hio-bred, Yale-educated David Pogue is the author of the #1 Mac bestseller Macs For Dummies (IDG Books, 23 printings, 15 languages); its inevitable sequel, MORE Macs For Dummies; and Macworld Mac FAQs, the book of 500 frequently asked questions (and their answers).

He writes the monthly Desktop Critic column in Macworld. His novel, Hard Drive, a Macintosh thriller (Berkley Publishing Group) has been translated into three languages and was a New York Times "notable book of the year." His Mac students include Stephen Sondheim, Carly Simon, Mike Nichols, Gay Talese, Gary Oldman, Natasha Richardson, and Mia Farrow.
