

A/S ships with several pre-installed character remapping sets. Remapping sets can be removed, created, edited, and imported from other copies of A/S using the Edit Add/Strip application.

New remapping sets are added to the bottom of the Mapping menu when A/S is launched, with the first ten sets receiving command key equivalents from 0 to 9. Sets that remap characters immediately after a line is read from disk are italicized.

A check mark is placed to the left of the current remapping set. Choose Mac Character Set from the Mapping menu to turn off character remapping. The currently selected remapping set's name is stored in settings files.

Here is a brief description of each of the character remapping sets that ship with A/S:

Mac Character Set - No character remapping. Cannot be edited or removed.

DOS -> Mac Character Set - Converts DOS-based machine (PC) characters to the closest equivalent Macintosh characters.

Mac -> DOS Character Set - Converts Macintosh characters to the closest equivalent characters on a DOS-based machine (PC).

Mac -> BBS Character Set - Removes control characters and remaps extended ASCII characters to the closest ASCII character match or removes them if there is no reasonable match.

UNIX -> Mac Character Set - Converts LFs to CRs.

Mac -> UNIX Character Set - Converts CRs to LFs.

ISO Latin-1 -> Mac Characters - Converts characters defined by the ISO Standard ISO8859-1 Latin-1 character codes to the closest equivalent Macintosh characters.

Mac -> ISO Latin-1 Characters - Converts Macintosh characters to the closest equivalent characters defined by the ISO Standard ISO8859-1 Latin-1 character codes.
