If you place a correctly formatted and named PICT graphics file in your System Folder, you can stare at it, instead, during the startup process. What you need

A Macintosh.

Open the SOFTWARE SAMPLER folder on the CD-ROM. Open the Startup Screens folder. Open one of the folders inside (Earth from Space, for example). Drag the file called StartupScreen into your System Folder. Restart your Mac.
