

Ninotech Date Edit 4.0

Ninotech Date Edit is a shell extension for Windows 95/98/Me/NT/2000/XP that enables you to change the date and time of your files from inside the Windows Explorer. All you have to do is to open the Windows Explorer, right-click the item(s) of interest and choose *Edit Date* in the context menu.

The **Ninotech Date Edit** shell extension is very easy to use and it lets you choose the new date of your files from a fancy calendar. The only restriction on using **Ninotech Date Edit** is that it requires you to have the Microsoft Internet Explorer 3.0 or later installed on your computer because it needs the system libraries distributed by the Microsoft Internet Explorer.

Click the tab for the date you want to edit. Click either Created, Modified, or Accessed.

Sets the date and time of the item(s) to the current system date and time.

Note: When the date and time boxes contain a check box (because multiple items are being edited), only the boxes that have the check box marked are set when the **Now** button is clicked.

Tip: If you only want to set the modified date and time to the system date and time, you can hold down the Shift key when you choose *Edit Date* in the context menu of the Windows Explorer. This will set the modified date and time of the selected item(s) to the system date and time without opening the Ninotech Date Edit dialog box.

Sets the date and time of the items located in the item(s) being edited.

Displays the complete path and name of the item currently being edited.

Closes this dialog box and saves any changes you have made.

Closes this dialog box without saving any changes you have made.
