option "Show Options Item". Also you might find it convenient to deselect the options "Show Removable Drives", "Show Special Items" and "Show Unassociated Files".

General/Misc

Show Folder Icons

Deselect this option to make the menus smaller. It will also result in the menus popping up somewhat quicker.

Show Hidden Objects

Deselect this option if you do not wish to see objects that normally are hidden within the Win95 shell.

Show Removable Drives

Deselect this option if you do not wish to see the removable drives under "My Computer"

Show Special Objects

Deselect this option if you do not wish to see items like "Control Panel" and "Dial-up Networking" under "My Computer"

Show Separators in Root-menu

Leave this selected if you wish to make the ShellGEM items stand out more in the menu. It will put a separator before and after the item(s) in the root menu.

Explore folders instead of Open

Select this if you prefer to open explorer in a 'two-pane' view instead of the normal view.

Don't prefix Favorite items with foldername, and prefix History items with abbreviated foldername

Check this and your Favorite items will be shown using only the end target folder. They will be separated under their corresponding drives to locate them quickly. History items will be prefixed with an abbreviated foldername. Having this option selected will make these menus much smaller. The downside is that you might in some cases not be able to see which folder the item points to exactly. This option is shown in the menu as 'Short History and Favorites'

Visible Items

Show These Items

Deselect the items you do not wish to have readily access to. They will all be displayed if you hold down the shift-key when opening the menu.

Files appearance

Sort Files by Extension

Deselect this to sort files by name.

Show Unassociated Files

Deselect this to hide files that are not associated with any program. This will in most cases make the file-menus much smaller. It also makes sense to leave this deselected since clicking a file that is not associated with a program will lead to nothing.

Indicate Files-Only Submenus

Leave this selected if you wish to be able to see which submenus contains only files. This option might 'lie' sometimes and will not show a submenu if there are no files to display - and this is affected by the option "Show Unassociated Files".

Place Files on Un-split Menu

Deselect this to always show files (not folders) tucked away neatly under a 'files item'. Check it if you wish to show the files in the same menu as the folders (skipping one item to traverse). Files will always be put under a submenu item if it is determined that the menu would "break up" due to too many objects to display.

Show ALL files in the menu, except these:

Here you can decide which files NOT to display in the menu. Just add the extension of a certain filetype (without the dot) to the list and it will not show up in the menu. This will very effectively prune the file-menu and make it a lot more manageable. Note that the option 'Show Unassociated Files' is still in effect and unknown filetypes will not be shown if this option is selected.

Show ONLY these types in the menu:

Here you can set each individual filetype you wish to display in the menu. The state of the option 'Show Unassociated Files' is ignored and only the filetypes listed here are shown in the menu.

Drag & Drop

Copy + Open Target Folder

Leave this selected if you also wish to open the folder you Copy to using ShellGEM' drag & drop menu.

Move + Open Target Folder

Leave this selected if you also wish to open the folder you Move to using ShellGEM' drag & drop menu.

Shortcut + Open Target Folder

Leave this selected if you also wish to open the folder you create shortcuts in using ShellGEM' drag & drop menu.

Extract + Open Target Folder

Leave this selected if you also wish to open the folder you Extract to using ShellGEM' drag &

drop menu.

Show These Items

Deselect the items you do not wish to see/use in the drag & drop menu

Extract

Overwrite Existing Files

Leave this selected if you wish to overwrite already existing files when extracting a zip-file

Put All Files in Same Dir

Leave this selected if you wish to extract all files to the same directory even if they were compressed with directory-info.

Quiet

Select this if you don't want to see how many files was successfully extracted.

Extract To <filename> Folder

If this is selected, a new directory with the same name as the compressed file will first be created, then all files are extracted into this directory. Be a little careful if you use this feature in conjunction with the option 'Quiet' also selected. This might overwrite what already is in an existing directory.

In addition there are a few options only accessible from the ShellGEM Option window

Like, you can set where the external extraction executables are located.

A lot of caring little details are built in...

Like, the option window is opened in the 'context of your selection'. So, if you select the 'Favorites' item in the 'Extract to Folder' menu, this menu will be conveniently selected for you to edit immediately. Also, by using threads, the first menu is generated in the background so that it pops up faster.

Registration ...

Yes, your current version of ShellGEM is absolutely **FREE!**

To Uninstall:

Look for "HACE ShellGEM" in 'Add/Remove Programs' in the Control Panel.

Limitations ...

- When you have chosen to display "Files", because there is no quick way to determine if sub-folders contains files (and especially associated files only) you might sometimes experience that a subfolder will show nothing.
- If you have not upgraded to Internet Explorer 4.0, hidden objects (files/folders) will be painted as normal. You will not get a "ghosted" (or "weak") icon.

History ...

v1.40: _____

- The annoying problem with the freeware version of ShellGEM stopping working after about a month should now be fixed.
- The History-tab under options will now not be blank when the 'Options'-item is selected to produce the options-window.
- New functionality for win98 users. You can now drag and drop files on the desktop itself. A great functionality enhancement.
- Email and web addresses updated to point to the new homepage.
- Documentation updated.
- The 'Advertisement' has grown slightly.

- A problem with ShellGEM reporting that it contained a virus with some virus scanners should be fixed.
