

Select to have WSH close scripts after they run for the specified number of seconds.  
You can use this option to prevent scripts from running too long, or indefinitely.

Specifies how many seconds to allow scripts to run.

If the **Stop scripts after specified number of seconds** check box is not selected, this text box is unavailable and appears dimmed.

Select to have WSH display WSH version information each time you run a script.

Select to reset Windows Scripting Host settings to their defaults.

Select to have WSH close the selected script after it runs for the specified number of seconds.  
You can use this option to prevent the script from running too long, or indefinitely.
