Sure, Job's brought the Mac into the spot-light, but it was Raskin who started the project, only to see Steve Jobs steal it away from him. And who knows, perhaps this was for the best? No one will ever know, but all the Mac faithful should know the truth: Jef Raskin created the Macintosh. (Even though Jef

originally wanted to call it the Apple V)
